- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 11 of chapter 31 of the 1999 Session Laws,
- 2 relating to the membership and the responsibilities of the crop harmonization committee; and to
- 3 provide an appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 11 of chapter 31 of the 1999 Session Laws is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL - CROP HARMONIZATION COMMITTEE 8 <u>GRANTS</u>.

9	<u>1.</u>	The legislative council shall create a crop harmonization committee consisting of
10		the chairman of the house agriculture committee, the chairman of the senate
11		agriculture committee, the governor or the governor's designee, and three other
12		individuals appointed by the legislative council chairman, one of whom must
13		represent the crop protection manufacturing industry. In consultation with the
14		pesticide control board, the committee shall:

- 15 <u>1. a.</u> Identify and prioritize crop protection product labeling needs;
- 16 2. b. Explore the extent of authority given to this state under the federal Insecticide,
 17 Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act;
- 18 3. <u>c.</u> Identify the data necessary to enable registration of a use to occur in a timely
 19 manner;
- 4. <u>d.</u> Determine what research, if any, is necessary to fulfill data requirements for
 activities listed in this section and communicate its findings to the agriculture
 commissioner;
- 235.e.Request the agriculture commissioner to pursue specific research funding24options from public and private sources; and

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1	6.	f. Report to the legislative council in the same manner as do other interim
2		legislative council committees.
3	2.	The crop harmonization committee may study and, with the approval of the
4	_	chairman of the legislative council, may take any action necessary to address
5		international trade issues affecting agriculture in this state.
6	<u>3.</u>	The crop harmonization committee, with the approval of the chairman of the
7		legislative council, may contract with a consultant to conduct studies or provide
8		research or information regarding crop protection product registration and labeling
9		needs and international trade issues.
10	<u>4.</u>	The crop harmonization committee shall administer a grant program through which
11		agriculture commodity groups based in this state may apply for funds to be used
12		by the groups to address issues related to the registration of crop protection
13		products. To be eligible for receipt of a grant, an applicant must submit an
14		application to the committee which requests a specific amount of funds, specifies
15		the exact purposes for which the grant would be used, and provides a detailed
16		timetable for the use of the grant funds. The committee may impose any additional
17		conditions it deems appropriate for grant recipients, including requiring periodic
18		reports and furnishing of matching funds. The committee may terminate funding of
19		a previously approved grant at any time if the committee is dissatisfied with the
20		performance of the grant recipient.
21	SEC	CTION 2. APPROPRIATION - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. There is appropriated out
22	of any mon	eys in the minor use pesticide fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated,
23	the sum of	\$300,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from special funds
24	derived fror	n grants or donation income, the sum of \$200,000, or so much of the sum as may
25	be necessa	ry, to the Legislative Council for the purposes of addressing crop protection product
26	registration	and labeling needs and providing grants as provided in section 1 of this Act, for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.
