**ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1524**

1 A BILL for an Act to provide for a tribal and state relations committee; and to provide an  
2 expiration date.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. Committee on tribal and state relations - Membership - Duties.**

5 1. The committee on tribal and state relations is composed of seven members as  
6 follows:

- 7 a. The chairman of the legislative council or the chairman's designee;  
8 b. Three members of the house of representatives, two of whom must be  
9 selected by the leader representing the majority faction of the house of  
10 representatives and one of whom must be selected by the leader  
11 representing the minority faction of the house of representatives; and  
12 c. Three members of the senate, two of whom must be selected by the leader  
13 representing the majority faction of the senate and one of whom must be  
14 selected by the leader representing the minority faction of the senate.

15 2. The chairman of the legislative council, or the chairman's designee, shall serve as  
16 chairman of the committee.

17 3. The committee shall meet at such times and places as determined by the  
18 chairman. The legislative council shall provide staffing for the committee.

19 4. The committee, in consultation with the native American tribal citizens' task force,  
20 shall study tribal-state issues, including government-to-government relations, the  
21 delivery of services, case management services, child support enforcement, and  
22 issues related to the promotion of economic development. Except for those  
23 meetings or portions of meetings during which the committee is making final  
24 decisions regarding the committee's recommendations and proposed legislation,

1           the committee may conduct joint meetings with the native American tribal citizens'  
2           task force. The committee shall report its findings and recommendations, together  
3           with any legislation required to implement those recommendations, to the  
4           legislative council.

5           5. The members of the committee are entitled to compensation from the legislative  
6           council for attendance at committee meetings at the rate provided for members of  
7           the legislative assembly for attendance at interim committee meetings and are  
8           entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending the meetings in the  
9           amounts provided by law for other state officers.

10          6. The native American tribal citizens' task force is composed of six members as  
11          follows:

- 12           a. The executive director of the Indian affairs commission, or the executive  
13           director's designee;
- 14           b. The chairman of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe, or the chairman's designee;
- 15           c. The chairman of the Spirit Lake Tribe, or the chairman's designee;
- 16           d. The chairman of the Three Affiliated Tribes, or the chairman's designee;
- 17           e. The chairman of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians, or the  
18           chairman's designee; and
- 19           f. The chairman of the Sisseton-Wahpeton Sioux Tribe, or the chairman's  
20           designee.

21           **SECTION 2. EXPIRATION DATE.** This Act is effective through July 31, 2007, and  
22           after that date is ineffective.
