- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 human services; to provide an exemption; to provide legislative intent; and to amend and
- 3 reenact section 50-29-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility for the
- 4 children's health insurance program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 9 other income, to the department of human services for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 10 its various divisions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as 11 follows:

27	2013-15 biennium. The department of human services shall report to the appropriations				
28	committees of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the				
29	biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.				
30	SECTION 3. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXCEPTION - AUTHORIZATION. Notwithstanding				
31	section 54-16-04, the department of human services may transfer appropriation authority				

- 1 between line items within each subdivision of section 1 of this Act and between subdivisions
- within section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
- 3 The department shall notify the office of management and budget of any transfer made
- 4 pursuant to this section. The department shall report to the budget section after June 30, 2012,
- 5 any transfers made in excess of \$50,000 and to the appropriations committees of the sixty-third
- 6 legislative assembly regarding any transfers made pursuant to this section.
- 7 **SECTION 4. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated for the replacement of the medicaid
- 8 management information system in chapter 50 of the 2007 Session Laws is not subject to the
- 9 provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation approved under
- section 54-44.1-11 for continuation into the 2009-11 biennium are available for the completion of
- 11 the medicaid management information system project during the biennium beginning July 1,
- 12 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
- 13 **SECTION 5. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated to the department of human services,
- 14 as contained in subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of section 1 of chapter 12 of the 2009 Session Laws is
- not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended general fund dollars from
- 16 this appropriation are available for the purpose of funding medical assistance grants during the
- 17 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
- 18 **SECTION 6. OFFICE SPACE LEASE LIMITATION.** The department of human services
- may not expend more than twelve dollars and fifty cents per square foot per year for leasing
- office space in the prairie hills plaza in Bismarck for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and
- 21 ending June 30, 2013.
- 22 SECTION 7. SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENTS DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
- 23 **SERVICE PROVIDER SALARY AND BENEFIT INCREASES.** The funding appropriated in
- 24 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$11,364,049, of which \$5,021,489 is from the
- 25 general fund and \$6,342,560 is from federal funds, for providing supplemental payments to
- 26 developmental disabilities service providers to allow for a salary and benefit increase for
- employees beginning July 1, 2011.
- 28 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS. It is the
- 29 intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that the department of human services only fill
- 30 the seven new full-time equivalent positions authorized by the legislative assembly for the

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2011-13 biennium relating to implementing federal health care reform after receiving applicable 2 rules from the federal department of health and human services. 3 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 50-29-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 amended and reenacted as follows: 5 50-29-04. Plan requirements. 6 The plan: 7 1. Must be provided through private contracts with insurance carriers; 8 2. Must allow conversion to another health insurance policy; 9 3. Must be based on an actuarial equivalent of a benchmark plan; 10 4. Must incorporate every state-required waiver approved by the federal government; 11 5. Must include community-based eligibility outreach services; and 12 6. Must provide: 13 A net income eligibility limit of one hundred sixtyseventy-five percent of the 14 poverty line: 15 b. A copayment requirement for each pharmaceutical prescription and for each 16 emergency room visit; 17 A deductible for each inpatient hospital visit; C. 18 d. Coverage for: 19 (1) Inpatient hospital, medical, and surgical services; 20 (2) Outpatient hospital and medical services; 21 (3) Psychiatric and substance abuse services; 22 (4) Prescription medications; 23 (5) Preventive screening services; 24 (6) Preventive dental and vision services; and 25 (7) Prenatal services; and 26 A coverage effective date that is the first day of the month, following the date of 27 application and determination of eligibility.
