- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 human services; to provide for the transfer of appropriation authority between agencies and
- 3 institutions; to provide an exception; to provide for legislative council studies; to provide
- 4 statements of legislative intent; and to declare an emergency.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section	n, or so much of the	
7	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
8	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
9	other income, to the department of human services and its various divisions, for the purpose of		
10	defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending		
11	June 30, 2005, as follows:

26	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - HEALTH CENTER GRANTS.	There is appropriated			
27	out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the				
28	sum of \$50,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human				
29					
23	services for the purpose of providing grants to community entities to sup	port community			

- submission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005. The department may not award an individual grant of more than \$10,000.
- 3 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION LEGISLATIVE INTENT.** There is appropriated out of
- 4 any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
- 5 \$1,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from federal funds, the sum of
- 6 \$2,125,000 to the department of human services for the purpose of supplementing other
- 7 appropriations provided for the medical assistance program, the developmental center, the
- 8 state hospital, and home and community-based services programs for the biennium beginning
- 9 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that
- 10 whenever possible, the department use the general fund moneys appropriated under this
- 11 section to maximize federal funding for these programs and functions.
- 12 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT DEVILS LAKE CHILD SUPPORT
- 13 **ENFORCEMENT UNIT.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the fifty-ninth legislative
- 14 assembly consider removing general fund support for the Devils Lake child support
- 15 enforcement unit reservation project if the project's performance results do not improve during
- the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- 17 **SECTION 5. LANDS AND MINERALS TRUST FUND.** The sum of \$3,261,556, or so
- much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the developmentally disabled facility loan
- 19 fund line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, may be expended by the department of
- 20 human services from the lands and minerals trust fund for the purpose of making payments of
- 21 principal and interest to the common schools trust fund on any loans made from it pursuant to
- 22 the developmentally disabled loan fund program nos. 2 and 3, for the biennium beginning
- 23 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- 24 SECTION 6. HEALTH CARE TRUST FUND TRANSFER TO GENERAL FUND. The
- 25 office of management and budget shall transfer \$35,911,035 from the health care trust fund to
- 26 the general fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- 27 SECTION 7. FUNDING TRANSFERS EXCEPTION AUTHORIZATION.
- 28 Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the department of human services may transfer
- 29 appropriation authority between line items within each subdivision of section 1 of this Act, and
- 30 between subdivisions within section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and
- 31 ending June 30, 2005. The department shall notify the office of management and budget of

- 1 any transfer made pursuant to this section. The department shall report to the budget section
- 2 after June 30, 2004, any transfers made in excess of \$50,000 and to the appropriations
- 3 committees of the fifty-ninth legislative assembly regarding any transfers made pursuant to this
- 4 section.
- 5 SECTION 8. FEDERAL TANF BLOCK GRANT PROGRAMS EXPENDITURE LIMIT.
- 6 The department of human services shall make the changes necessary to programs utilizing
- 7 funding from the temporary assistance for needy families (TANF) block grant to provide that by
- 8 the end of the 2003-05 biennium, the cumulative funding anticipated to be spent for these
- 9 programs for each fiscal year does not exceed North Dakota's annual federal TANF block grant
- 10 allocation, including any incentive or bonus grants awarded to North Dakota.
- 11 SECTION 9. MEDICAL SERVICES COPAYMENTS AND SERVICE LIMITS. The
- 12 department of human services shall establish a six dollar copayment for medical assistance
- 13 recipients for each emergency room visit that is not designated an emergency service by the
- 14 medical services provider. The department of human services shall establish other service
- 15 copayments or limits and make other programmatic changes within the medical services
- 16 program to operate the program within the funding levels approved by the fifty-eighth legislative
- 17 assembly for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- 18 **SECTION 10. NURSING HOME RATES EXCEPTION DIRECT CARE LIMIT.**
- 19 Notwithstanding subsection 4 of section 50-24.4-10, the department of human services shall
- 20 establish an eighty-five dollar per diem limit, adjusted for inflation under subsection 5 of section
- 21 50-24.4-10, on allowable operating costs for direct care services of nursing facilities for
- 22 purposes of determining nursing facility payment rates for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003,
- 23 and ending June 30, 2005.

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- SECTION 11. SUPPORTED LIVING ARRANGEMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH
- 25 **DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES LOCAL MATCHING FUNDS FUNDING ALLOCATION.**
- 26 The grants medical assistance line item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes
- 27 \$200,000 from the general fund for supported living arrangement services for individuals with
- 28 developmental disabilities. This funding may be spent only if local or private funding is
- 29 provided for these services on a dollar-for-dollar matching fund basis. The department shall
- 30 allocate the funding appropriated for this purpose proportionately to each human service region
- 31 of the state based on the number of individuals with developmental disabilities seeking

- supported living arrangement services in each region for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003,
  and ending June 30, 2005.
- 3 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION SURVEY
- 4 **TIME PERIOD.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the department of human
- 5 services only survey vocational rehabilitation clients who become employed regarding job
- 6 retention and job satisfaction after three months of employment if allowed under federal
- 7 regulations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- 8 SECTION 13. COMPULSIVE GAMBLING TREATMENT SERVICES LIMITATION.
- 9 Notwithstanding section 1 of House Bill No. 1243, as approved by the fifty-eighth legislative
- 10 assembly, the department of human services may not spend in excess of \$400,000 for
- 11 compulsive gambling treatment services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending
- 12 June 30, 2005.
- 13 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY HUMAN SERVICES
- 14 **ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.** The legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2003-04
- 15 interim, administrative costs of human service programs, including costs incurred by the central
- 16 office of the department of human services, human service centers, and county social services.
- 17 If studied, the legislative council shall review the effects of the 1997 "swap" legislation on state
- 18 and county human service program costs. The legislative council shall report its findings and
- 19 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 20 the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.
- 21 SECTION 15. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL
- 22 **HEALTH NEEDS.** The legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2003-04 interim,
- 23 programs providing services to children with special health care needs in North Dakota and
- 24 service needs of these children which are not available under current programs. The legislative
- 25 council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to
- 26 implement the recommendations, to the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.
- 27 SECTION 16. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY MEDICAID ADVISORY COUNCIL.
- 28 The legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2003-04 interim, the feasibility and
- 29 desirability of establishing an advisory council for the medical assistance program of the
- 30 department of human services. If studied, the legislative council shall consider including
- 31 representatives of private health care providers on the advisory council. The legislative council

- 1 shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to
- 2 implement the recommendations, to the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.

## 3 SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - LONG-TERM CARE CONTINUUM.

- 4 The legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2003-04 interim, North Dakota's
- 5 long-term care continuum of services, including service delivery methods and payment
- 6 systems. If studied, the legislative council shall consider the cost-effectiveness of the programs
- 7 and the appropriateness of rate structures and the nursing home equalized rate policy. The
- 8 legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
- 9 required to implement the recommendations, to the fifty-ninth legislative assembly.
- 10 **SECTION 18. EMERGENCY.** The total all funds line item for the state hospital in
- 11 subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act includes \$400,000 from special funds for capital
- 12 construction projects, and the appropriation of that amount is declared to be an emergency
- 13 measure.
