## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1007

Introduced by

**Appropriations Committee** 

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the veterans' home
- 2 and department of veterans' affairs; to provide for a performance audit of the department of
- 3 veterans' affairs and the administrative committee on veterans' affairs; to provide for additional
- 4 skilled nursing care bed capacity; to allow for line item transfers; to provide for a legislative
- 5 council study; to provide reports to the budget section; and to declare an emergency.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds pro	ovided in this section, or so much of the	
8	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
9	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
10	other income, to the veterans' home and the department of veterans' affairs for the purpose of		
11	defraying their expenses, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005,		
12	as follows:

5	SECTION 2. VETERANS' POSTWAR TRUST FUND - REPORT.	The department of	
6	veterans' affairs shall report on the use of moneys in the veterans' postwar trust fund to the		
7	appropriations committees of the fifty-ninth legislative assembly. The report must be presented		
8	during the agency's budget presentation.		
9	SECTION 3. PERFORMANCE AUDIT - DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS		
10	AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE ON VETERANS' AFFAIRS. The state auditor shall		
11	conduct a performance audit of the department of veterans' affairs and the administrative		
12	committee on veterans' affairs during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending		
13	June 30, 2005. The results of the performance audit must be presented to the legislative audit		
14	and fiscal review committee by July 1, 2004, and filed with the appropriations committees		
15	during the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.		
16	SECTION 4. VETERANS' HOME GOVERNING BOARD - STATUS REPORTS -		
17	STRATEGIC PLAN - BUDGET SECTION. A representative of the veterans' home governing		
18	board shall periodically report to the budget section on the status of the board's progress in		
19	developing and implementing a strategic plan for the veterans' home during the 2003-04		
20	interim.		
21	SECTION 5. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS - AUTHORIZATION. The		
22	governing board of the veterans' home may employ two new full-time equivalent employee		
23	positions for the veterans' home before June 30, 2003, as needed, subject to the availability of		
24	funds.		
25	SECTION 6. 2001-03 BIENNIUM LINE ITEM TRANSFERS - AUTHORIZATION.		
26	Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the veterans' home may transfer up to \$150,000 of		
27	appropriation authority between line items for the 2001-03 biennium to implement changes in		
28	echnology and telecommunications, with the approval of the office of management and budget.		
29	Any line item transfers must be reported to the budget section.		
30	SECTION 7. SKILLED NURSING CARE BED PURCHASE - TRANSFER.		
31	Notwithstanding the provisions of section 23 of chapter 431 of the 2001 Se	ession Laws which	

- 1 require a reduction in licensed nursing facility bed capacity, the department of human services
- 2 shall purchase eight skilled nursing care beds after April 14, 2003, from funding available in
- 3 section 23 of chapter 431 of the 2001 Session Laws and transfer the purchased beds to the
- 4 veterans' home in Lisbon.
- 5 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY NURSING HOME RATE CLASS
- 6 **LIMITS.** The legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2003-04 interim, the
- 7 feasibility and desirability of establishing a separate payment rate class for the veterans' home
- 8 and the related effect on the state's general fund and the long-term care industry in North
- 9 Dakota. The study, if conducted, may be done in conjunction with the long-term care
- 10 continuum study included in 2003 Senate Bill No. 2012. The legislative council shall report its
- 11 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the
- 12 recommendations, to the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.
- 13 **SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
- 14 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$96,924, or so much
- of the sum as may be necessary, and \$205,586 of federal funds to the department of human
- 16 services for the purpose of medicaid reimbursement to the veterans' home relating to the
- 17 addition of nursing home beds, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30,
- 18 2005.
- 19 **SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.** Sections 5, 6, and 7 of this Act are declared to be an
- 20 emergency measure.
