NOTE: This proposed rules amendment is in response to a suggestion that motions to limit debate or to move the previous question should be decided by majority, rather than two-thirds, vote. Under subsection 3, the previous question currently requires a two-thirds vote of the members present. This rule, however, is confusing. Subsection 1(j) provides for a majority vote of the members present is the vote required for any question "for which another vote is not required by ... **another** rule." Subsection 3 of the **same** rule provides for a two-thirds vote of the members present for the previous question. Senate and House Rules 314 do not refer to a vote requirement, as do other rules.

The rules are silent on the vote required to approve a motion to close, limit, or extend debate, and thus subsection 1(j) applies and the vote requirement is a majority of the members present. Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure treats these motions similarly. Section 350 provides the previous question requires a majority vote, and Section 358 provides a motion to close, limit, or extend debate requires a majority vote.
