- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture
- 2 commissioner; to amend and reenact sections 4-01-19, 4-01-21, and 19-18-04 of the North
- 3 Dakota Century Code, relating to the pride of Dakota program, the salary of the agriculture
- 4 commissioner, and pesticide registration fees; and to provide for transfers.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this
7 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the agriculture

8 commissioner in section 3 of this Act as follows:

21	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in th	e general fund in the state	
22	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived f	from federal funds and	
23	other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defra	aying the expenses of that	
24	agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30,	, 2007, as follows:

3 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND

PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum
of \$2,725,077, or so much of the sum as may be available, from the environment and rangeland
protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various agriculture department
programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

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SECTION 5. ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE INSPECTION FUND. The

9 estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$61,410, or so much of

10 the sum as may be available, from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund for the

11 purpose of defraying the expenses of regulating anhydrous ammonia storage facilities, for the

12 biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income
line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$700,000, or so much of the sum as may
be necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying
the expenses of various agriculture department programs for the biennium beginning July 1,
2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

18 SECTION 7. TRANSFER. The commissioner shall transfer \$200,000 from the
19 environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund.

20 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-01-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows:

4-01-19. Marketing bureau. The agriculture commissioner of this state shall establish
and maintain a marketing bureau for the purpose of gathering and disseminating statistical
information on agricultural marketing problems of the state and engaging in marketing services
of agricultural products. Any moneys received or generated by the pride of Dakota program
must be deposited in the general fund in the state treasury. <u>General fund expenditures for</u>
pride of Dakota conferences are limited to the amount of revenue deposited in the general fund
for this purpose.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

1	4-01	-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. The annual salary of the agriculture	
2	commissior	er is sixty-six thousand five hundred nine dollars through December 31, 2001,	
3	sixty-eight s	eventy-two thousand five six hundred four sixty-nine dollars through June 30, 2002	
4	<u>2006,</u> and s	sixty-nine <u>may not exceed seventy-five</u> thousand eight <u>five</u> hundred seventy-four

6	SEC	TION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 19-18-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
7	amended and reenacted as follows:		
8	19-18-04. (Effective through June 30, 2005) Registration - Fees.		
9	1.	Any person before selling or offering for sale any pesticide for use within this state	
10		shall file biennially with the commissioner an application for registration of the	
11		pesticide. The application must:	
12		a. Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.	
13		b. Give the name and brand of each product to be registered.	
14		c. Be accompanied by a current label of each product to be registered.	
15		d. Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred fifty dollars for each	
16		product to be registered. At the close of each calendar month, the	
17		commissioner shall transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the	
18		registrations. The state treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered	
19		product to the general fund in the state treasury and the remainder of the	
20		registration fee for each registered product to the environment and rangeland	
21		protection fund.	
22		e. Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet for each product to be	
23		registered.	
24	2.	The commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy,	
25		toxicity, residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will	
26		perform its intended function without unreasonable adverse effects on the	
27		environment. If the commissioner finds that the application conforms to law, the	
28		commissioner shall issue to the applicant a certificate of registration of the product.	
29	3.	Each registration covers a designated two-year period beginning January first of	
30		each even-numbered year and expiring December thirty-first of the following year.	
31		A certificate of registration may not be issued for a term longer than two years, and	

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1		is not transferable from one person to another, or from the ownership to whom	
2		issued to another ownership. A penalty of fifty percent of the license or registration	
3		fee must be imposed if the license or certificate of registration is not applied for on	
4		or before January thirty-first following the expiration date. Each product must go	
5		through a two-year discontinuance period in order to clear all outstanding products	
6		in the channel of trade.	
7	4.	This section does not apply to a pesticide sold by a retail dealer if the registration	
8		fee has been paid by the manufacturer, jobber, or any other person, as required by	
9		this section.	
10	(Ef l	ective July 1, 2005) Registration - Fees. Any person before selling or offering for	
11	sale any pe	esticide for use within this state shall file biennially with the commissioner an	
12	application	for registration of the pesticide. The application must:	
13	1.	Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.

20		the state treasury and the remainder of the registration fee for each registered	
21		product to the environment and rangeland protection fund.	
22	5.	Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet for each product to be registered.	
23	The	commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy, toxicity,	
24	residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will perform its intended		
25	function without unreasonable adverse effects on the environment. If the commissioner finds		
26	that the application conforms to law, the commissioner shall issue to the applicant a certificate		
27	of registration of the product.		
28	Each registration covers a designated two-year period beginning January first of each		
29	even numbered year and expiring December thirty first of the following year. A certificate of		
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- 1 of fifty percent of the license or registration fee must be imposed if the license or certificate of
- 2 registration is not applied for on or before January thirty-first following the expiration date. Each
- 3 product must go through a two-year discontinuance period in order to clear all outstanding
- 4 products in the channel of trade.
- 5 This section does not apply to a pesticide sold by a retail dealer if the registration fee
- 6 has been paid by the manufacturer, jobber, or any other person, as required by this section.
