## SENATE BILL NO. 2032

A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for school district property tax relief; to create and
enact sections 57-01-20 and 57-15-01.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
allocation of school district property tax relief funds and general fund levy limitations of school
districts; to amend and reenact sections 57-15-01.1, 57-15-14, and 57-15-31 of the North

5 Dakota Century Code, relating to school district general fund levy limitations; to provide a 6 statement of legislative intent; to provide for a legislative council study; and to provide an

7 effective date.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 10 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$74,054,859, or so 11 much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state tax commissioner for the purpose of 12 allocation of school district property tax relief as provided in section 2 of this Act, for the 13 biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. The state tax commissioner shall 14 allocate \$35,897,132 of this appropriation among school districts in the first year of the 2007-09 15 biennium and \$38,157,727 of this appropriation among school districts in the second year of the 2007-09 biennium. 16

SECTION 2. Section 57-01-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
enacted as follows:

57-01-20. School district property tax relief allocation. The state tax commissioner
 shall allocate funds appropriated by the legislative assembly for school district property tax relief
 as provided in this section.

221.The state tax commissioner shall determine an adjusted combined education mill23rate for each school district using the school district's combined education mill rate24for the 2005 taxable year and subtracting from that mill rate sixty percent of the

1	ļ	maximum number of mills that may be levied by a school district, without voter
2	<u>i</u>	approval, under section 57-15-14 for the previous year. The adjusted combined
3	<u>(</u>	education mill rate for a school district may not be reduced to less than zero mills.

5	<u> </u>	under this subsection is not eligible for an allocation under this section.
6	<u>2.</u>	The state tax commissioner shall determine an adjusted combined education levy
7	į	in dollars for each school district by applying the adjusted combined education mill
8	ļ	rate for the school district to the final equalized taxable valuation of property in the
9	5	school district for the 2005 taxable year.
10	<u>3.</u>	The state tax commissioner shall total the adjusted combined education levies in
11	<u>(</u>	dollars for all school districts eligible for an allocation under this section and divide
12	<u>t</u>	that total into the total amount available for allocation for the budget year to
13	<u>(</u>	determine the school district property tax relief percentage for the budget year.
14	<u>4.</u>	The state tax commissioner shall multiply the adjusted combined education levy in
15	<u>(</u>	dollars for each school district times the school district property tax relief
16	I	percentage for the budget year to determine the school district property tax relief
17	i	allocation for the school district.
18	<u>5.</u>	a. The school district property tax relief allocation for each school district must
19		be adjusted by multiplying it times a factor determined by dividing the average
20		taxable valuation per student for all school districts eligible for an allocation
21		under this section by the average taxable valuation per student for the school
22		district. The adjustment factor for a school district under this subsection may
23		not be more than one and twenty-five hundredths or less than seventy-five
24		hundredths.
25	<u> </u>	b. A school district otherwise entitled to an allocation greater than five percent of
26		the total amount available for statewide allocation after applying the
27		adjustment factor under subdivision a may not receive a greater percentage of
28		the total amount available for statewide allocation than its percentage of the
29		total statewide enrollment in public elementary and secondary schools.
30	9	c. If after applying the adjustment factor the amount to be allocated does not
31		equal the amount available for allocation, the tax commissioner shall further

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1			adjust allocations to provide each school district its pro rata share of the
2			amount available for allocation. The state tax commissioner shall transfer the
3			adjusted school district property tax relief allocation determined under this
4			subsection to each school district no later than April fifteenth of the budget
5			year.
6	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	e state tax commissioner shall certify to each school district by August first of
7		eac	h year the amount of the school district property tax relief allocation for that
8		<u>sch</u>	ool district for the next budget year as calculated under this section. The state
9		tax	commissioner shall certify the same information to each county auditor for each
10		<u>sch</u>	ool district in the auditor's county.
11	<u>7.</u>	<u>For</u>	purposes of this section:
12		<u>a.</u>	"Budget year" means the taxable year in which the adjusted school district
13			property tax relief allocation under this section is to be transferred to school
14			districts.
15		<u>b.</u>	"Combined education mill rate" means the combined number of mills levied by
16			a school district for the general fund and the number of mills levied for high
17			school tuition and high school transportation. Any excess levy authority
18			approved by the qualified electors of a school district after December 31,
19			2006, must be excluded from the combined education mill rate.
20		<u>C.</u>	"Previous year" means the taxable year immediately preceding the year in
21			which the budget year allocations are determined under this section.
22	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 57-15-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
23	amended and reenacted as follows:		
24	57-15-01.1. Protection of taxpayers and taxing districts. Each taxing district,		
25	5 excluding a school district, may levy the lesser of the amount in dollars as certified in the budget		
26	6 of the governing body, or the amount in dollars as allowed in this section, subject to the		
27	following:		
28	1.	No	taxing district may levy more taxes expressed in dollars than the amounts
29		allo	wed by this section.
30	2.	For	purposes of this section:

