- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the game and fish
- 2 department; to amend and reenact sections 20.1-02-16.1 and 20.1-04-15 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the game and fish fund and establishing a youth pheasant hunting
- 4 season; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide an expiration date; and to declare
- 5 an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this	
8	section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the game and fish	
9	department in section 3 of this Act as follows:

21 SECTION 2. FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS OR ENHANCEMENTS INFORMATION. The

- 22 amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the
- 23 base funding level for the game and fish department which are included in the appropriation in
- 24 section 3 of this Act as follows:

11	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the		
12	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish fund in		
13	the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal		
14	funds and other income, to the game and fish department for the purpose of defraying the		
15	expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007,		
16	as follows:

29	SECTION 4. PRIVATE LAND HABITAT AND ACCESS IMPROVEMENT. The sum of		
30	\$3,500,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the land habitat and deer		
31	depredation line item in section 3 of this Act, is from the private land habitat and access		

- 1 improvement fund and must be used by the game and fish department for the private land
- 2 habitat and access improvement program, as provided in section 20.1-02-05, for the biennium
- 3 beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.
- 4 **SECTION 5. NONGAME WILDLIFE.** The sum of \$35,000, or so much of the sum as
- 5 may be necessary, included in the nongame wildlife conservation line item in section 3 of this
- 6 Act, is from the nongame wildlife fund and must be used by the game and fish department for
- 7 the purposes provided in section 20.1-02-16.2, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and
- 8 ending June 30, 2007.
- 9 SECTION 6. WILDLIFE SERVICES AGRICULTURE COMMISSIONER. The sum of
- 10 \$550,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the wildlife services line
- 11 item in section 3 of this Act, is from the game and fish department operating fund and must be
- 12 provided to the agriculture commissioner to pay for services provided by the United States
- 13 department of agriculture wildlife services agency to alleviate wildlife depredation and damage
- 14 in North Dakota. The director of the game and fish department must approve projects,
- 15 contracts, and agreements relating to the expenditure of these moneys.
- 16 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS LINE
- 17 **ITEM UNDERDAHL GIFT.** The grants, gifts, and donations line item in section 3 of this Act
- 18 includes up to \$500,000 provided as a gift to the game and fish department from the estate of
- 19 Rodney Underdahl. It is the intent of the fifty-ninth legislative assembly to approve the
- 20 unrestricted receipt of this gift by the game and fish department.
- 21 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT GRAHAMS ISLAND ROAD. It is the intent of
- 22 the fifty-ninth legislative assembly that if the bids for the Grahams Island road construction
- 23 project are less than the amount budgeted, then \$100,000 of the \$500,000 grant provided by
- 24 the game and fish department for the road project must be returned to the game and fish fund.
 - **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-02-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
- 26 is amended and reenacted as follows:

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- 27 20.1-02-16.1. Game and fish fund Use Required balance Budget section
- 28 **approval.** All income of the state game and fish department deposited by the director with the
- 29 state treasurer must be credited to the state game and fish fund and the fund may be used only
- 30 by the department. All money derived from the investment of the fund or portions of the fund
- 31 must be credited to the game and fish department private land habitat and access improvement

- 1 fund. The department shall spend moneys in the game and fish fund within the limits of
- 2 legislative appropriations, only to the extent the balance of the fund is not reduced below ten
- 3 <u>fifteen</u> million dollars, unless otherwise authorized by the budget section.
- 4 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-04-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **20.1-04-15. Pheasant season Opening.** The open or lawful season on pheasant
- 7 and the open or lawful season on duck may not commence on the same weekend. The Except
- 8 as otherwise provided in this section for the opening of pheasant season for youth, the open or
- 9 lawful season on pheasant may not open earlier than one-half hour before sunrise and the
- 10 season may not commence earlier than the first Saturday of October of any given year. The
- 11 governor, in the governor's proclamation, may provide a pheasant hunting season for youth
- 12 ages twelve through sixteen on the Saturday and Sunday preceding the opening of the regular
- 13 pheasant season.
- **SECTION 11. EXPIRATION DATE.** Section 10 of this Act is effective through July 31,
- 15 2007, and after that date is ineffective.
- 16 **SECTION 12. EMERGENCY.** The ramp improvements and marina development line
- 17 item contained in section 3 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
