- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 23-35.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the creation of regional public health networks; to provide an appropriation; and to
- 3 provide a contingent appropriation.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 23-35.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:
  - **23-35.1-01. Definitions.** For purposes of this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 9 <u>1. The definitions of section 23-35-01 apply; and</u>
- "Regional public health network" means a group of public health units that have
  entered a joint powers agreement or an existing lead multidistrict health unit
  identified in the emergency preparedness and response region which has been
  reviewed by the state health officer and has been verified as meeting the
  requirements of this chapter and chapter 54-40.3.
  - 23-35.1-02. Regional public health network Joint powers agreement Review by state health officer Criteria. Before a group of public health units may be designated as a regional public health network, the state health officer shall review the joint powers agreement the districts entered and verify that:
    - The geographical region covered by the regional public health network corresponds to one of the emergency preparedness and response regions established by the state department of health.
- 22 <u>2. The joint powers agreement requires that the participating public health units:</u>
  - a. Share various administrative functions and public health services in accordance with subsection 3;

1 23-35.1-04. Regional public health networks - Receipt and use of moneys. The 2 board of a regional public health network may receive and expend moneys for the provision of 3 administrative functions, public health services, and any other lawful activities. 4 23-35.1-05. Compensation - Reimbursement - Extraordinary service. The board of 5 a regional public health network may provide compensation and reimbursement to any board 6 member who, at the direction of the board, performs extraordinary service on behalf of the 7 board. For purposes of this section, "extraordinary service" means duties beyond those 8 reasonably expected of members of the board and includes travel to and attendance at national 9 meetings or conventions. 10 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FISCAL STIMULUS FUNDS. There is 11 appropriated out of any federal funds made available to the state under the federal American 12 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,200,000, or 13 so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of 14 providing funds to local public health units for providing immunization services statewide, 15 according to a funding formula established by the state health council in consultation with local 16 public health units, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending 17 June 30, 2011. 18 Any federal funds appropriated under this section are not a part of the agency's 2011-13 19 base budget. Any program expenditures made with these funds will not be replaced with state 20 funds after the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds are no longer 21 available. 22 SECTION 3. CONTINGENT GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION. If the federal funds 23 appropriated under section 2 of this Act are not available to provide the sum of \$1,200,000, 24 there is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise 25 appropriated, the sum of \$1,200,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state 26 department of health for the purpose of providing funds to local public health units for providing 27 immunization services statewide, according to a funding formula established by the state health 28 council in consultation with local public health units, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, 29 and ending June 30, 2011. The state department of health may only spend the general fund 30 moneys to the extent that federal funds are not available to provide the \$1,200,000

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- 1 General fund amounts appropriated under this section reflect one-time funding and are
- 2 not a part of the agency's base budget for the 2011-13 biennium.
- 3 **SECTION 4. EMERGENCY.** Section 2 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
- 4 measure.
