1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota

2 university system; to provide an appropriation to the department of commerce; to provide for

3 legislative council studies; to provide statements of legislative intent; to amend and reenact

4 sections 15-10-08, 15-10-12, 52-08-08, 52-08-09, 52-08-10, 52-08-11, 54-44.1-04,

5 subsection 7 of section 54-44.1-06, and section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code,

6 relating to compensation for members of the board of higher education, higher education

7 institutions' special revenue funds, workforce training, budget requests and block grant

8 appropriations, and unexpended appropriations; to repeal section 22 of chapter 37 of the 1999

9 Session Laws relating to the university of North Dakota winter sports facility maintenance fund;

10 to provide an expiration date; and to declare an emergency.

# 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from other income, to the North Dakota university system and to the various institutions of higher learning under the supervision of the board of higher education for the purpose of defraying their expenses, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, as follows:

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION TRANSFER. The higher education contingency and capital improvements emergency fund, board initiatives, and disabled student services in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act must be used for the benefit of the institutions and entities in section 1 of this Act as determined by the board of higher education. The university system office shall notify the office of management and budget of the allocation to the various entities and institutions and which line items in the various institutions and entities must be adjusted.

SECTION 3. FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS - APPROPRIATION. All
funds, in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, received by the entities under
the control of the state board of higher education pursuant to federal acts, private grants, and
other sources are appropriated.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$194,788, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the college technical education council, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the university of North Dakota for the purpose of defraying flood-related expenses, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2001, as follows:

SECTION 6. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The state board of higher education may
 approve transfer of funds between line items for each entity included in section 1 of this Act and
 shall notify the office of management and budget of each transfer; however, funds may not be
 transferred out of the capital assets appropriations.

5 SECTION 7. EXEMPTION. The appropriations contained in section 1 of chapter 3 of 6 the 1999 Session Laws are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Capital 7 improvement appropriations contained in section 1 of chapter 3 of the 1999 Session Laws may 8 be expended as directed by the university system for capital repairs and improvements.

9 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS. The state board
10 of higher education may adjust full-time equivalent positions as needed, subject to the
11 availability of funds, for institutions and entities in subdivisions 3 through 15 of section 1 of this
12 Act. The university system shall report any adjustments to the office of management and
13 budget before the submission of the 2003-05 biennium budget request.

SECTION 9. STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS. Not less than twenty
percent of the funds appropriated for student financial assistance grants in section 1 of this Act
must be allocated to students at private institutions with the remaining funds allocated to
students at public and Native American institutions.

SECTION 10. EDUCATION INCENTIVE PROGRAMS. Of the funds appropriated for education incentives in section 1 of this Act, \$60,000 is to provide incentives to encourage additional doctoral graduates in North Dakota, \$370,000 is provided for teacher retraining scholarships and a teacher student loan forgiveness program, \$400,000 is provided for a technology occupations student loan program authorized in House Bill No. 1283, and \$135,000 is provided for a dentists' loan repayment program authorized in Senate Bill No. 2276.

SECTION 11. TECHNOLOGY POOL. The technology pool amount in subdivision 2 of section 1 must be used for the benefit of the institutions and entities in section 1 as determined by the state board of higher education. Technology funding allocations must be made based on historic funding, the North Dakota university system information technology plan, the statewide network plan, base funding for higher education computer network computer center operations, and base funding for interactive video network and on-line dakota information network operations.

SECTION 12. EQUITY AND SPECIAL NEEDS POOL. The equity and special needs pool in subdivision 2 of section 1 must be used for the benefit of the institutions and entities in subdivisions 3 through 15 of section 1 as determined by the state board of higher education. When making allocations from the equity and special needs pool, the state board of higher education shall allocate the funds to address equity and parity funding needs and to support new initiatives or program costs consistent with board and statewide needs.

## SECTION 13. STATE FORESTER RESERVE ACCOUNT APPROPRIATION -

8 BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL. The estimated income in subdivision 13 of section 1 of this
9 Act includes the sum of \$120,000 from the state forester reserve account, established in
10 section 4-19-01.2, for the construction of the Towner nursery tree storage building.

After receiving approval from the budget section, the forest service may obtain and utilize any available funds, in addition to the \$120,000 from the reserve account, received from federal, public, private, or other sources, which are appropriated to the state forest service to assist in the construction of the Towner nursery tree storage building.

SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT PLAN. It is

the intent of the legislative assembly that the state board of higher education establish a
long-term enrollment management plan and procedures for implementation of the plan. The
board shall report to the legislative council during the 2001-02 interim on the board's progress
toward establishing a long-term enrollment management plan and related implementation
procedures and provide the final report to the fifty-eighth legislative assembly.

SECTION 15. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - ALTERNATIVE HEATING SOURCES. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that institutions under the control of the state board of higher education explore the possible use of alternative heating sources, including the use of North Dakota coal.

