- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture
- 2 commissioner; to amend and reenact sections 4-01-21 and 19-18-04 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the salary of the agriculture commissioner and pesticide registration
- 4 fees; to provide for transfers; and to provide an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this
 7 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the agriculture

8 commissioner in section 3 of this Act as follows:

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that
agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, as follows:

21 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND

PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum
 of \$2,962,609, or so much of the sum as may be available, from the environment and rangeland
 protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various agriculture department
 programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
 SECTION 5. ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE INSPECTION FUND. The

estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$65,912, or so much of
the sum as may be available, from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund for the
purpose of defraying the expenses of regulating anhydrous ammonia storage facilities, for the
biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

1	SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income
2	line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$889,684, or so much of the sum as may
3	be necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying
4	the expenses of various agriculture department programs for the biennium beginning July 1,
5	2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
6	SECTION 7. TRANSFER. The commissioner shall transfer \$200,000 from the
7	environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund.
8	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	amended and reenacted as follows:
10	4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. The annual salary of the agriculture
11	commissioner is seventy-two seventy-eight thousand six five hundred sixty-nine ninety-nine
12	dollars through June 30, 2006 2008, and seventy-five eighty-one thousand five seven hundred
13	seventy-six forty-three dollars thereafter.
14	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 19-18-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
15	amended and reenacted as follows:
16	19-18-04. (Effective through June 30, 2007) Registration - Fees.
17	1. Any person before selling or offering for sale any pesticide for use within this state
18	shall file biennially with the commissioner an application for registration of the
19	pesticide. The application must:
20	a. Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.
21	b. Give the name and brand of each product to be registered.
22	c. Be accompanied by a current label of each product to be registered.
23	d. Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred fifty dollars for each
24	product to be registered. At the close of each calendar month, the
25	commissioner shall transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the
26	registrations. The state treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered
27	product to the general fund in the state treasury and the remainder of the
28	registration fee for each registered product to the environment and rangeland
29	protection fund.
30	e. Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet for each product to be
31	registered.

1	2.	The commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy,
2		toxicity, residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will
3		perform its intended function without unreasonable adverse effects on the
4		environment. If the commissioner finds that the application conforms to law, the
5		commissioner shall issue to the applicant a certificate of registration of the product.
6	3.	Each registration covers a designated two-year period beginning January first of
7		each even-numbered year and expiring December thirty-first of the following year.
8		A certificate of registration may not be issued for a term longer than two years, and
9		is not transferable from one person to another, or from the ownership to whom
10		issued to another ownership. A penalty of fifty percent of the license or registration
11		fee must be imposed if the license or certificate of registration is not applied for on
12		or before January thirty-first following the expiration date. Each product must go
13		through a two-year discontinuance period in order to clear all outstanding products
14		in the channel of trade.
15	4.	This section does not apply to a pesticide sold by a retail dealer if the registration
16		fee has been paid by the manufacturer, jobber, or any other person, as required by
17		this section.
18	(Eff	ective July 1, 2007) Registration - Fees. Any person before selling or offering for
19	sale any pe	sticide for use within this state shall file biennially with the commissioner an
20	20 application for registration of the pesticide. The application must:	
21	1.	Give the name and address of each manufacturer or distributor.
22	2.	Give the name and brand of each product to be registered.
23	3.	Be accompanied by a current label of each product to be registered.
24	4.	Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred dollars for each product to
25		be registered. At the close of each calendar month, the commissioner shall
26		transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the registrations. The state
27		treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered product to the general fund in
28		the state treasury and the remainder of the registration fee for each registered
29		product to the environment and rangeland protection fund.
30	5.	Be accompanied by a material safety data sheet for each product to be registered.

1 The commissioner may require an applicant or registrant to provide efficacy, toxicity, 2 residue, and any other data necessary to determine if the pesticide will perform its intended 3 function without unreasonable adverse effects on the environment. If the commissioner finds 4 that the application conforms to law, the commissioner shall issue to the applicant a certificate 5 of registration of the product. 6 Each registration covers a designated two year period beginning January first of each 7 even-numbered year and expiring December thirty-first of the following year. A certificate of 8 registration may not be issued for a term longer than two years, and is not transferable from 9 one person to another, or from the ownership to whom issued to another ownership.