1		a.	"Base year" means the taxing district's taxable year with the highest amount
2			levied in dollars in property taxes of the three taxable years immediately
3			preceding the budget year. For a park district general fund, the "amount
4			levied in dollars in property taxes" is the sum of amounts levied in dollars in
5			property taxes for the general fund under section 57-15-12 including any
6			additional levy approved by the electors, the insurance reserve fund under
7			section 32-12.1-08, the employee health care program under section
8			40-49-12, the public recreation system under section 40-55-09 including any
9			additional levy approved by the electors, forestry purposes under
10			section 57-15-12.1 except any additional levy approved by the electors, pest
11			control under section 4-33-11, and handicapped person programs and
12			activities under section 57-15-60;
13		b.	"Budget year" means the taxing district's year for which the levy is being
14			determined under this section;
15		c.	"Calculated mill rate" means the mill rate that results from dividing the base
16			year taxes levied by the sum of the taxable value of the taxable property in the
17			base year plus the taxable value of the property exempt by local discretion or
18			charitable status, calculated in the same manner as the taxable property; and
19		d.	"Property exempt by local discretion or charitable status" means property
20			exempted from taxation as new or expanding businesses under
21			chapter 40-57.1; improvements to property under chapter 57-02.2; or
22			buildings belonging to institutions of public charity, new single-family
23			residential or townhouse or condominium property, property used for early
24			childhood services, or pollution abatement improvements under section
25			57-02-08.
26	3.	A ta	axing district may elect to levy up to the amount levied in dollars in the base
27		yea	r. Any levy under this section must be specifically approved by a resolution
28		app	proved by the governing body of the taxing district. Before determining the levy
29		limi	tation under this section, the dollar amount levied in the base year must be:
30		a.	Reduced by an amount equal to the sum determined by application of the
31			base year's calculated mill rate for that taxing district to the final base year

1			taxable valuation of any taxable property and property exempt by local
2			discretion or charitable status which is not included in the taxing district for the
3			budget year but was included in the taxing district for the base year.
4		b.	Increased by an amount equal to the sum determined by the application of the
5			base year's calculated mill rate for that taxing district to the final budget year
6			taxable valuation of any taxable property or property exempt by local
7			discretion or charitable status which was not included in the taxing district for
8			the base year but which is included in the taxing district for the budget year.
9		C.	Reduced to reflect expired temporary mill levy increases authorized by the
10			electors of the taxing district.
11	4.	In a	ddition to any other levy limitation factor under this section, a taxing district may
12		incre	ease its levy in dollars to reflect new or increased mill levies authorized by the
13		legis	slative assembly or authorized by the electors of the taxing district.
14	5.	Und	ler this section a taxing district may supersede any applicable mill levy
15		limit	ations otherwise provided by law, or a taxing district may levy up to the mill
16		levy	limitations otherwise provided by law without reference to this section, but the
17		prov	visions of this section do not apply to the following:
18		a.	Any irrepealable tax to pay bonded indebtedness levied pursuant to
19			section 16 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota.
20		b.	The one-mill levy for the state medical center authorized by section 10 of

17	<u>4.</u>	In addition to any other levy limitation factor under this section, a school district
18		may increase its levy in dollars to reflect new or increased mill levies authorized by
19		the legislative assembly or authorized by the electors of the school district.
20	<u>5.</u>	Under this section a school district may supersede any applicable mill levy
21		limitations otherwise provided by law, or a school district may levy up to the mill
22		levy limitations otherwise provided by law without reference to this section, but the
23		provisions of this section do not apply to any irrepealable tax to pay bonded
24		indebtedness levied, pursuant to section 16 of article X of the Constitution of North
25		Dakota.
26	<u>6.</u>	A school district choosing to determine its levy authority under this section may
27		apply subsection 3 only to the amount in dollars levied for general fund purposes
28		under section 57-15-14 or, if the levy in the base year included separate general
29		fund and special fund levies under sections 57-15-14 and 57-15-14.2, the school
30		district may apply subsection 3 to the total amount levied in dollars in the base year
31		for both the general fund and special fund accounts. School district levies under

1		any section other than section 57-15-14 may be made within applicable limitations
2		but those levies are not subject to subsection 3.
3	SEC	TION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 57-15-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended ar	nd reenacted as follows:
5	57-1	5-14. Tax levy limitations in school districts. The aggregate amount levied
6	each year fo	or the purposes listed in section 57-15-14.2 by any school district, except the Fargo
7	school distri	ct, may not exceed the amount in dollars which the school district levied for the prior
8	school year	plus eighteen percent two percentage points more than the percentage increase in
9	the consume	er price index, midwest region, for urban consumers, as computed by the United
10	States depa	rtment of labor, bureau of labor statistics, for the most recent full calendar year, up
11	to a general	fund levy of one hundred eighty five sixty-five mills on the dollar of the taxable
12	valuation of	the district, except that:
13	1.	In any school district having a total population in excess of four thousand according
14		to the last federal decennial census:
15		a. There there may be levied any specific number of mills that, not exceeding
16		five percent more than the maximum number of mills the school district may
17		levy under this section or section 57-15-01.2, which upon resolution of the
18		school board has been submitted to and approved by a majority of the
19		qualified electors voting upon the question at any regular or special school
20		district election.
21		b. There is no limitation upon the taxes which may be levied if upon resolution of
22		the school board of any such district the removal of the mill levy limitation has
23		been submitted to and approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting
24		at any regular or special election upon such question.
25	2.	In any school district having a total population of less than four thousand, there
26		may be levied any specific number of mills that, not exceeding five percent more
27		than the maximum number of mills the school district may levy under this section or
28		section 57-15-01.2, which upon resolution of the school board has been approved
29		by fifty-five percent of the qualified electors voting upon the question at any regular
30		or special school election.

