FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1012

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 transportation; to provide appropriations to the state treasurer for transportation funding

3 distributions; to repeal section 2 of chapter 573 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating to

4 highway-rail grade safety projects; to provide for transfers; to provide for borrowing authority; to

5 provide an exemption; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare an

6 emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the department of transportation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 12 the department of transportation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 13 2013, as follows:

3 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

SIXTY-THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding
items approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly for the 2009-11 biennium and the 2011-13

The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for the 2013-15
biennium. The department of transportation shall report to the appropriations committees of the
sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of the one-time funding for the biennium beginning
July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

19 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - HIGHWAY-RAIL GRADE CROSSING

20 **SAFETY PROJECTS.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the highway-rail grade 21 crossing safety fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,431,000, or 22 so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of transportation for the funding of 23 grants for highway-rail grade crossing safety projects, including grants for the reduction of 24 associated special assessments, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 25 2013. On June 30, 2013, the state treasurer shall transfer any unexpended and unobligated 26 balance in the highway-rail grade safety projects fund to the highway tax distribution fund. 27 Up to \$1,201,000 of funds provided under this section may be used by the department of 28 transportation for highway-rail grade crossing safety projects approved by the department and 29 for which funding was obligated during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending

30 June 30, 2011.

- 1 Up to \$230,000 of funds provided under this section may be used by the department of 2 transportation for additional highway-rail grade crossing safety project grants subject to the 3 following requirements: 4 1. A political subdivision seeking a grant shall file an application with the department of 5 transportation. 6 2. A political subdivision grant applicant shall provide ten percent matching funds for the 7 project costs but no local matching funds are required for a highway-rail grade 8 crossing on a state highway. 9 3. Grant funds may be allocated for development of railroad quiet zones, installation or
- 10 upgrading of active warning devices, resurfacing crossings, building of grade 11 separations, and other costs associated with these improvements.
- 12 4. An applicant for grant approval for development of a railroad quiet zone shall provide 13 the department of transportation a copy of the notice of intent filed with the federal 14 railroad administration regarding establishment of a proposed guiet zone and copies of 15 any subsequent filings with or orders from the federal railroad administration relating to 16 the notice of intent.
- 17 5. Grants provided to a city may not exceed a cumulative amount of \$80,000.

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SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - BORROWING AUTHORITY - ADDITIONAL

19 **EMERGENCY RELIEF PROGRAM.** The department of transportation may borrow the sum of 20 \$120,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the Bank of North Dakota for 21 the purpose of providing funding for emergency relief projects on the state highway system, for 22 the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2013. Any funding 23 borrowed from the Bank of North Dakota under this section is appropriated to the department of 24 transportation for emergency relief projects on the state highway system. Funding appropriated 25 under this section is considered one-time funding and is not to be considered a part of the 26 department's 2013-15 base budget request. Any federal funding received for projects receiving 27 funding under this section must be used to repay the loan from the Bank of North Dakota. 28 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - 2009-11 BIENNIUM 29 **TRANSPORTATION FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in

30 the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$35,000,000, or

31 so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of providing

1 transportation funding distributions, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act

2 and ending June 30, 2011. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time

funding item. The state treasurer shall distribute the funds provided under this section prior to
June 30, 2011, as follows:

- Eighty percent to non-oil-producing counties and cities pursuant to subsection 4 of
 section 54-27-19.
- 7 2. Twenty percent to counties and townships in non-oil-producing counties pursuant to
 8 section 54-27-19.1. Organized townships are not required to provide matching funds
 9 to receive distributions under this section.

10 For purposes of this section, a "non-oil-producing county" means a county that did not receive

an allocation of funding under section 57-51-15 during state fiscal year 2010 or a county that

received a total allocation under section 57-51-15 of less than \$500,000 for state fiscal year2010.

14 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - 2011-13 BIENNIUM

TRANSPORTATION FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$25,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of providing transportation funding distributions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item. The state treasurer shall distribute the funds provided under this section on April 1, 2012, as follows:

- Eighty percent to non-oil-producing counties and cities pursuant to subsection 4 of
 section 54-27-19.
- Twenty percent to counties and townships in non-oil-producing counties pursuant to
 section 54-27-19.1. Organized townships are not required to provide matching funds
 to receive distributions under this section.

For purposes of this section, a "non-oil-producing county" means a county that did not receive an allocation of funding under section 57-51-15 during state fiscal year 2011 or a county that received a total allocation under section 57-51-15 of less than \$500,000 for state fiscal year 2011.

30 SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - GENERAL FUND TO HIGHWAY FUND.

31 There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise

1 appropriated, the sum of \$370,600,000, which the office of management and budget shall

2 transfer to the highway fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30,

3 2013.

SECTION 8. LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. The director of the department of transportation
may transfer between the salaries and wages, operating expenses, capital assets, and grants
line items in section 1 of this Act when it is cost-effective for construction and maintenance of
highways. The department of transportation shall notify the office of management and budget of
any transfers made pursuant to this section.

