- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service
- 2 commission; and to amend and reenact section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to the salary of public service commissioners.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the	
6	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state	
7	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and	
8	other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the	
9	public service commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005,	
10	as follows:

12	Operating expenses	1,232,261
13	Capital assets	45,011
14	Grants	62,000
15	Abandoned mined lands contractual services	3,668,492

20	SECTION 2. SPECIAL FUNDS TRANSFER. The less estimated income line item in	
21	section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$250,000, or so much of the sum as may be	
22	necessary, from the state rail fund, maintained by the department of transportation under	
23	section 49-17.1-02.1, to pay the costs associated with the initial stage of a rail rate complaint	
24	case.	

1 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 **49-01-05.** Salary of commissioners. The annual salary of a commissioner is sixty-six 4 sixty-nine thousand five eight hundred nine seventy-four dollars through December 31, 2001 5 2003, sixty-eight seventy thousand five hundred four seventy-five dollars through June 30 6 December 31, 2002 2004, and sixty nine seventy-one thousand eight nine hundred 7 seventy-four eighty-six dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any commissioner for 8 any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and paid over by the 9 commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the general fund of the 10 state.
