1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information

- 2 technology department; to authorize the industrial commission to issue and sell evidences of
- 3 indebtedness for ConnectND; to provide an exemption; to provide for a legislative council

4 study; to create and enact a new subsection to section 54-59-05 of the North Dakota Century

5 Code, relating to information technology department wide area network service; to amend and

6 reenact section 54-59-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to responsibilities of the

7 information technology department; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 10 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 11 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from other income, to the 12 information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the information 13 technology department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, as 14 follows:

SECTION 2. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - PURPOSES -

6 **APPROPRIATION.** The industrial commission, acting as the North Dakota building authority, 7 shall arrange through the issuance of evidences of indebtedness under chapter 54-17.2 from 8 the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2005, for the funding in an amount not to 9 exceed \$20,000,000 to be loaned to the information technology department for the purchase or 10 lease of computer hardware and software and for the costs of the implementation services for 11 the enterprise resource planning system commonly known as the ConnectND project. 12 ConnectND is declared to be in the public interest and is for the purpose of this Act, a project 13 as that term is defined in chapter 54-17.2. The amount of the evidences of indebtedness may 14 be reduced by any moneys made available from the higher education institutions. The 15 proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness and other available funds, as appropriated in 16 section 1 of this Act, for ConnectND project costs, debt service repayment, and refunding of 17 ConnectND interim borrowings. The industrial commission shall issue evidences of 18 indebtedness under this section with the condition that repayment on the evidences of 19 indebtedness need not begin until July 1, 2005. For purposes of this Act, loan or debt service 20 repayments are equivalent to lease rental payments as that term is used in chapter 54-17.2. 21 ConnectND student fee revenues and other available funds are hereby appropriated to the 22 North Dakota university system for the North Dakota university system's share of the 23 ConnectND project costs, debt service repayment, refunding of ConnectND interim borrowings, 24 and other costs incidental to ConnectND implementation. 25

The authority of the industrial commission to issue evidences of indebtedness under this section ends June 30, 2005, but the industrial commission may continue to exercise all other powers granted to it under chapter 54-17.2 and this Act and comply with any covenants entered into before that date.

The limitation provided in section 54-17.2-23 does not apply to repayments allocable to the evidences of indebtedness issued for the ConnectND project. Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly

SECTION 3. EVIDENCES OF INDEBTEDNESS ISSUANCE REPAYMENT

RESPONSIBILITY. Debt service on the evidences of indebtedness issued under section 2 of
this Act must be available from charges made and collected by the information technology
department from users of the system.

SECTION 4. FUNDING - EXCEPTION - AUTHORIZATION. Notwithstanding section
54-16-04, the information technology department may transfer appropriation authority between
line items within section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending
June 30, 2005. The department shall notify the office of management and budget of any
transfer made pursuant to this section. The department shall report any transfers made in
excess of \$50,000 pursuant to this section to the budget section.

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SECTION 5. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY. The

legislative council shall consider studying during the 2003-04 interim the potential for
centralizing and consolidating information technology services. The legislative council shall
report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement
the recommendations, to the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

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54-59-02. Information technology department - Responsibility - Public policy.

19 The information technology department is established with the responsibility for all wide area 20 network services planning, selection, and implementation for all state agencies, including 21 institutions under the control of the board of higher education, counties, cities, and school 22 districts in this state. With respect to a county, city, or school district, wide area network 23 services are those services necessary to transmit voice, data, or video outside the county, city, 24 or school district. In exercising its powers and duties, the department is responsible for 25 computer support services, host software development, statewide communications services, 26 standards for providing information to other state agencies and the public through the internet, 27 technology planning, process redesign, and quality assurance. The department may not 28 exercise its powers and duties in a manner that competes or otherwise interferes with the 29 provision of telecommunications services to private, charitable, or nonprofit entities by privately

30 or cooperatively owned telecommunications companies.

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- SECTION 7. A new subsection to section 54-59-05 of the North Dakota Century Code
 is created and enacted as follows:
- May provide wide area network services to a state agency, city, county, school 3 4 district, or other political subdivision of this state. The information technology 5 department may not provide wide area network services to any private, charitable, 6 or nonprofit entity except the department may continue to provide the wide area 7 network services it provided to the private, charitable, and nonprofit entities 8 receiving services from the department on January 1, 2003. The department shall 9 file with the state auditor before September 1, 2003, a description of the wide area 10 network services the department provided to each private, charitable, and nonprofit 11 entity receiving services from the department on January 1, 2003. 12 **SECTION 8. EMERGENCY.** The enterprise resource planning system line item in 13 section 1 of this Act and all of sections 2 and 3 of this Act are declared to be an emergency
