1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 23, subsection 13 of section

- 2 43-12.1-04, and section 43-12.1-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a nurse
- 3 aide registry, individuals exempt from regulation by the state board of nursing, and supervision
- 4 of nursing interventions; and to amend and reenact sections 43-12.1-03 and 43-12.1-16 of the
- 5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to individuals exempt from regulation by the state board of
- 6 nursing and delegation of medication administration.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 23 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 9 enacted as follows:

10 **Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the

- 11 <u>following definitions apply:</u>
- 12 <u>1.</u> <u>"Certified nurse aide" means an individual who is entered on the nurse aide</u>
- 13 registry and who has either successfully completed the requirements for the
- 14 department-approved training and competency evaluation program or has
- successfully completed the requirements of the department-approved competency
 evaluation program.
- 17 <u>2.</u> <u>"Department" means the state department of health.</u>
- <u>"Home health aide" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide</u>
 <u>registry and who is determined competent to render personal related services</u>
 under the supervision of a nurse in the home setting.
- 214."Medication assistant" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide22registry and who has successfully completed the requirements of a
- 23 department-approved medication assistant program for a specific employment

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1		setting. A medication assistant may be designated a medication assistant I or a		
2		medication assistant II.		
3	<u>5.</u>	"Nurse aide" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide registry and		
4		who has successfully completed the competency requirements identified by the		
5		department to provide nursing or nursing-related services to an individual in a		
6		health care facility or other setting.		
7	<u>6.</u>	"Nurse aide registry" means a listing of individuals who the department has		
8		determined have successfully completed the requirements established by the		
9		department to be designated as certified nurse aide, home health aide, nurse aide,		
10		or medication assistant.		
11	Nurse aide registry - Rules.			
12	<u>1.</u>	The department shall establish and administer a nurse aide registry. The registry		
13		must include disciplinary findings, including findings of abuse, neglect, or		
14		misappropriation of property, and must include the eligibility of the individual to be		
15		employed.		
16	<u>2.</u>	The health council shall adopt rules to regulate and register an individual who		
17		receives compensation for engaging in the provision of nursing or nursing-related		
18		services to an individual in a health care facility or other setting. The rules do not		
19		apply to a licensed health care professional practicing within the scope of that		
20		profession, an unlicensed assistive person under chapter 43-12.1, or a volunteer in		
21		the course of providing services without pay. In developing the rules, the health		
22		council shall consult with the state board of nursing and other key stakeholders.		
23	<u>3.</u>	The rules required under subsection 2 must include the regulation of certified nurse		
24		aides, home health aides, medication assistants, and nurse aides. For each		
25		category of regulated individuals, the rules must address:		
26		a. Nurse aide registry requirements;		
27		b. Training and competency requirements;		
28		c. Approval of training programs;		
29		d. Initial registration and renewal of registration of individuals who have met		
30		training and competency requirements;		

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1		<u>e.</u>	Reporting and investigation of complaints regarding individuals on the		
2			registry; and		
3		<u>f.</u>	A disciplinary process for a validated finding of abuse, neglect, or		
4			misappropriation of resident or client property and for other misconduct that		
5			has the potential to be harmful to a resident or client by an individual on the		
6			nurse aide registry.		
7	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	department may not charge fees under this chapter for initial registration or		
8		rene	ewal of registration of an individual's registration status on the nurse aide		
9		regi	stry, consistent with federal prohibition of charging an individual for initial		
10		<u>regi</u>	stration or renewal of registration as a certified nurse aide.		
11	<u>5.</u>	<u>The</u>	department may compile data regarding the reason given for an employer		
12		<u>term</u>	ninating an individual on the nurse aide registry.		
13	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
14	amended and reenacted as follows:				
15	43-12.1-03. License required - Title - Abbreviation. Any person who that provides				
16	nursing care to a resident of this state must hold a current license or registration issued by the				
17	board. It is unlawful for a person to practice nursing, offer to practice nursing, assist in the				
18	practice of nursing, or use any title, abbreviation, or designation to indicate that the person is				
19	practicing nursing or assisting in the practice of nursing in this state unless that person is				
20	currently licensed or registered under this chapter. A currently licensed advanced practice				
21	registered nurse or specialty practice registered nurse may use titles approved by the board; a				
22	currently licensed registered nurse may use the abbreviation "R.N."; a currently licensed				
23	practical nurse may use the abbreviation "L.P.N."; and an unlicensed assistive person with				
24	current registration may use the title identified by the employer. A person may not use the title				
25	"nurse" or be referred to as a "nurse" unless licensed by the board or exempt under section				
26	<u>43-12.1-04</u> .

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SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 3 **43-12.1-16. Delegation of medication administration.** A licensed nurse may
- 4 delegate medication administration to a person exempt under subsection subsections 9 and 13
- 5 of section 43-12.1-04.
- 6 **SECTION 5.** Section 43-12.1-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
- 7 enacted as follows:

8 43-12.1-16.1. Supervision of nursing interventions. A nurse may supervise and

- 9 delegate nursing interventions to an individual exempt under subsection 13 of section
- 10 <u>43-12.1-04.</u>
