- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services school for the blind,
- 3 and the state library; to provide an appropriation; to provide for the distribution of funding for
- 4 gifted and talented programs and other grants; to provide a contingent appropriation; to create
- 5 and enact a new section to chapter 57-64 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to mill
- 6 levy reduction grants; to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century
- 7 Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of public instruction; and to declare an
- 8 emergency.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows:

- 10 blind vision services shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-second
- 11 legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1,
- 12 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

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13 SECTION 3. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - TRANSFERS - SCHOOL FOR THE

DEAF. The school for the deaf is authorized to transfer from the deferred maintenance line to the capital assets line, contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act, amounts necessary to address extraordinary repair needs. Any amounts transferred must be reported to the director of the office of management and budget.

18 SECTION 4. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - TRANSFERS - SCHOOL FOR THE

- **BLIND VISION SERVICES.** The school for the blind vision services is authorized to transfer from the deferred maintenance line to the capital assets line, contained in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, amounts necessary to address extraordinary repair needs. Any amounts transferred must be reported to the director of the office of management and budget.
- **SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other income the sum of \$20,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for grants for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2009.
- **SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION TUITION APPORTIONMENT.** The sum of \$86,300,000, included in the grants state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the

department of public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

SECTION 7. STATE SCHOOL AID AND SPECIAL EDUCATION CONTRACTS

EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may expend funds included in the grants - state school aid and grants - special education contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that were due in the 2007-09 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2009.

SECTION 8. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION.

The sum of \$400,000, included in the grants - state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and special education units. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

SECTION 9. MENTORSHIP GRANT PROGRAM - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The grants - other grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,300,000 from the general fund for a mentorship grant program. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide this funding to the education standards and practices board, which shall administer the program. The education standards and practices board is authorized to hire a mentoring coordinator to oversee and evaluate the program and to develop and support an advisory committee to assist in program oversight. The education standards and practices board shall select and train mentor teachers who shall provide support to increase instructional skills of protege teachers. Protege teachers must be in their first year of service as an elementary or secondary teacher. Funding may be used to pay for staff, training, evaluation costs, stipends to

participating mentors and proteges, as well as other costs determined necessary by the
 education standards and practices board for the administration of the program.

SECTION 10. INSTRUCTIONAL COACHING PILOT PROJECT - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The grants - other grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$500,000 from the general fund for an instructional coaching pilot project. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide this funding to no less than three pilot programs of instructional coaching during the 2010-11 school year. State funds must be matched on a one-to-one basis by grant recipients. The superintendent of public instruction shall develop grant criteria to award grants to multidistrict or single district pilot programs to employ instructional coaches in school districts. Criteria may include the employment of highly qualified instructional coaches, teacher involvement, and methods employed to evaluate program effectiveness.

SECTION 11. INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account.

SECTION 12. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,300,000 for aid to public libraries, of which no more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

SECTION 13. FEES DEPOSITED IN VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.

SECTION 14. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - SCHOOL DISTRICT - DEFERRED MAINTENANCE AND PHYSICAL PLANT IMPROVEMENT GRANTS.

There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of awarding to eligible school districts for deferred maintenance and physical plant improvement grants, in accordance with provisions enacted by the sixty-first

1 legislative assembly, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2 2011. 3 2. If the office of management and budget determines by July 31, 2010, that the 4 June 30, 2011, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than 5 \$30,000,000 in excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and 6 budget at the conclusion of the 2009 legislative session, the superintendent of 7 public instruction shall forward to each eligible school district: 8 Twenty thousand dollars; plus 9 The school district's pro rata share of the remaining appropriation, calculated b. 10 by using the latest available average daily membership of each school district. 11 3. If the general fund balance requirements of subsection 2 are not met and if the 12 office of management and budget determines by April 30, 2011, that the June 30, 13 2011, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than \$30,000,000 in 14 excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and budget at the 15 conclusion of the 2009 legislative session, the superintendent of public instruction 16 shall forward to each eligible school district: 17 Twenty thousand dollars; plus a. 18 b. The school district's pro rata share of the remaining appropriation, calculated 19 by using the latest available average daily membership of each school district. 20 **SECTION 15. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 **15.1-02-02. Salary.** The annual salary of the superintendent of public instruction is 23 eighty-seven ninety-five thousand one hundred three sixteen dollars through June 30, 2008 24 2010, and ninety ninety-nine thousand five eight hundred eighty seven seventy-two dollars 25 thereafter. 26 SECTION 16. A new section to chapter 57-64 of the North Dakota Century Code is 27 created and enacted as follows: 28 Continuing appropriation from permanent oil tax trust fund - Mill levy reduction 29 grants. Moneys available in the permanent oil tax trust fund, not otherwise appropriated, are

appropriated to the superintendent of public instruction as a standing and continuing

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- 1 appropriation for the distribution of mill levy reduction grants to school districts pursuant to this
- 2 <u>chapter, distributed as follows:</u>
- 1. The superintendent of public instruction shall estimate the total mill levy reduction
 grant to which a school district is entitled each year.
 - 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall report to each qualifying school district by July fifteenth of each year the anticipated mill levy reduction grant in dollars available to that school district during the upcoming school year.
 - 3. By December first, January first, February first, and March first of each school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall forward to each qualifying school district installments equal to twenty-five percent of the total mill levy reduction grant the district is eligible to receive during that school year.
- 12 **SECTION 17. EMERGENCY.** Section 5 of this Act is declared to be an emergency 13 measure.