SECTION 16. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION
 - CHANCELLOR. The legislative council shall consider studying during the 2001-02 interim the
 role of the state board of higher education and the chancellor in the North Dakota university
 system, including the communications between individual campuses, the board, and the
 chancellor. The legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with
 any legislation recommended, to the fifty-eighth legislative assembly.

## 1 SECTION 19. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE COLLEGE OF SCIENCE - BLIKRE

ACTIVITIES CENTER RENOVATION. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the funding of \$368,920 included in the estimated income in subdivision 8 of section 1 of this Act for an addition to the Blikre activities center at the state college of science must be collected before construction of an addition may begin. The state college of science, after receiving approval from the budget section, may obtain and utilize any available funds, in addition to the \$368,920, received from federal, public, private, or other sources which are appropriated to the state college of science to assist in the Blikre activities center addition.

#### SECTION 20. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BISMARCK STATE COLLEGE - SCHAFER

HALL RENOVATION. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that funding of \$596,000
included in the capital assets line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act for renovation of
Schafer hall be used only for renovation of classroom or student-related areas. No funds from
any source may be used for renovation of administrative offices in Schafer hall.

SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 16 15-10-08. Compensation of board members - Expenses - Legislative

17 appropriations. Each member of the state board of higher education, except the student 18 member, is entitled to receive as compensation two hundred fifty dollars per month, sixty-two 19 dollars and fifty cents per day for each calendar day actually spent devoted to the duties of 20 office, and necessary expenses in the same manner and amounts as other state officials for 21 attending meetings and performing other functions of office. The faculty adviser is entitled to 22 receive as compensation two hundred fifty dollars per month and necessary expenses in the 23 same manner and amounts as other state officials for attending meetings and performing other 24 functions of office. The legislative assembly shall provide adequate funds to carry out the 25 functions and duties of the board.

SECTION 22. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-12 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-10-12. Board may accept gifts and bequests - Deposit and appropriation of
 institutional funds. The Subject to the limitations of section 15-10-12.1, the state board of
 higher education may, subject to the limitations of section 15-10-12.1, receive donations, gifts,
 grants, and bequests offered or tendered to or for the benefit of any institution of higher

1 education under its control or subject to its administration, and all moneys coming into the 2 hands of the board as donations, gifts, grants, and bequests must be used for the specific 3 purpose for which they are donated or given. A special revenue fund, for each institution of 4 higher education under the control of the board or subject to its administration, must be 5 maintained within the state treasury and all institutional income from tuition collections must be 6 placed in the special fund for the use of the institution for which the money was raised. All rent, 7 interest, or income from land, money, or property, donated or granted by the United States and 8 allocated to specific institutions of higher learning under the terms of the Enabling Act and the 9 Constitution of North Dakota must be deposited in the special revenue fund of each institution 10 and expended in accordance with section 1 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota. 11 Moneys in the special revenue fund are subject to legislative appropriations. All other funds, 12 unless restricted by the terms of a grant, donation, or bequest, received by the institutions from 13 federal, state, and local grants and contracts, indirect cost recoveries, tuition, special student 14 fees, room and board fees and other auxiliary enterprise fees, student activity fees, continuing 15 education program fees, internal service fund revenues, and all other revenues must be 16 deposited in the institution special revenue funds. The state treasurer shall immediately 17 transfer the funds deposited in the special revenue funds to institution accounts in the Bank of 18 North Dakota. Biennial estimates of revenue and expenditures of the other funds by source of 19 funds must be presented at the same time biennial budget requests for appropriations from the 20 special revenue fund and state general fund are prepared and submitted to the office of the 21 budget pursuant to section 15-10-15. Payments from each institution's general fund 22 appropriation must be made in amounts as may be necessary for the operation and 23 maintenance of each institution, except that at the close of the biennium the balance of funds 24 not paid from the general fund appropriation must be deposited in the special revenue funds of 25 the institutions. The funds in the institution accounts are appropriated on a continuing basis to 26 the state board of higher education. All such appropriations are subject to proration in the 27 same manner as other appropriations are prorated if insufficient funds are available to meet 28 expenditures from the general fund. Sinking funds for the payment of interest and principal of 29 institutional revenue bonds must be deposited pursuant to section 15-55-06. 30 SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Section 52-08-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

31 amended and reenacted as follows:

52-08-08. Institution to serve work force needs. Subject to state board of higher
education department of commerce policies, the president of an institution of higher education
that is assigned primary responsibility for work force training shall establish a division or other
unit within the institution to serve the work force needs of business and industry and to serve as
a broker in arranging the delivery of training.

6 SECTION 24. AMENDMENT. Section 52-08-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 52-08-09. Work force training board - Formation. Subject to state board of higher 9 education department of commerce policies, the president of an institution of higher education 10 that is assigned primary responsibility for work force training shall appoint a work force training 11 board consisting of representatives from businesses, labor, and industries located within the 12 institution's delivery area. The work force training board must consist of at least seven but no 13 more than fifteen members and must include at least one representative from either an 14 Indian-owned business, the tribal government, or the tribal colleges within the designated 15 region.

