SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state treasurer for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007, as follows: Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly

54-11-13. Salary of state treasurer. The annual salary of the state treasurer is

sixty-six thousand two one hundred thirty-three sixty dollars through June 30, 2006, and
sixty-eight thousand eight hundred six dollars thereafter.
