SB 2283 requires the Department to increase basic care rates by six percent for rate year July 1, 2023 followed by a four percent increase for rate year July 1, 2024. Additionally, the basic care rates are increased ten dollar per day for rate years July 1, 2023, and July 1, 2024.

Section 1 of SB 2283 equires the Department to increase basic care rates by six percent for rate year July 1, 2023 followed by a four percent increase for rate year July 1, 2024. Additionally, the basic care rates are increased ten dollar per day for rate years July 1, 2023, and July 1, 2024. The Department would rebase the Basic Care rates for rate year July 1, 2023. It is estimated that rebasing would cost \$2,000,000 for Personal Care and \$1,000,000 for

Room and Board.

For Personal Care, the six percent inflationary increase plus the ten dollar rate increase to the rate would cost \$3,935,678 for year one. The four percent increase plus the ten dollar per day increase would cost \$9,128,818 for year two. For Room and Board, the six percent inflationary increase plus the ten dollar rate increase to the rate would cost \$3,492,889 for year one. The four percent increase plus the ten dollar per day increase would cost \$7,545,184 for year two.

Included in Section 2 of SB2283 is \$600,000 to perform a study of the basic care payment system.

The total impact for the 2023-2025 biennium in Medical Grants Assistance would be \$27,702,569.
