- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state historical
- 2 society; to amend and reenact section 3 of Senate Bill No. 2341, as approved by the sixtieth
- 3 legislative assembly, relating to the heritage center expansion project; and to provide legislative
- 4 intent.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.** The amounts identified in this 7 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the state historical society 8 in section 3 of this Act as follows:

12 **SECTION 3.** APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 13 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 14 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 15 other income, to the state historical society for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that 16 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, as follows: 17 Salaries and wages \$7,172,657 18 2,123,911 Operating expenses 19 Capital assets 3,341,581 20 Grants 1,000,000 21 Cultural heritage grants 375,000 22 10,000 Snow angel project 23 Yellowstone-Missouri-Fort Union Commission 4,492 24 Total all funds \$14,027,641 25 Less estimated income 3,819,462 26 Total general fund appropriation \$10,208,179

SECTION 4. REVOLVING FUND - APPROPRIATION. All fees collected by the state
historical society and deposited in the revolving fund established pursuant to section 55-03-04
are appropriated to the state historical society for the purposes provided in chapter 55-03, for
the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

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1	SECTION 5. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND BEQUESTS - APPROPRIATION. All gifts,		
2	grants, devises, bequests, donations, and assignments received by the state historical society		
3	and deposited with the state treasurer pursuant to section 55-01-04 are appropriated to the		
4	state historical society for the purposes provided in section 55-01-04, for the biennium		
5	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.		
6	SECTION 6. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO		
7	SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The total general fund appropriation line item in		
8	section 3 of this Act includes \$1,628,000 and Senate Bill No. 2349 includes \$30,000 for the		
9	one-time funding items identified in this section. These amounts are not part of the agency's		
10	base budget to be used in preparing the 2009-11 executive budget. The state historical society		
11	shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of		
12	this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

20	SECTION 7. COLD WAR MISSILE SITES. The capital assets line item in section 3 of		
21	this Act includes \$250,000 from the lands and minerals trust fund, \$250,000 from federal funds,		
22	and \$200,000 from other funds available to the state historical society through fundraising		
23	efforts to acquire the missile alert facility oscar-zero located four and one-half miles north of		
24	Cooperstown, North Dakota, and the launch facility november-33 located two and one-half		
25	miles east of Cooperstown, North Dakota.		
26	SECTION 8. INTENT - MISSILE SITE OPERATING COSTS. It is the intent of the		
27	sixtieth legislative assembly that operating costs for the cold war era missile sites occurring		
28	after June 30, 2009, be funded by other funds.		
29	SECTION 9. INTENT - LINCOLN BICENTENNIAL. It is the intent of the sixtieth		
30	legislative assembly that any unexpended appropriations for the Lincoln bicentennial for the		
31	2007-09 biennium be returned to the general fund.		

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SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 3 of Senate Bill No. 2341, as approved by the
 sixtieth legislative assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows:
 SECTION 3. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - LANDS AND MINERALS TRUST
 FUND. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the lands and minerals trust fund the sum

5 of \$1,500,000 on a contingency basis to the office of management and budget for the planning

6 and design costs of the heritage center expansion project, for the biennium beginning July 1,

7 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. The appropriation is only available when the state historical

8 society certifies to the office of management and budget that \$1,500,000 of private other funds

9 has been received <u>or pledged</u> and is available for the project. The private funds must be spent

10 before the funds from the lands and minerals trust fund. The sum of \$1,500,000 of other funds

11 is appropriated to the state historical society for the heritage center expansion project, for the

12 biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