SECTION 25. AMENDMENT. Section 52-08-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 52-08-10. Preparation of business plan - Revolving loans. Subject to state board of 19 higher education department of commerce policies, the president of an institution of higher 20 education that is assigned primary responsibility for work force training shall prepare an annual 21 business plan that must include provisions for use of the training capacity of the tribal colleges 22 within the designated region, in consultation with the work force training board. The work force 23 training board shall approve the business plan and make recommendations for funding of the 24 business plan to the state board of higher education department of commerce. The state 25 board of higher education department of commerce may establish for each institution of higher 26 education assigned primary responsibility for work force training a revolving loan fund for work 27 force training program startups using the borrowing authority provided in section 15-10-16.1.

SECTION 26. AMENDMENT. Section 52-08-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

30 52-08-11. Performance measurements for work force training. Subject to state
 31 board of higher education department of commerce policies, the president of an institution of

higher education that is assigned primary responsibility for work force training shall develop, in
consultation with the work force training board, performance measurements for work force
training. The measurements must include requirements for being time sensitive and results
oriented and must determine how well the training needs of business and industry are being
met.

6 SECTION 27. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 54-44.1-04. Budget estimates of budget units filed with the office of the budget -9 Deadline. The head of each budget unit, not later than July fifteenth of each year next 10 preceding the session of the legislative assembly, shall submit to the office of the budget, 11 estimates of financial requirements of his budget unit for the next two fiscal years, on the forms 12 and in the manner prescribed by the office of the budget, with such explanatory data as is 13 required by the office of the budget and such additional data as the head of the budget unit 14 wishes to submit. The budget estimates for the North Dakota university system must include 15 block grants for the university system for a base funding component and for an initiative funding 16 component for specific strategies or initiatives and a budget estimate for an asset funding 17 component for renewal and replacement of physical plant assets at the institutions of higher 18 education. The estimates so submitted must bear the approval of the board or commission of 19 each budget unit for which a board or commission is constituted. The director of the budget in 20 his the director's discretion may extend the filing date for any budget unit if he the director finds 21 there is some circumstance which makes it advantageous to authorize the extension. If a 22 budget unit has not submitted its estimate of financial requirements by the required date or 23 within a period of extension set by the director of the budget, the director of the budget shall 24 prepare such budget unit's estimate of financial requirements except such estimate may not 25 exceed ninety percent of such budget unit's previous biennial appropriation. The director of the 26 budget or such subordinate officer as he shall designate the director designates shall examine 27 the estimates and shall afford to the heads of budget units reasonable opportunity for 28 explanation in regard thereto and, when requested, shall grant to the heads of budget units a 29 hearing thereon which must be open to the public.

30 SECTION 28. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 54-44.1-06 of the 1999
 31 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1 7. Drafts of a proposed general appropriations act and special appropriations acts 2 embodying the budget data and recommendations of the governor for 3 appropriations for the next biennium, and drafts of such revenues and other acts 4 recommended by the governor for putting into effect the proposed financial plan. 5 The recommended general appropriation for each budget unit must be specified in 6 a separate section of the general appropriations act. The draft of the proposed 7 appropriations act for the North Dakota university system must include block 8 grants for a base funding appropriation and for an initiative funding appropriation 9 for specific strategies or initiatives, and an appropriation for asset funding for 10 renewal and replacement of physical plant assets at the institutions of higher 11 education in the format approved by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly. 12 **SECTION 29. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 54-44.1-11. Office of management and budget to cancel unexpended appropriations - When they may continue. The Except as otherwise provided by law, the 15 16 office of management and budget, thirty days after the close of each biennial period, shall 17 cancel all unexpended appropriations or balances of appropriations after the expiration of the 18 biennial period during which they became available under the law. Unexpended appropriations 19 for the North Dakota university system are not subject to this section and the North Dakota 20 university system shall report on the amounts and uses of funds carried over from one 21 biennium to the next to subsequent appropriations committees of the legislative assembly. The 22 chairman of the appropriations committees of the senate and house of representatives of the 23 legislative assembly with the office of the budget may continue appropriations or balances in 24 force for not more than two years after the expiration of the biennial period during which they 25 became available upon recommendation of the director of the budget for: 26 1. New construction projects. 27 2. Major repair or improvement projects. 28 3. Purchases of new equipment costing more than ten thousand dollars per unit if it 29 was ordered during the first twelve months of the biennium in which the funds were 30 appropriated.

- The purchase of land by the state on a "contract for deed" purchase where the
   total purchase price is within the authorized appropriation.
- 3 SECTION 30. REPEAL. Section 22 of chapter 37 of the 1999 Session Laws is
  4 repealed.
- 5 **SECTION 31. EXPIRATION DATE.** Sections 22, 27, 28, and 29 of this Act are 6 effective through June 30, 2003, and after that date are ineffective.
- 7 SECTION 32. EMERGENCY. The capital assets line items contained in sections 1 and
- 8 5 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure, and those funds are available
- 9 immediately upon the filing of this Act with the secretary of state.
