- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service
- 2 commission; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05, 64-02-10, 64-02-13, and 64-02-13.1 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of public service commissioners and
- 4 testing of weighing and measuring devices; to provide for a legislative council study; to provide
- 5 for a report to the legislative assembly; and to provide for a report to the budget section.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.	The amounts identified in this	
8	section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the public service

8	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the		
9	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
10	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
11	other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of		
12	that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, as follows:

22	SECTION 4. EXEMPTION - LIMIT. The amount of \$800,000 a	ppropriated for the rail	
23	rate complaint case from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund, as o	contained in section 3 of	
24	chapter 8 of the 2005 Session Laws, is not subject to the provision of section 54-44.1-11. Any		
25	unexpected funds from the rail rate complaint case line item are available for use for		
26	expenditures relating to the rail rate complaint case. The \$800,000 appropriated in section 3 of		
27	this Act from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund is limited to the amount of any unspent		
28	beginning farmer revolving loan funds from the 2005-07 biennium appropriation, as contained		
29	in section 3 of chapter 8 of the 2005 Session Laws.		
30	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Da	kota Century Code is	
31	amended and reenacted as follows:		

1	49-	01-05. Salary of commissioners. The annua	al salary of a commissioner is	
2	seventy-two seventy-eight thousand six five hundred sixty-nine ninety-nine dollars through			
3	June 30, 2006 <u>2008</u> , and seventy five <u>eighty-one</u> thousand five <u>seven</u> hundred seventy-six			
4	forty-three dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any commissioner for any act or			
5	service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and paid over by the			
6	commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the general fund of the			
7	state.			
8	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 64-02-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
9	amended and reenacted as follows:			
10	64-02-10. Fees to test or calibrate weighing and measuring devices. The			
11	commission shall collect the following fees to:

15	When a rejected weighing or measuring device has been reconditioned or replaced by		
16	new equipment, it must be retested and certified before being put into use except as otherwise		
17	provided by rule. The fee for retest and certification is the same as for the first test and		
18	certification.		
19	When a test of a weighing or measuring device is required in addition to the regularly		
20	scheduled annual test, the commission shall charge a fee equal to the cost of operating the		
21	motor vehicle used in conducting the test. The mileage charges, as determined by the		
22	commission, must be in addition to the regular test fee and calculated to cover the costs of the		
23	additional travel. Where a test has been requested and the person requesting it fails to appear		
24	or to have the weighing or measuring device ready for testing at the arranged time, there is a		
25	charge of ten dollars a quarter hour for the time between the arranged time and the time at		
26	which the te	est can begin.	
27	SEC	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 64-02-13 of the	e North Dakota Century Code is
28	amended and reenacted as follows:		
29	64-02-13. Commission to test weighing or measuring devices annually. The		
30	commission may test or calibrate weighing or measuring devices annually. The owner of any		
31	weighing or measuring device used in this state is responsible for its accuracy and condition,		

- 1 and may have it tested annually, but must have it tested at least every fifteen months. The
- 2 public service commission shall determine the frequency of required testing for each category
- 3 of weighing and measuring device, which may not exceed twenty-four months. If upon testing
- 4 the weighing or measuring device is within the permitted tolerance, it must be sealed.
- 5 Inspections and testing of farm milk bulk tank equipment may be made only by the state dairy
- 6 department under section 4-30-18. Inspections and testing of oil and gas production meters
- 7 and measuring devices may be made only by or under the direction of the industrial
- 8 commission under section 38-08-04. If upon complaint the commission finds the weighing or
- 9 measuring device is within the permitted tolerance, the cost of the test, unless waived by the
- 10 commission, must be paid by the complainant; and in all other cases the cost of testing must be
- 11 paid by the owner of the equipment.
- 12 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 64-02-13.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 13 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 14 64-02-13.1. Exception from annual regularly scheduled test of weighing or
- 15 **measuring device.** A weighing or measuring device used to conduct sales by a transient
- 16 vendor is exempt from this chapter.
- 17 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY REAL ESTATE AUCTIONS. The
- 18 legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2007-08 interim, the practices and laws
- 19 relating to the sale of real estate by auctioneers. The study must include a review of the sale of
- 20 multiple parcels of property at a single sale. The legislative council shall report its finding and
- 21 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 22 the sixty-first legislative assembly.
- 23 SECTION 10. GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM INITIATIVE REPORT TO
- 24 SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The public service commission shall provide a
- 25 report to the sixty-first legislative assembly regarding the status of the department's geographic
- 26 information system initiative.
- 27 SECTION 11. METROLOGY PROGRAM REPORT TO BUDGET SECTION. The
- 28 public service commission and facility management division shall develop a schedule for
- 29 metrology services to be conducted within the current metrology facility and when the facility
- 30 can be used for other functions during the 2007-09 biennium. The public service commission
- 31 and facility management division shall provide a report regarding the facility use agreement and

1 the future of the metrology laboratory to the office of management and budget and budget

2 section by July 1, 2008.

3 SECTION 12. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

4 SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The total general fund appropriation line item in

5 section 3 of this Act includes \$89,484 for the one-time funding items identified in this section.

6 This amount is not a part of the agency's base budget to be used in preparing the 2009-11

7 executive budget. The public service commission shall report to the appropriations committees

8 of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

9 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