1 3. In any school district in which the total assessed valuation of property has 2 increased twenty percent or more over the prior year and in which as a result of 3 that increase the school district is entitled to less in state aid payments provided in 4 chapter 15.1-27 because of the deduction required in section 15.1-27-05, there 5 may be levied any specific number of mills more in dollars than was levied in the 6 prior year up to a general fund levy of one hundred eighty-five sixty-five mills on 7 the dollar of the taxable valuation of the school district. The additional levy 8 authorized by this subsection may be levied for not more than two years because 9 of any twenty percent or greater annual increase in assessed valuation. The total 10 amount of revenue generated in excess of the eighteen percent increase of two 11 percentage points more than the percentage increase in the consumer price index, 12 midwest region, for urban consumers, as computed by the United States 13 department of labor, bureau of labor statistics, for the most recent full calendar 14 year which is otherwise permitted by this section may not exceed the amount of 15 state aid payments lost as a result of applying the deduction provided in section 16 15.1-27-05 to the increased assessed valuation of the school district in a one-year 17 period.

18 The question of authorizing or discontinuing such specific number of mills authority 4. 19 or unlimited taxing authority in any school district must be submitted to the qualified 20 electors at the next regular election upon resolution of the school board or upon the 21 filing with the school board of a petition containing the signatures of gualified 22 electors of the district equal in number to twenty percent of the number of persons 23 enumerated in the school census for that district for the most recent year such 24 census was taken, unless such census is greater than four thousand in which case 25 only fifteen percent of the number of persons enumerated in the school census is 26 required. However, not fewer than twenty-five signatures are required unless the 27 district has fewer than twenty-five qualified electors, in which case the petition must 28 be signed by not less than twenty-five percent of the gualified electors of the 29 district. In those districts with fewer than twenty-five qualified electors, the number 30 of qualified electors in the district must be determined by the county superintendent 31 for such county in which such school is located. However, the approval of

1		discontinuing either such authority does not affect the tax levy in the calendar year		
2		in which the election is held. The election must be held in the same manner and		
3		subject to the same conditions as provided in this section for the first election upon		
4		the question of authorizing the mill levy.		
5	SE	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 57-15-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
6	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:		
7	57-15-31. Determination of levy. The amount to be levied by any county, city,			
8	township, school district, park district, or other municipality authorized to levy taxes shall be			
9	computed by deducting from the amount of estimated expenditures for the current fiscal year as			
10	finally deter	rmined, plus the required reserve fund determined upon by the governing board from		
11	the past experience of the taxing district, the total of the following items:			
12	1.	The available surplus consisting of the free and unencumbered cash balance.		
13	2.	Estimated revenues from sources other than direct property taxes.		
14	3.	The total estimated collections from tax levies for previous years.		
15	4.	Such expenditures as are to be made from bond sources.		
16	5.	The amount of distributions received from an economic growth increment pool		
17		under section 57-15-61.		
18	6.	The estimated amount to be received from payments in lieu of taxes on a project		
19		under section 40-57.1-03.		
20	<u>7.</u>	The amount certified to a school district by the state tax commissioner as the		
21		school district's property tax relief allocation for the budget year under section		
22		<u>57-01-20.</u>		
23	Allowance may be made for a permanent delinquency or loss in tax collection not to exceed five			
24	percent of t	he amount of the levy.		
25	SE	CTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY. It is the		
26	intent of the sixtieth legislative assembly that enactment of this Act will initiate an increase in the			
27	state's share of elementary and secondary education funding to secure immediate and future			
28	benefits to the citizens of the state. These benefits include relief from the expanded property			
29	tax burden that has created disparity within the tax structure of the state, enhanced equity of			
30	funding to support elementary and secondary education students, enduring property tax			
31	reductions,	and returning to taxpayers a substantial measure of revenue collections augmented		

1 by a robust state economy. It is the further intent of the sixtieth legislative assembly that 2 enactment of this Act will produce a reduction in property tax burdens which, with continued 3 efforts of future legislative assemblies, will result in reduction of each annual property tax bill to 4 not more than one and one-half percent of the true and full value for any parcel of property. 5 The legislative council shall assign a study in each legislative interim through 2012 by 6 the interim committee for taxation issues, for consideration by that committee of compliance 7 with, and future funding sources for, the shift in education funding and taxation policy initiated 8 by enactment of this Act.

9 SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act is effective for taxable years beginning after
10 December 31, 2006.
