- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 15.1-06-06.1 and 15.1-06-06.2 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to school approval; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-02-11,
- 3 15.1-06-06, 15.1-13-18, 15.1-13-19, and 15.1-13-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 4 to school approval; to repeal sections 15.1-27-08 and 15.1-27-09 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to payment reductions for unaccredited schools; to provide an effective date; and
- 6 to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-02-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 15.1-02-11. Superintendent of public instruction Accreditation of schools -
- 11 Rules. The superintendent of public instruction may adopt rules governing the accreditation of
- 12 public and nonpublic schools. Any rule adopted under this section must incorporate measures
- 13 of student achievement and bear a direct relationship to improving student achievement.
- 14 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 15 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-06-06. Approval of public and nonpublic schools. Each public and nonpublic
- 17 school in this state offering elementary or secondary education to students must be approved
- 18 by the superintendent of public instruction. Except as otherwise provided by law, the
- 19 superintendent may not approve a school unless:
- 20 1. To be certified as an approved school by the superintendent of public instruction,
- 21 <u>the principal of each school shall submit to the superintendent of public instruction</u>
- 22 <u>a compliance report verifying that:</u>

12		<u>C.</u>	The	school meets all curricular requirements set forth in chapter 15.1-21;		
13		<u>d.</u>	The	school participates in and meets the requirements of a review process

15			<u>(1)</u>	Designed to improve student achievement through a continuous cycle		
16				of improvement; and		
17			<u>(2)</u>	Approved by the superintendent of public instruction;		
18		<u>e.</u>	The	school has been inspected by the state fire marshal or the state fire		
19			mars	shal's designee in accordance with section 15.1-06-09 or 15.1-06-10 and:		
20			<u>(1)</u>	Has no unremedied deficiency; or		
21			<u>(2)</u>	Has deficiencies that have been addressed in a plan of correction which		
22				was submitted to and approved by the state fire marshal or the state fire		
23				marshal's designee; and		
24		<u>f.</u>	<u>All in</u>	dividuals hired after July 31, 2011, and having unsupervised contact with		
25			stude	ents at the school, have:		
26			<u>(1)</u>	Undergone a criminal history background check requested by the		
27				employing school district or requested on behalf of the employing		
28				nonpublic school; or		
29			<u>(2)</u>	Undergone a criminal history background check in order to be licensed		
30				by the education standards and practices board or by any other state		
31				licensing board.		

1	<u>2.</u>	The compliance report required by subsection 1 must:			
2		<u>a.</u>	(1)	In the case of a public school, bear the signatures of the school	
3				principal, the superintendent of the school district, and the president of	
4				the school board; or	
5			<u>(2)</u>	In the case of a nonpublic school, bear the signatures of the school	
6				principal, the superintendent of the school if one is employed, and the	
7				president of the school's governing board; and	
8		<u>b.</u>	Be fil	ed with the superintendent of public instruction before five p.m. on the:	
9			<u>(1)</u>	Fifteenth day of September; or	
10			<u>(2)</u>	Date of the extension provided under subsection 5.	
11	<u>3.</u>	On t	the ter	oth day of September and on the fourteenth day of September, the	
12		supe	erinter	ndent of public instruction shall provide to each individual required to sign	
13		a co	mpliar	nce report under subsection 2, electronic notification that the compliance	
14		report is due on the fifteenth day of September.			
15	<u>4.</u>	<u>lf a s</u>	school	I's compliance report is not submitted at the time and in the manner	
16		requ	<u>uired b</u>	y subsection 2, the superintendent of public instruction shall designate	
17		the s	school	as unapproved. The superintendent of public instruction shall post a	
18		current list of all approved and unapproved schools on the department's website.			
19		<u>a.</u>	In the	e case of a public school, the superintendent of public instruction shall	
20			subtr	act from any state aid otherwise payable to the school district the	
21			prora	ted amount attributable to the students in attendance at the unapproved	
22			schoo	ol for each day that the school's compliance report is not on file with the	
23			supe	rintendent of public instruction.	
24		<u>b.</u>	In the	e case of a nonpublic school, the superintendent of public instruction shall	
25			notify	the parents of students enrolled in the school, either directly or through	
26			local	media outlets, that the school is unapproved and that the parents may	
27			there	fore be in violation of the state's compulsory attendance provisions.	
28	<u>5.</u>	If be	ecause	e of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school is unable to	
29		file its compliance report with the superintendent of public instruction before			
30		five p.m. on September fifteenth, the school principal may request one extension			
31		from the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public			

