10	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the		
11	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
12	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
13	other income, to the attorney general for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the attorney		
14	general, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007, as follows:

27	SECTION 4. SCHOOL FINANCE LAWSUIT. The state school finance lawsuit line item		
28	in sections 1 and 3 of this Act is for the purpose of defraying the expenses of defending the		
29	state's school finance system for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30,		
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SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAMING AND EXCISE TAX ALLOCATION 1 2 FUND - LOCAL GAMING ENFORCEMENT GRANTS. The grants line item in section 3 of this 3 Act includes \$617,000 for local gaming enforcement grants. 4 **SECTION 6. FIRE AND TORNADO FUND - FEES.** The attorney general shall charge 5 and collect fees for services provided by the state fire marshal program to entities covered by the fire and tornado fund under chapter 26.1-22. Fees under this section may be collected in 6 7 amounts of up to a total of \$310,000 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending 8 June 30, 2007. All fees collected under this section must be deposited in the attorney general's 9 operating fund. 10 **SECTION 7. PETROLEUM RELEASE COMPENSATION FUND - FEES.** The attorney 11 general shall charge and collect fees for services provided by the state fire marshal program to 12 entities covered by the petroleum release compensation fund under chapter 23-37. Fees under 13 this section may be collected in amounts of up to a total of \$35,000 for the biennium beginning 14 July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007. All fees collected under this section must be deposited in the attorney general's operating fund. 15 16 SECTION 8. ESTIMATED INCOME - RACING PROMOTION, PURSE, AND 17 BREEDERS' FUNDS. Notwithstanding section 53-06.2-11, the estimated income line item in 18 section 3 of this Act includes \$129,002 from the racing promotion fund, \$129,002 from the 19 purse fund, and \$129,003 from the breeders' fund for the purpose of defraying the 20 administrative and operating costs of the racing commission for the biennium beginning July 1, 21 2005, and ending June 30, 2007. 22 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-12-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 **54-12-11.** Salary of attorney general. The annual salary of the attorney general is 25 seventy-one thousand seventy-two dollars through December 31, 2001, seventy-three 26 seventy-seven thousand two six hundred four fifty-five dollars through June 30, 2002, 2006, and 27 seventy four may not exceed eighty thousand six seven hundred sixty-eight sixty-one dollars 28 thereafter.
