- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 human services; and to provide an exemption; to provide legislative intent; and to amend and
- 3 reenact section 50-29-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility for the
- 4 <u>children's health insurance program</u>.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the department of human services for the purpose of defraying the expenses of
its various divisions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as
follows:

The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
2013-15 biennium. The department of human services shall report to the appropriations
committees of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the
biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

7 SECTION 3. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXCEPTION - AUTHORIZATION. Notwithstanding 8 section 54-16-04, the department of human services may transfer appropriation authority 9 between line items within each subdivision of section 1 of this Act and between subdivisions 10 within section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 11 The department shall notify the office of management and budget of any transfer made 12 pursuant to this section. The department shall report to the budget section after June 30, 2012, 13 any transfers made in excess of \$50,000 and to the appropriations committees of the sixty-third 14 legislative assembly regarding any transfers made pursuant to this section.

SECTION 4. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the replacement of the medicaid management information system in chapter 50 of the 2007 Session Laws is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation approved under section 54-44.1-11 for continuation into the 2009-11 biennium are available for the completion of the medicaid management information system project during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 5. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated to the department of human services, as contained in subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of section 1 of chapter 12 of the 2009 Session Laws is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended general fund dollars from this appropriation are available for the purpose of funding medical assistance grants during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 6. OFFICE SPACE LEASE LIMITATION. The department of human services
may not expend more than twelve dollars and fifty cents per square foot per year for leasing
office space in the prairie hills plaza in Bismarck for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and
ending June 30, 2013.

30 SECTION 7. SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENTS - DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
 31 SERVICE PROVIDER SALARY AND BENEFIT INCREASES. The funding appropriated in

10	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 50-29-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
11	amended and reenacted as follows:
