

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4055

(Approved by the Delayed Bills Committee)

1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to provide for this state's concealed weapons permit to
2 create an exemption from the national instant criminal background check system.

3 **WHEREAS**, 18 United States Code Section 922(t)(3) provides for an exemption from
4 the national instant criminal background check system for the purchase of firearms by
5 individuals with a concealed weapons permit; and

6 **WHEREAS**, this state has a concealed weapons permit that has been interpreted to not
7 provide an exemption; and

8 **WHEREAS**, this state permanently prohibits a person confined or committed to a
9 hospital or other institution and a mentally deficient person from receiving a permit, prohibits a
10 person under 18 years of age from receiving a permit, prohibits a person who has committed a
11 felony involving violence or intimidation from receiving a permit for 10 years, and prohibits any
12 person who has committed a felony not involving violence or intimidation or a class A
13 misdemeanor involving violence or intimidation from receiving a permit for five years;

14 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE**
15 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

16 That the Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to
17 provide for this state's concealed weapons permit to create an exemption from the national
18 instant criminal background check system; and

19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
20 resolution to the director of the Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and to each
21 member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
