BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-59-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

54-59-02. Information technology department - Responsibility - Public policy. The

9 network services planning, selection, and implementation for all state agencies, including

information technology department is established with the responsibility for all wide area

10 institutions under the control of the board of higher education, counties, cities, and school

11 districts in this state. With respect to a county, city, or school district, wide area network

12 services are those services necessary to transmit voice, data, or video outside the county, city,

13 or school district. In exercising its powers and duties, the department is responsible for

14 computer support services, host software development, statewide communications services,

15 standards for providing information to other state agencies and the public through the internet,

technology planning, process redesign, and quality assurance. The Except as provided in

section 54-59-05, the department may not exercise its powers and duties in a manner that

competes or otherwise interferes with the provision of telecommunications service to a private,

charitable, or nonprofit entity by a privately or cooperatively owned telecommunications

20 company.

- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 13 of section 54-59-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 13. May provide wide area network services to a state agency, city, county, school district, or other political subdivision of this state. The information technology