1		instruction shall grant the extension provided the request was rec	eived before			
2		five p.m. on September fifteenth. An extension under this section	terminates at			
3		five p.m. on September thirtieth.				
4	<u>6.</u>	Upon receipt of a school's compliance report, as required by this	section, the			
5		superintendent of public instruction shall certify the school as beir	g approved. A			
6		certification of approval under this subsection expires at the concl	usion of the			
7		regular school calendar.				
8	<u>7.</u>	If after being certified as approved a school experiences circumst	ances or events			
9		that would render the information contained in its compliance repo	ort inaccurate, the			
10		principal of the school shall notify the superintendent of public ins	ruction and work			
11		with the superintendent of public instruction to address the circum	stances or			
12		events at the earliest possible time.				
13	SEC	CTION 3. Section 15.1-06-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and				
14	enacted as	ollows:				
15	15.1-06-06.1. Compliance report - Impossibility of timely submission. The					
16	superintend	dent of public instruction may delay imposing the sanctions set forth in subsection 4				
17	of section 1	.1-06-06, until a time certain, if:				
18	<u>1.</u>	The required submission of a school's compliance report is an imp	oossibility due to:			
19		a. A natural disaster or act of God, including fire, earthquake, o	r tornado;			
20		b. An unauthorized or illegal act by a third party, including terro	<u>rism, sabotage,</u>			
21		riot, or vandalism;				
22		c. Death;				
23		d. A medical or personal emergency;				
24		e. Operational interruption, including electrical failure, and com	outer hardware or			
25		software failures; or				
26		f. Governmental action, including an emergency order or judici	al or law			
27		enforcement action; and				
28	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction determines that the repor	t, had it been			
29		submitted, would have demonstrated compliance with the approve	al requirements,			
30		in accordance with section 15.1-06-06.				

1	SEC	CTION 4. Section 15.1-06-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and					
2	enacted as follows:						
3	<u>15.</u> ′	15.1-06-06.2. Required records - Verification of information - Site visits.					
4	<u>1.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall notify each school and school district					
5		of the records that must be maintained in order to allow the superintendent of					
6		public instruction to verify the information contained in each compliance report.					
7		The superintendent of public instruction shall establish the length of time that the					
8		records must be maintained.					
9	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction may examine the records at any time and					
10		may conduct site visits to ensure the accuracy of information provided on the					
11		compliance report. The site visits may be scheduled or unscheduled.					
12	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
13	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:					
14	15.1	I-13-18. Teaching license - Presentation to business manager.					
15	<u>1.</u>	Before being employed to teach by a public school district, an individual shall					
16		present to the school district business manager a teaching license or other					
17		evidence of approval to teach issued by the board.					
18	<u>2.</u>	Before being employed to teach by a nonpublic school, an individual shall present					
19		to the school business manager a teaching license or other evidence of approval to					
20		teach issued by the board.					
21	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
22	amended and reenacted as follows:						
23	15.1	I-13-19. Teaching license - Expiration. Notwithstanding any other law, an					
24	individual w	whose if an individual's teaching license expires within the final six weeks of a school					
25	year may c	ontinue teaching under the expired license district's or nonpublic school's calendar,					
26	that individual's license is deemed to be extended and in effect until the completion of the						
27	school year <u>district's or nonpublic school's calendar</u> .						
28	SEC	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
29	amended a	amended and reenacted as follows:					
30	15.1	I-13-25. Teaching license - Action by board - Causes.					

1 1. After holding a public hearing in accordance with chapter 28-32, the board may 2 issue a written warning or reprimand to the individual, suspend the individual's 3 teaching license, or revoke the individual's teaching license if: 4 a. The individual obtained a license by means of fraud, misrepresentation, or 5 concealment of facts. 6 b. The board becomes aware of any fact or circumstance that would have 7 caused the board to deny licensure had the board known of the fact or 8 circumstance at the time of initial licensure. 9 The individual is incompetent, immoral, intemperate, or cruel. C. 10 d. The individual has been convicted of, has pled guilty to, or has pled 11 nolo contendere to an offense deemed by the board to have a direct bearing 12 upon an individual's ability to serve as a teacher or an administrator. 13 The board believes that the individual, having been convicted of an offense, e. 14 has not been sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1. f. The individual has refused to perform the duties of a teacher or an 15 16 administrator. 17 The individual has breached a contract with a school district or nonpublic g. 18 school. 19 h. The individual knowingly taught in violation of chapter 15.1-18. 20 i. The individual is an administrator in a school district administrator or a 21 nonpublic school and knowingly permitted another individual to teach in 22 violation of chapter 15.1-18. 23 i. The individual has violated this chapter or any rule adopted by the board. 24 Any action of the board taken under this section may be appealed to the district 25 court of Burleigh County in accordance with chapter 28-32. 26 SECTION 8. REPEAL. Sections 15.1-27-08 and 15.1-27-09 of the North Dakota 27 Century Code are repealed. 28 **SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2011. 29 **SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
