

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with Conference Committee Amendments
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2020**

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state historical
2 society; and to declare an emergency.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
5 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
6 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
7 other income, to the state historical society for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
8 state historical society, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005, as
9 follows:

21 **SECTION 2. REVOLVING FUND - APPROPRIATION.** All fees collected by the state
22 historical society and deposited in the revolving fund established pursuant to section 55-03-04
23 are appropriated to the state historical society for the purposes provided in chapter 55-03, for
24 the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.

1 **SECTION 3. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND BEQUESTS - APPROPRIATION.** All gifts,
2 grants, devises, bequests, donations, and assignments received by the state historical society
3 and deposited with the state treasurer pursuant to section 55-01-04 are appropriated to the
4 state historical society for the purposes provided in section 55-01-04, for the biennium
5 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.

6 **SECTION 4. COMPACT STORAGE UNITS.** The state historical society may spend
7 moneys appropriated in the capital assets line item in section 1 of this Act to purchase compact
8 storage units, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30,
9 2005.

10 **SECTION 5. EXEMPTION.** The state historical society's appropriation contained in
11 section 1 of chapter 20 of the 2001 Session Laws is not subject to the provisions of section
12 54-44.1-11 in an amount of up to \$540,000, of which \$440,000 is from the general fund and
13 \$100,000 is from special funds. Of the \$540,000, \$25,000 is for cultural heritage grants and
14 \$515,000 is for the completion of the confluence center exhibits and the era of change exhibits.

15 **SECTION 6. LEWIS AND CLARK BICENTENNIAL LINE ITEM AND CAPITAL**
16 **ASSETS LINE ITEM TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state
17 historical society may transfer funds between the Lewis and Clark bicentennial line item and the
18 capital assets line item during the period beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.

19 **SECTION 7. EMERGENCY.** The capital assets line item, \$300,000 of the grants line
20 item relating to the federal historic preservation program, and the veterans' oral history project
21 line item in section 1 and section 4 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