9 **SECTION 9. REPEAL.** Section 2 of chapter 573 of the 2009 Session Laws is repealed.

10 SECTION 10. COUNTY AND TOWNSHIP ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROGRAM.

- The sum of \$142,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in
 the county and township road reconstruction program line item in section 1 of this Act,
 must be used to rehabilitate or reconstruct county and township paved and unpaved
 roads.
- a. Funding allocations to counties are to be made by the department of
- transportation based on the needs assessment study conducted by the upper
 great plains transportation institute, titled "Additional Road Investments Needed
 to Support Oil and Gas Production and Distribution in North Dakota", dated
 December 9, 2010.
- 20 b. Counties identified in the study are eligible for this funding.
- Each county requesting funding under this section for county or township roads shall
 submit the request in accordance with criteria developed by the department of
 transportation.
- a. The request shall include a proposed plan for funding projects that rehabilitate or
 reconstruct paved and unpaved roads within the county.
- b. The plan shall be based on the upper great plains transportation institute study,
 actual road conditions, and integration with state highway and other county road
 projects.
- 29 c. Funds shall not be used for routine maintenance.
- 30 3. The department of transportation, in consultation with the county, may approve the31 plan or approve the plan with amendments.

1	4.	The funding included in the county and township road reconstruction program line item	
2		in section 1 of this Act may be used for:	
3		a. Ninety percent of the cost of the approved paved roadway projects not to exceed	
4		the funding available for that county.	
5		b. Twenty-five percent of the cost of the approved unpaved roadway projects not to	
6		exceed the funding available for that county.	
7		c. Funding may be used for construction, engineering, and plan development costs.	
8	5.	Upon approval of the plan, the department of transportation shall transfer to the county	
9		the approved funding for engineering and plan development costs.	
10	6.	Upon execution of a construction contract by the county, the department of	
11		transportation shall transfer to the county the approved funding to be distributed for	
12		county and township road rehabilitation and reconstruction projects.	
13	7.	The recipient counties shall report to the department of transportation upon awarding	
14		of each contract and upon completion of each project in a manner prescribed by the	
15		department.	
16	8.	The funding included in the county and township road reconstruction line item in	
17		section 1 of this Act may be applied to engineering and design costs incurred on	
18		related projects as of January 1, 2011.	
19	SEC	TION 11. EXTRAORDINARY STATE HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE. The funding	
20	included	in the capital assets line item in section 1 of this Act relating to extraordinary state	
21	highway	maintenance may be applied to engineering and design costs incurred on related	
22	projects	as of January 1, 2011.	
23	SEC	TION 12. FARGO DISTRICT OFFICE LOCATION - EXEMPTION. The sum of	
24	\$800,00) included in the capital assets line item of section 1 of this Act is for the construction of	
25	an equipment storage facility at the Fargo district office location which may only be used		
26	pursuant to the provisions of this section.		
27	Notwithstanding sections 54-01-05.2 and 54-01-05.5, the department of transportation shall		
28	offer for sale the entire parcel of land, including buildings, owned by the department of		
29	transportation at the Fargo district office location which is at 503 38th street south in the city of		
30	Fargo. In consideration for the property, the buyer must provide the department of transportation		
31	with an alternative parcel of land in fee simple to be used as a new location for the Fargo district		

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1 office. The parcel of land must be located within the interstate storm gates of the cities of Fargo 2 and West Fargo, be of suitable size and condition for operations of the Fargo district office, and 3 be readily accessible to the interstate system. In consideration for the department of 4 transportation property, the buyer shall construct or otherwise provide the buildings necessary 5 for the operations of the Fargo district office. If requested, the director of the department of 6 transportation shall provide potential buyers with general land and building requirements 7 necessary for the operations of the Fargo district office. The director of the department of 8 transportation shall have the authority to determine whether the location and buildings 9 adequately address the operations needs of the Fargo district office. The property shall remain 10 open to buyers until May 1, 2012. The department of transportation may proceed with the 11 construction of the equipment storage building at the current Fargo district office location if an 12 offer is not accepted by the department of transportation by May 1, 2012. 13 SECTION 13. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - STATE AGENCY AIRPLANES. 14 During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the use of 15 state-owned airplanes. The study, if conducted, must include a review of airplanes owned by 16 state agencies, the justification for each airplane, the frequency of use of each airplane, options 17 for purchasing or leasing new airplanes, and the feasibility and desirability of requiring state 18 airplanes to be managed by state fleet services. The legislative management shall report its 19 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the 20 recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly. 21 SECTION 14. EMERGENCY. Funding of \$228,600,000 in the capital assets line item 22 relating to extraordinary state highway maintenance and \$142,000,000 in the county and

township road reconstruction line item in section 1 of this Act and sections 4, 5, 10, and 12 of

this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
