The use of electronic monitor systems (ems) is included in the department of corrections and rehabilitation's 2005-07 executive budget recommendation. The department's ems plan includes diverting non-violent short-sentenced offenders from prison, community supervision of offenders on parole and/or probation, and community supervision of sex offenders under correctional supervision.

The estimated fiscal impact noted in section 1A only represents the estimated fiscal impact to the department of corrections and rehabilitation and the parole board. The bill, as amendmended, also applies to the district courts.

As noted in 1A, the department of corrections and rehabilitation's 2005-07 executive budget recommendation includes the use of ems. The estimated cost per day is \$5 per offender. By 6/30/07 the department anticipates to have the following offender types under supervision in the community using ems.

- \* 30 non-violent short-sentenced (diverted from prison)
- \* 5 offenders on probation and/or parole
- \* 20 sex offenders under correctional supervision

The 2005-07 department of corrections and rehabilitation's executive budget recommendation includes \$180,095 of general funds to provide for the use of ems devices for the supervision of offenders. The cost per offender per day is estimated at \$5.00

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
