1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture

2 commissioner; to provide project safe send user fees; and to amend and reenact sections

3 4-01-21, 19-18-02.1, and 19-18-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of

4 the agriculture commissioner, uses of the environment and rangeland protection fund, and

5 pesticide registration fees.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in
the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal
funds and other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the
expenses of the commissioner of agriculture, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and
ending June 30, 2003, as follows:

5 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 6 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. The annual salary of the agriculture 8 commissioner is fifty-eight sixty-six thousand two five hundred sixty-two nine dollars through 9 June 30, 2000 December 31, 2001, fifty-nine sixty-eight thousand four five hundred 10 twenty-eight four dollars through December 31, 2000 June 30, 2002, and sixty-four sixty-nine

11 thousand five eight hundred sixty-nine seventy-four dollars thereafter.

12 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 19-18-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 19-18-02.1. Environment and rangeland protection fund. The environment and 15 rangeland protection fund is a special fund in the state treasury. The moneys in this fund may 16 be used for rangeland improvement projects and to address issues relating to harmonization of 17 crop protection product standards. These The rangeland improvement projects may include 18 noxious weed control; ground water testing, analysis, protection, and improvement; analysis of 19 food products for residues of pesticides and other materials; and analysis and disposal of unusable pesticides and pesticide containers. 20

21 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 19-18-04 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 22 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23 19-18-04. (Effective through June 30, 2001) Registration - Fees.

- 24 1. Any person before selling or offering for sale any pesticide for use within this state 25 shall file biennially with the commissioner an application for registration of the 26 pesticide. The application must:
- 27 a. Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.
- 28 Give the name and brand of each product registered. b.
- 29 Be accompanied by a current label of each product so registered. c.
- 30 d. Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred fifty dollars for each 31 product registered. At the close of each calendar month, the commissioner

1		shall transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the registrations.
2		The state treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered product to the
3		general fund in the state treasury and the remainder of the registration fee for
4		each registered product to the environment and rangeland protection fund.
5		e. Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet.
6	2.	The commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy,
7		toxicity, residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will
8		perform its intended function without unreasonable adverse effects on the
9		environment. If the commissioner finds that the application conforms to law, the
10		commissioner shall issue to the applicant a certificate of registration of the product.
11		If after public hearing before the commissioner the application is denied, the
12		product may not be offered for sale.
13	3.	Each registration covers a two-year period beginning January first and expiring
14		December thirty-first of the following year. A certificate of registration may not be
15		issued for a term longer than two years, and is not transferable from one person to
16		another, or from the ownership to whom issued to another ownership, or from one
17		place to another place or location. A penalty of fifty percent of the license or
18		registration fee must be imposed if the license or certificate of registration is not
19		applied for on or before January thirty first following the expiration date, or within
20		the same month the pesticides are first manufactured or sold within this state.
21		Each product must go through a two-year discontinuance period in order to clear
22		all outstanding products in the channel of trade.
23	4.	This section does not apply to a pesticide sold by a retail dealer if the registration
24		fee has been paid by the manufacturer, jobber, or any other person, as required by
25		this section.
26	(Eff	ective July 1, 2001) Registration - Fees. Any person before selling or offering for
27	7 sale any pesticide for use within this state shall file biennially with the commissioner an	
28	application for registration of the pesticide. The application must:	
29	1.	Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.
30	2.	Give the name and brand of each product registered.
31	3.	Be accompanied by a current label of each product so registered.

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4. Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred <u>fifty</u> dollars for each
 product registered. At the close of each calendar month, the commissioner shall
 transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the registrations. The state
 treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered product to the general fund in
 the state treasury and the remainder of the registration fee for each registered
 product to the environment and rangeland protection fund.

5. Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet.

8 The commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy, toxicity, 9 residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will perform its intended 10 function without unreasonable adverse effects on the environment. If the commissioner finds 11 that the application conforms to law, the commissioner shall issue to the applicant a certificate 12 of registration of the product. If after public hearing before the commissioner the application is 13 denied, the product may not be offered for sale.

14 Each registration covers a two-year period beginning January first and expiring December thirty-first of the following year. A certificate of registration may not be issued for a 15 16 term longer than two years, and is not transferable from one person to another, or from the 17 ownership to whom issued to another ownership, or from one place to another place or 18 location. A penalty of fifty percent of the license or registration fee must be imposed if the 19 license or certificate of registration is not applied for on or before January thirty-first following 20 the expiration date, or within the same month the pesticides are first manufactured or sold 21 within this state. Each product must go through a two-year discontinuance period in order to 22 clear all outstanding products in the channel of trade.

This section does not apply to a pesticide sold by a retail dealer if the registration fee has been paid by the manufacturer, jobber, or any other person, as required by this section.

SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND

PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$2,341,815, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the environment and rangeland protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various agriculture department programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

- 30 SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE
- 31 **INSPECTION FUND.** The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum

of \$139,775, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the anhydrous ammonia
 storage inspection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of regulating anyhdrous
 ammonia storage facilities, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.
 SECTION 7. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income
 line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$668,000, or so much of the sum as may
 be necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying

7 the expenses of various agriculture department programs for the biennium beginning July 1,

8 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

SECTION 8. SAFE SEND PESTICIDE AND PESTICIDE CONTAINER COLLECTION

- USER FEES. The agriculture commissioner, in consultation with the advisory board for the 10 11 safe send pesticide and pesticide container disposal program, shall charge a fee for collection 12 of select chemicals during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 13 The fees must be established at a level that will generate an estimated \$100,000 for the 14 biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. Collections from this fee must be 15 deposited in the environment and rangeland protection fund. 16 SECTION 9. SAFE SEND PESTICIDE AND PESTICIDE CONTAINER COLLECTION 17 - **RECYCLING.** The agriculture commissioner, in consultation with the advisory board for the 18 safe send pesticide and pesticide container disposal program, shall research the potential of

19 recycling select products collected during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending

20 June 30, 2003.

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
