- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture
- 2 commissioner; to provide for a livestock health permit inspection program; to amend and
- 3 reenact section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the
- 4 agriculture commissioner; to provide for transfers; and to provide for a legislative council study.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows:

1 SECTION 2. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum 2 3 of \$3,529,556, or so much of the sum as may be available, from the environment and 4 rangeland protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various agriculture 5 department programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 6 SECTION 3. ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE INSPECTION FUND. The 7 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$40,000, or so much of 8 the sum as may be available, from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund for the 9 purpose of defraying the expenses of regulating anhydrous ammonia storage facilities, for the 10 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 11 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income 12 line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$768,800, or so much of the sum as may 13 be necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying 14 the expenses of various agriculture department programs for the biennium beginning July 1, 15 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 16 SECTION 5. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO 17 SIXTY-SECOND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time 18 funding items approved by the sixtieth legislative assembly for the 2007-09 biennium and the 19 2009-11 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act: 20 One-Time Funding Description 2007-09 2009-11 21 Animal tracking database \$90,836 \$0 22 \$0 Total general fund \$90,836 23 The 2009-11 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 24 2011-13 biennium. The agriculture commissioner shall report to the appropriations committees 25 of the sixty-second legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium 26 beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 27 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - WILDLIFE SERVICES. During the 28 2009-10 interim, the legislative council shall consider studying the cooperative agreement 29 between the agriculture commissioner and the United States department of agriculture wildlife 30 services program. The study, if conducted, must include a review of current program funding 31 sources and a review of wildlife damage control programs in other states, including South

- Dakota. The legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-second legislative
- 3 assembly.
- 4 SECTION 7. LIVESTOCK HEALTH PERMIT INSPECTION PROGRAM. The
- 5 agriculture commissioner shall, within the commissioner's 2009-11 biennium appropriation
- 6 approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly, initiate and implement a program to provide for
- 7 health permit inspections on livestock entering the state for the biennium beginning July 1,
- 8 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. As part of the program, the commissioner shall provide
- 9 public information on the results of the livestock health permit inspections.
- SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 11 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 **4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner.** The annual salary of the agriculture
- 13 commissioner is seventy-eight eighty-five thousand five eight hundred ninety-nine thirty dollars
- 14 through June 30, 2008 2010, and eighty one ninety thousand seven one hundred forty three
- 15 twenty-two dollars thereafter.
