## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1009

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture

2 commissioner; to provide for a livestock health permit inspection program; to amend and

3 reenact sections 4-01-19 and 4-01-21 and subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 19-18-04 of

4 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to marketing program revenue, the salary of the

5 agriculture commissioner, and pesticide registration fees; to provide for a legislative council

6 study; and to declare an emergency.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 9 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that 12 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows:

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$130,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of employing a department transition support position, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2011. The agriculture commissioner is authorized one full-time equivalent position for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending December 31, 2010. The funding provided in this section is considered one-time funding.

10 SECTION 3. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND

PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum
of \$3,708,578, or so much of the sum as may be available, from the environment and
rangeland protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various agriculture

14 department programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

15 SECTION 4. ANHYDROUS AMMONIA STORAGE INSPECTION FUND. The 16 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$40,000, or so much of 17 the sum as may be available, from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund for the 18 purpose of defraying the expenses of regulating anhydrous ammonia storage facilities, for the 19 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

20 SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income 21 line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$968,800, or so much of the sum as may 22 be necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying 23 the expenses of various agriculture department programs for the biennium beginning July 1, 24 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

SECTION 6. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO
 SIXTY-SECOND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time
 funding items approved by the sixtieth legislative assembly for the 2007-09 biennium and the
 2009-11 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

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The 2009-11 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
2011-13 biennium. The agriculture commissioner shall report to the appropriations committees
of the sixty-second legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium
beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

5 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - WILDLIFE SERVICES. During the 6 2009-10 interim, the legislative council shall consider studying the cooperative agreement 7 between the agriculture commissioner and the United States department of agriculture wildlife 8 services program. The study, if conducted, must include a review of current program funding 9 sources and a review of wildlife damage control programs in other states, including South 10 Dakota. The legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with 11 any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-second legislative 12 assembly.

SECTION 8. LIVESTOCK HEALTH PERMIT INSPECTION PROGRAM. The state
board of animal health shall increase the number of health permit inspections on livestock
entering the state for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. As part
of the program, the board shall provide public information on the results of the livestock health
permit inspections.

SECTION 9. OFFICE SPACE LEASE FUNDING - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL.
 The operating expenses line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$120,000 from the
 general fund which the agriculture commissioner may use to lease additional office space for
 department purposes, subject to budget section approval.

22 SECTION 10. PROJECT SAFE SEND - 2009 FLOOD PESTICIDE CLEANUP. The 23 operating expenses line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$40,000 from the 24 general fund which the agriculture commissioner shall use for the collection of damaged 25 pesticides resulting from 2009 flooding under the project safe send program for the period 26 beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2011.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

4-01-19. Marketing bureau. The agriculture commissioner shall establish and
maintain a marketing bureau for the purpose of gathering and disseminating statistical
information on agricultural marketing problems of the state and engaging in marketing services

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1	of agricultural products. Any moneys received or generated by the pride of Dakota program
2	must be deposited in the general agriculture department operating fund in the state treasury.
3	SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended and reenacted as follows:
5	4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. The annual salary of the agriculture
6	commissioner is seventy-cight eighty-five thousand five eight hundred ninety-nine thirty dollars
7	through June 30, <del>2008</del> <u>2010</u> , and <del>eighty-one</del> <u>ninety</u> thousand <del>seven</del> <u>one</u> hundred <del>forty-three</del>
8	twenty-two dollars thereafter.
9	SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 19-18-04 of the
10	North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	d. Be accompanied by a registration fee of three hundred fifty dollars for each
12	product to be registered. At the close of each calendar month, the
13	commissioner shall transmit to the state treasurer all moneys received for the
14	registrations. The state treasurer shall credit fifty dollars for each registered
15	product to the general fund in the state treasury and the remainder of the
16	registration fee for each registered product to the environment and rangeland
17	protection fund.
18	SECTION 14. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION - EMERGENCY COMMISSION
19	APPROVAL. The agriculture commissioner may request from the emergency commission an
20	additional full-time equivalent position for the state meat inspection program if demand for the
21	program increases sufficient to require the position for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009,
22	and ending June 30, 2011.
23	SECTION 15. EMERGENCY. The sum of \$40,000 for project safe send included in the
24	operating expenses line item in section 1 and section 2 of this Act are declared to be an
25	emergency measure.
