FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1010

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the insurance
- 2 commissioner; to provide for fund transfers; to provide for making payments of insurance
- 3 premiums tax collections to fire departments; and to amend and reenact sections 26.1-01-09
- 4 and 26.1-36-37.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the commissioner's salary and
- 5 loss ratios.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this
 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the insurance

SECTION 2. FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS OR ENHANCEMENTS INFORMATION. The

- 19 amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the
- 20 base funding level for the insurance commissioner which are included in the appropriation in
- 21 section 3 of this Act as follows:

6 **SECTION 3.** APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 7 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 9 other income, to the insurance commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that 10 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007, as follows: 11 Salaries and wages \$5,053,657 12 Operating expenses 2,163,377 13 Grants 6,395,000 14 Total special funds appropriation \$13,612,034 15 SECTION 4. INSURANCE PREMIUMS TAX COLLECTIONS PAYMENTS. Section 3

of this Act includes the sum of \$6,395,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary to the
insurance commissioner, of which \$6,200,000 is for the purpose of making payments of
insurance premiums tax collections to fire departments, \$120,000 is for the purpose of making
two equal payments to the North Dakota firefighter's association, and \$75,000 is for the
purpose of providing a grant to the North Dakota association of oil and gas producing counties
for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

SECTION 5. BONDING FUND. Section 3 this Act includes the sum of \$35,000, or so
 much of the sum as may be necessary, from the state bonding fund to pay bonding fund
 administrative expenses for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

25 **SECTION 6. FIRE AND TORNADO FUND.** Section 3 of this Act includes the sum of 26 \$988,576, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the state fire and tornado fund to 27 pay fire and tornado fund administrative expenses for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and 28 ending June 30, 2007.

SECTION 7. UNSATISFIED JUDGMENT FUND. Section 3 of this Act includes the
 sum of \$35,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the state unsatisfied

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1 judgment fund to pay unsatisfied judgment fund administrative expenses for the biennium

2 beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

SECTION 8. PETROLEUM TANK RELEASE COMPENSATION FUND. Section 3 of
 this Act includes the sum of \$120,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the
 petroleum tank release compensation fund to pay petroleum tank release compensation fund
 administrative expenses for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.
 SECTION 9. ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE FACILITY INSPECTION FUND.
 Section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$150,000, or so much of the sum as may be
 necessary, from the anhydrous ammonia storage facility inspection fund to pay for anhydrous

ammonia tank inspection costs for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30,2007.

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SECTION 10. ADDITIONAL CRITICAL METHAMPHETAMINE-USE ZONE.

13 Notwithstanding rules adopted by the commissioner identifying a critical methamphetamine-use 14 zone, the commissioner shall designate the counties of Walsh, Cavalier, and Pembina as a 15 critical methamphetamine-use zone subject to section 19-20.2-11 and rules adopted pursuant 16 to that section. Section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$50,000 from the insurance regulatory 17 trust fund, or so much of the sum as is necessary, to implement security measures established 18 by the commissioner, including the purchase and distribution of locking devices, in the counties 19 of Walsh, Cavalier, and Pembina, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 20 2007.

21 **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-01-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows:

23 26.1-01-09. Salary of commissioner. The annual salary of the commissioner is
 24 sixty four thousand seven hundred forty two dollars through December 31, 2001, sixty six
 25 seventy thousand six hundred eighty four <u>fifty-nine</u> dollars through June 30, 2002 <u>2006</u>, and
 26.1-01-09. Salary of commissioner. The annual salary of the commissioner is
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 27.2001, sixty six
 28.2001, sixty six
 29.2002, and
 2006, and
 2006, sixty-eight seventy-two thousand eighteen eight hundred sixty-one dollars thereafter.

SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 26.1-36-37.2 of the North Dakota Century Code
is amended and reenacted as follows:

29 26.1-36-37.2. Loss ratios - Rules. For all policies providing hospital, surgical,
 30 medical, or major medical benefit, an <u>An</u> insurance company, a nonprofit health service
 31 corporation, a fraternal benefit society, and any other entity providing a plan of <u>accident or</u>

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- 1 health insurance or <u>other</u> health benefit subject to state insurance regulation shall return
- 2 benefits to group policyholders in the aggregate of not less than seventy five a percent of
- 3 premium received and to individual policyholders in the aggregate of not less than sixty-five
- 4 percent of premium received, as determined by the commissioner. The commissioner shall
- 5 adopt rules to establish these minimum standards on the basis of incurred claims experienced
- 6 and earned premiums for the entire period for which rates are computed to provide coverage in
- 7 accordance with accepted actuarial principles and practices. This section does not apply to
- 8 any contract or plan of insurance that provides exclusively for accident, disability income
- 9 insurance, specified disease, hospital confinement indemnity, or other limited benefit health
- 10 insurance.
