- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the division of
- 2 emergency management; to provide for a performance audit of 911 services; to provide
- 3 authorization for a loan from the Bank of North Dakota; to provide for a report to the legislative
- 4 council; and to require political subdivision financial participation in the state radio
- 5 communications system migration project.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.	The amounts identified in this	
8	section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the division of emergency		
9	management under the supervision of the adjutant general in section 3 of this Act as follows:

17	SECTION 2. FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS OR ENHANCEMENTS INFORMATION. The		
18	amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the		
19	base funding level for the division of emergency management under the supervision of the		
20	adjutant general which are included in the appropriation in section 3 of this Act as follows:

4	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the		
5	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
6	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
7	other income, to the division of emergency management under the supervision of the adjutant		
8	general for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning		
9	July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007, as follows:

17	SECTION 4. STATE HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS PREPAREDNESS AND		
18	<b>RESPONSE FUND.</b> The sum of \$225,553, or so much of the sum as may be necessary,		
19	included in the estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act, is from the state hazardous		
20	chemicals preparedness and response fund and may be spent by the division of emergency		
21	management for the purposes provided in section 37-17.1-07.1.		
22	SECTION 5. PERFORMANCE AUDIT - 911 SERVICES. The state auditor shall		
23	conduct a performance audit of the fees collected for 911 services and the utilization of such		
24	fees during the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007. The audit must		
25	include a recommendation by the state auditor of the appropriate method of funding costs		
26	incurred by the division of emergency management for providing these services, including the		
27	costs incurred by the division for answering calls from counties not under contract with the		
28	division for 911 services. The results of the audit must be presented to the legislative audit and		
29	fiscal review committee and the appropriations committees of the sixtieth legislative assembly.		
30	SECTION 6. STATE RADIO COMMUNICATIONS - LOAN AUTHORIZATION.		
31	Subject to the approval of the emergency commission and the budget see	ction, the division of	

- 1 emergency management may borrow an amount not to exceed \$900,000 from the Bank of
- 2 North Dakota for expenses associated with the migration of the state radio communications
- 3 system from analog to digital during the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30,
- 4 2007. The loan only may be provided if the division has the prior written approval to repay any
- 5 loan, including accrued interest, from future funding made available from the United States
- 6 department of homeland security. Any funds borrowed by the division under this section are
- 7 hereby appropriated.
- 8 SECTION 7. HOMELAND SECURITY FUNDING ALLOCATION REVIEW PROCESS -
- 9 **REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.** The division of emergency management shall
- 10 implement during the 2005-06 interim a review process relating to the division's allocation of
- 11 federal homeland security funds to political subdivisions. The process must assure that all
- 12 agencies and responders are involved in the distribution of the federal funds and that the
- 13 priorities included in the local needs assessment are met. The division, as requested, shall
- 14 provide an appropriate committee of the legislative council a report detailing the uses of federal
- 15 homeland security funds at the state and local level and a report regarding any discrepancies
- 16 relating to the needs assessment completed by the division and purchases made with federal
- 17 homeland security funds.
- 18 SECTION 8. State radio communications system migration project Political
- 19 **subdivision financial participation.** The division of emergency management shall require
- 20 political subdivisions to spend a portion of federal homeland security funding allocations on
- 21 costs associated with the migration of the state radio communications system from analog to
- 22 digital.
