## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1022

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information
- 2 technology department, the state auditor, and the legislative council; to authorize the industrial
- 3 commission to issue and sell evidences of indebtedness for ConnectND; to provide for a
- 4 general fund transfer; to provide legislative intent; to create and enact a new section to chapter
- 5 54-10 and a new subsection to section 54-59-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 6 information technology responsibilities of the state auditor and information technology
- 7 department wide area network service; to amend and reenact section 54-59-02 of the North
- 8 Dakota Century Code, relating to responsibilities of the information technology department; to
- 9 repeal section 54-59-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to information technology
- 10 reviews; and to declare an emergency.

## 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

12	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
13	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
14	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from other income, to the
15	information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the information
16	technology department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, as

8	SECTION 2. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION	N - PURPOSES. The industrial
9	commission, acting as the North Dakota building authority	, shall arrange for the funding in an
10	amount not to exceed \$16,400,000 for the enterprise resource planning system commonly	
11	known as the ConnectND project, which is declared to be	in the public interest, through the
12	issuance of evidences of indebtedness under chapter 54-	17.2 from the effective date of this Act
13	and ending June 30, 2003. The amount of the evidences	of indebtedness may be reduced by
14	any moneys made available from the higher education ins	titutions. The proceeds of the
15	evidences of indebtedness and other available funds, as a	appropriated in section 1 of this Act,
16	for ConnectND project costs include refunding of interim borrowings. The industrial	
17	commission shall issue evidences of indebtedness under this section with the condition that	
18	repayment on the evidences of indebtedness need not begin until July 1, 2005.	
19	The authority of the industrial commission to issue evidences of indebtedness under	
20	this section ends July 30, 2005, but the industrial commission may continue to exercise all	
21	other powers granted to it under chapter 54-17.2 and this	Act and comply with any covenants
22	entered into before that date.	
23	The limitation provided in section 54-17.2-23 does	not apply to repayments allocable to
24	the evidences of indebtedness issued for the ConnectND	project.
25	SECTION 3. EVIDENCES OF INDEBTEDNESS	SSUANCE REPAYMENT
26	RESPONSIBILITY. Debt service on the evidences of independences of independence	ebtedness issued under section 2 of
27	this Act must be available from funds made available by the	ne higher education institutions.
28	SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriately appropria	oriated out of any moneys in the
29	general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropria	ated, the sum of \$197,000, or so much
30	of the sum as may be necessary, to the state auditor for the	ne purpose of defraying costs

- associated with employing two information technology auditors, for the biennium beginning
   July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
  general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$98,000, or so much
  of the sum as may be necessary, to the legislative council for the purpose of employing an
  information technology analyst and contracting for information technology analysis services, for
  the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
  - SECTION 6. GENERAL FUND TRANSFER. The industrial commission shall transfer to the general fund the sum of \$3,000,000 from the North Dakota student loan trust. The moneys must be transferred as requested by the director of the office of management and budget during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, and upon certification by the student loan trust trustee that sufficient moneys remain available to pay all debt service on student loan trust bonds, all required rebate payments to the United States treasury, and all program operating expenses.

SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COSTS - REDUCTIONS TO GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. It is the intent of the fifty-eighth legislative assembly that the 2003-05 biennium general fund appropriations for information technology expenditures included in agency and institution appropriation bills are to be reduced by a total of \$12,760,136, representing savings to be realized from information technology efficiencies and the elimination of duplicative programs, including personnel savings and savings relating to the purchase of software, information technology equipment, and contractual services for information technology development projects. The specific amounts will be reduced from each agency or institution appropriation prior to the conclusion of the fifty-eighth legislative assembly.

**SECTION 8.** A new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## <u>Information technology responsibilities.</u> The state auditor shall:

 Conduct information technology compliance reviews by conducting individual agency audits of information technology management, information technology planning, compliance with information technology plans, and compliance with

1		information technology standards and policies and conducting statewide agency	
2		audits of compliance with specific information technology standards and policies.	
3	<u>2.</u>	Consult with the information technology department on audits of compliance with	
4		information technology plans and compliance with information technology	
5		standards and policies.	
6	<u>3.</u>	Participate in the information technology department's enterprise architecture	
7		process for developing information technology standards and policies.	
8	<u>4.</u>	Monitor major information technology projects for compliance with project	
9		management and information technology standards and policies.	
10	<u>5.</u>	Present results of information technology compliance reviews to the information	
11		technology committee and the information technology department's enterprise	
12		architecture committee.	
13	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
14	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
15	54-59-02. Information technology department - Responsibility - Public policy.		
16	The information technology department is established with the responsibility for all wide area		
17	network services planning, selection, and implementation for all state agencies, including		
18	institutions under the control of the board of higher education, counties, cities, and school		
19	districts in this state. With respect to a county, city, or school district, wide area network		
20	services are those services necessary to transmit voice, data, or video outside the county, city,		
21	or school district. In exercising its powers and duties, the department is responsible for		
22	computer support services, host software development, statewide communications services,		
23	standards for providing information to other state agencies and the public through the internet,		
24	technology	planning, process redesign, and quality assurance. The department may not	
25	exercise its powers and duties in a manner that competes or otherwise interferes with the		
26	provision of	provision of telecommunications services to private, charitable, or nonprofit entities by privately	
27	or cooperat	ively owned telecommunications companies.	
28	SEC	CTION 10. A new subsection to section 54-59-05 of the North Dakota Century Code	
29	is created a	nd enacted as follows:	
30		May provide wide area network services to a state agency, city, county, school	
31		district or other political subdivision of this state. The information technology	

1	department may not provide wide area network services to any private, charitable,
2	or nonprofit entity.
3	SECTION 11. REPEAL. Section 54-59-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	repealed.
5	SECTION 12. EMERGENCY. The enterprise resource planning system line item in
6	section 1 of this Act and all of sections 2 and 3 of this Act are declared to be an emergency
7	measure.
