FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2009

Appropriations Committee

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture
- 2 commissioner; to amend and reenact sections 4-01-19, 4-01-21, and 4-37-02 of the North
- 3 Dakota Century Code, relating to pride of Dakota moneys, the salary of the agriculture
- 4 commissioner and the agriculture in the classroom council; to provide for transfers; to provide
- 5 for legislative intent; to provide an effective date; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this
 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the agriculture

20 SECTION 2. FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS OR ENHANCEMENTS INFORMATION. The

21 amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the

22 base funding level for the agriculture commissioner which are included in the appropriation in

23 section 3 of this Act as follows:

10 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 11 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 12 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 13 other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that 14 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, as follows: 15 Salaries and wages \$6,799,926

25 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND

PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum
 of \$3,142,109, or so much of the sum as may be available, from the environment and
 rangeland protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various agriculture
 department programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
 SECTION 5. ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE INSPECTION FUND. The

31 estimated income line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$65,912, or so much of

the sum as may be available, from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund for the
purpose of defraying the expenses of regulating anhydrous ammonia storage facilities, for the
biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income
line item in section 3 of this Act includes the sum of \$889,684, or so much of the sum as may
be necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying
the expenses of various agriculture department programs for the biennium beginning July 1,
2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

9 SECTION 7. INTENT - SALARY EQUITY. The sum of \$200,000 included in the
10 salaries and wages line item in section 3 of this Act is for salary equity increases, which must
11 be based on market.

SECTION 8. TRANSFER - APPROPRIATION. The office of management and budget
 shall transfer \$150,000 from the general fund to the environment and rangeland protection fund
 during the period beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

SECTION 9. TRANSFER - APPROPRIATION. The office of management and budget
shall transfer \$50,000 from the certification and training fund to the environment and rangeland
protection fund during the period beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

18 **SECTION 10. INTENT - EMERGENCY COMMISSION REQUEST.** The agriculture 19 commissioner may request from the emergency commission additional full-time equivalent 20 positions for the state meat inspection program if demand for the program increases sufficient 21 to require the positions during the period beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

SECTION 11. TRANSFER. The commissioner shall transfer \$200,000 from the
 environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund.

SECTION 12. WILDLIFE SERVICES - GAME AND FISH FUND. The sum of
 \$130,000 is appropriated to the agriculture commissioner from the game and fish fund for the
 payment of wildlife services for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and
 ending June 30, 2007.

SECTION 13. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO
SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The total general fund appropriation line item in
section 3 of this Act includes \$90,836 for the one-time funding items identified in this section.
This amount is not a part of the agency's base budget to be used in preparing the 2009-11

1 executive budget. The agriculture commissioner shall report to the appropriations committees

2 of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

3 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

5 **SECTION 14. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-01-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

4-01-19. Marketing bureau. The agriculture commissioner of this state shall establish
and maintain a marketing bureau for the purpose of gathering and disseminating statistical
information on agricultural marketing problems of the state and engaging in marketing services
of agricultural products. Any moneys received or generated by the pride of Dakota program
must be deposited in the general fund in the state treasury agriculture commissioner's
operating fund.

SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. The annual salary of the agriculture
commissioner is seventy-two seventy-eight thousand six five hundred sixty-nine ninety-nine
dollars through June 30, 2006 2008, and seventy-five eighty-one thousand five seven hundred
seventy-six forty-three dollars thereafter.

SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 4-37-02 of the North Dakota Century Code isamended and reenacted as follows:

4-37-02. Agriculture in the classroom council. An agriculture in the classroom
council is established.

231.The council consists of sixteen members to be appointed by the agriculture24commissioner. One member must be the agriculture commissioner or the25commissioner's designee, and one member must be the superintendent of public26instruction or the superintendent's designee the following members appointed by27the official or the governing body of the entity named:

- 28 a. <u>One individual appointed by the superintendent of public instruction;</u>
- 29 b. One individual appointed by the state board for career and technical
 30 education;
- 31 <u>c.</u> <u>One individual appointed by the North Dakota farm bureau;</u>

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1		<u>d.</u>	One individual appointed by the North Dakota farmers union;
2		<u>e.</u>	One individual appointed by the North Dakota future farmers of America;
3		<u>f.</u>	One individual appointed by the North Dakota ag coalition; and
4		<u>g.</u>	One individual appointed by the North Dakota state university extension
5			service.
6	<u>2.</u>	<u>In a</u>	addition to the individuals listed in subsection 1, the council also includes the
7		following members appointed by the official or the governing body of the entity	
8		named:	
9		<u>a.</u>	One individual appointed for a term of two years by the governor;
10		<u>b.</u>	One individual appointed for a term of two years by the agriculture
11			commissioner;
12		<u>C.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the superintendent of public
13			instruction;
14		<u>d.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the state board for career
15			and technical education;
16		<u>e.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the North Dakota farm
17			bureau;
18		<u>f.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the North Dakota farmers
19			union;
20		<u>g.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the North Dakota future
21			farmers of America;
22		<u>h.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the North Dakota
23			ag coalition; and
24		<u>i.</u>	One teacher appointed for a term of two years by the North Dakota state
25			university extension service.
26	<u>3.</u>	<u>An</u> y	member appointed under subsection 2 may serve no more than three
27		<u>con</u>	secutive terms.
28	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	e council shall provide for the election of a chairman from among its members

30	SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that		
31	the agriculture commissioner forward any moneys appropriated in this Act for the agriculture in		

- 1 the classroom program directly to the agriculture in the classroom council established in section
- 2 4-37-02.

3 SECTION 18. EMERGENCY. The sum of \$680,000 included in the less estimated 4 income line item in section 3 of this Act for wildlife services, the \$200,000 included in the 5 wildlife services line item in section 3 of this Act, and section 12 of this Act are declared to be

6 an emergency measure.
