- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information
- 2 technology department; to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-02, a new section to
- 3 chapter 23-01, a new subsection to section 54-35-15.2, and a new section to chapter 54-59 of
- 4 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the superintendent of public instruction, creation of
- 5 a health information technology steering committee, the powers and duties of the information
- 6 technology committee, and the borrowing authority of the information technology department;
- 7 and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9	SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this

8	operating expenses, and capital assets line items in section 3 of this Act for the information		
9	technology department as may be requested by the chief information officer as determined		
10	necessary for the development and implementation of information technology projects.

16	appropriations committees of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of this one-time

23	SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FTE POSITIONS. It is	s the intent of the sixtieth	
24	legislative assembly that the twenty-eight new full-time equivalent po	sitions identified as	
25	project-specific and funded in section 3 of this Act may be filled while the project is being		
26	developed and funding is available for the biennium beginning July 1	, 2007, and ending	
27	June 30, 2009.		
28	SECTION 7. VIDEO SUPPORT SERVICES - NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY		
29	SYSTEM ASSISTANCE. Section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$	300,110 to be provided by	
30	the North Dakota university system for the cost of two full-time equiversity	alent positions and related	
31	operating expenses to provide support for video services in school di	stricts.	

SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 15.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Statewide longitudinal data system committee - Report to interim committee.

- 1. The statewide longitudinal data system committee consists of the chancellor of the board of higher education or chancellor's designee, the superintendent of public instruction or superintendent of public instruction's designee, the chief information officer or chief information officer's designee, the director of the department of career and technical education or the director's designee, the director of job service North Dakota or the director's designee, the director of the department of commerce or the director's designee, the director of the department of human services or the director's designee, and one person appointed by the governor. The governor shall appoint the chair of the committee. The committee may appoint advisory committees that would serve in an advisory capacity to the committee.
- <u>2. The committee shall plan and propose a longitudinal data system which:</u>
 - a. Provides for dissemination of management information to stakeholders and partners of state education, training, and employment systems; and
 - <u>b.</u> Uses data from educational and workforce systems as central sources of longitudinal data.
- 3. The committee shall recommend policies, procedures, and guidelines to protect the privacy and security of personal information as provided by state and federal law.
- 4. The committee shall provide a report to the information technology committee, interim committee on education issues, and interim committee on economic development prior to the sixty-first legislative assembly on the status of the statewide longitudinal data system plan. The report shall include recommendations for further development, cost proposals, proposals for legislation, and data sharing governance, including recommendations concerning the long-term role and administration of the followup information in North Dakota for education and training program.

1 SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 created and enacted as follows: 3 North Dakota health information technology steering committee. The North 4 Dakota health information technology steering committee consists of the state health officer or 5 the state health officer's designee, the governor or the governor's designee, the executive 6 director of the department of human services or the executive director's designee, individuals 7 appointed by the governor to represent state government interests, and individuals appointed 8 by the state health officer to represent health information technology stakeholders. 9 **SECTION 10.** A new subsection to section 54-35-15.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 10 11 Receive and review information, including a project startup report summarizing the 12 project description, project objectives, business need or problem, cost-benefit 13 analysis, and project risks and a project closeout report summarizing the project 14 objectives achieved, project budget and schedule variances, and lessons learned, 15 from the affected legislative or judicial branch agency regarding any information 16 technology project of the legislative or judicial branch with a total cost of two 17 hundred fifty thousand dollars or more. 18 SECTION 11. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 created and enacted as follows: 20 Borrowing authority - E-rate funding - Emergency commission approval. 21 Notwithstanding the limitations provided in section 54-59-05 and upon the approval of the 22 emergency commission, the department may borrow from the Bank of North Dakota an amount 23 necessary to pay telecommunications costs for connecting approved schools and libraries in 24 the event e-rate funding is not received by the department from the schools and libraries 25 division of the universal service administrative company. In addition to the principal repayment, 26 the Bank of North Dakota is entitled to receive interest on the loan at a rate equal to other state 27 agency borrowings. If at the end of the biennium a balance exists on any loan obtained 28 pursuant to this section and funds are not anticipated to be available from the schools and 29 libraries division of the universal service administrative company to repay the loan, the 30 department shall request a deficiency appropriation from the legislative assembly to repay to 31 loan.

- 1 **SECTION 12. EMERGENCY.** Funding of \$2,279,136 in the salaries and wages line
- 2 item, \$10,291,628 in the operating expenses line item, and \$993,575 in the capital assets line
- 3 item in section 3 of this Act relating to the department of human services' medicaid
- 4 management information system rewrite project is declared to be an emergency measure.
