Sixtieth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, March 15, 2007

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Pro Tem J. Lee presiding.

The prayer was offered by Reverend Larry J. Giese, First Lutheran Church, Mandan.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senators Grindberg, Taylor, and Urlacher.

A quorum was declared by the President Pro Tem.

MOTION

REMARKS OF SENATOR ERBELE

Madam President and fellow Senators: In recent days we have praised the efforts of several state champion athletic teams. Generally, we do this immediately after the championship event. However, I am almost a month behind in presenting to you for our congratulations a truly remarkable championship team. In fact, we have several teams to honor today. I delayed this announcement until today so that members of those teams could be with us in the chamber balcony.

The junior and senior classes from Napoleon High School are visiting the Capitol today, and among their members are the 2006 Napoleon Imperial 9-Man Football Champions, the 2007 Class B Wrestling Dual Champions, the Class B Wrestling Individual Champions, and the State Parlaimentary Procedure Team. These teams are not only from District 28, the district I represent, but also from Logan County, my home county.

State champion wrestling squads are nothing new for the Imperials and Coach Barry McCleary. In fact, this most recent 2007 championship makes it six state championships in a row. Six consecutive dual titles, now that is something that has never been done before by any class B school. What makes it even more unique is that in this age of sport team consolidations, the Napoleon Imperial wrestlers are still a stand-alone team with about 75 students in the high school.

The Imperials posted an impressive 219 points for the first place victory. From 160 pounds to 215 pounds, the Imperials swept the board, bringing home a record six individual state titles to match their sixth consecutive sweep of the tournament. The individual state title winners are:

At 160 pounds, Jordan Dewald with 180 career wins and a Class B Mr. Wrestler candidate, he picked up his third straight state championship.

Shannon Fettig finished the season with a 41-0 record as he picked up his second state championship.

Taylor Grunefelder picked up the state title at 189 pounds with a 42-1 season record.

Kriss McCleary, at 215 pounds, picked up his third straight title with a 42-1 season record.

Other state title winners were Kevin Bitz at 125 pounds and sophomore Evan Gross at 135 pounds.

Coach McCleary and his assistants, Norman Kleppe and Jeff Schneider, are to be commended for their dedication to the students of Napoleon. They have helped to build pride, strength, courage, and a sense of community and citizenship into their charges. They have created champions both on and off the mat.

Also, the community of Napoleon has another state championship to be proud of. These same players won the 9-man football championship last fall, finishing the season with a 12-0 record under the guidance of Dave Laber.

Finally, the school has excelled in academics as well. The Napoleon State Parliamentary Procedure Team, guided by Coach Brian Schneider, has won the state championship and finished fifth in the nation in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Congratulations to the wrestlers, football team, parliamentary procedure team, coaches, parents, and fans of these fine Napoleon Imperial teams. May you continue to be successful as you strive to do your best. Best wishes to you from the North Dakota Senate.
