1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state

2 department of health; to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-39 of the North Dakota

3 Century Code, relating to collecting fees for tanning facility inspections; to amend and reenact

4 section 23-01-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to tracking immunizations; and

5 to provide legislative intent.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this
section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the state department of

20	amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the

8 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 9 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 12 that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, as follows: 13 Salaries and wages \$37,747,905 14 45,596,674 Operating expenses 15 Capital assets 1,817,383 16 Grants 56,457,776 17 Tobacco prevention and control 8,919,346 18 WIC food payments 17,550,000 19 Total all funds \$168,089,084 20 Less estimated income 149,212,121 21 Total general fund appropriation \$18,876,963

SECTION 4. ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item included in section 3 of this Act includes \$266,119, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to be made available to the state department of health from the environment and rangeland protection fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. This amount includes \$50,000 for a grant to the North Dakota stockmen's association environmental services program.

SECTION 5. INTENT - INDIRECT COST RECOVERIES. Notwithstanding section
54-44.1-14, the state department of health may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating
account.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 23-01-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

- 3 23-01-05.3. Immunization data. 4 1. The state department of health may establish an immunization information system 5 and may require the childhood immunizations specified in subsection 1 of section 6 23-07-17.1 and other information be reported to the department. The state 7 department of health may only require the reporting of childhood immunizations 8 and other data upon completion of the immunization information reporting system. 9 A health care provider who administers a childhood immunization shall report the 10 patient's identifying information, the immunization that is administered, and other 11 required information to the department. The report must be submitted using 12 electronic media, and must contain the data content and use the format and codes 13 specified by the department. 14 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a health care provider, elementary or 2. 15 secondary school, early childhood facility, public or private postsecondary 16 educational institution, city or county board of health, district health unit, and the 17 state health officer may exchange immunization data in any manner with one 18 another. Immunization data that may be exchanged under this section is limited to 19 the date and type of immunization administered to a patient and may be 20 exchanged regardless of the date of the immunization. SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 23-39 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 22 created and enacted as follows: 23 License fees. The fees established by the department must be based on the cost of 24 conducting routine and complaint inspections, enforcement action, and preparing and sending 25 license renewals. License fees collected pursuant to this chapter must be deposited in the 26 department's operating fund in the state treasury and any expenditure from the fund is subject 27 to appropriation by the legislative assembly. The department shall waive all or a portion of the 28 license fee for any tanning facility that is subject to local jurisdiction. 29 The department shall accept city or county enforcement of this chapter if the 30 department determines the city or county requirements meet or exceed the requirements of this
- 31 chapter and any rules promulgated under this chapter.

SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - MEDIA CAMPAIGNS. It is the intent of the
sixtieth legislative assembly that funding from the community health trust fund not be used for
media campaigns to influence public opinion regarding measures on state or local ballots or
proposed legislation.

5 SECTION 9. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The total general fund appropriation line item in 6 7 section 3 of this Act includes \$2,010,135 for the one-time funding items identified in this 8 section. This amount is not a part of the agency's base budget to be used in preparing the 9 2009-11 executive budget.
