1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota 2 university system; to provide borrowing authority; to provide an exemption; to provide for 3 transfer of funds; to authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell bonds for 4 capital projects; to amend and reenact sections 15-10-08 and 15-70-04, subsection 3 of section 5 43-12.2-03, and subsection 3 of section 43-17.2-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating 6 to state board of higher education member compensation, eligibility for the medical personnel 7 loan repayment program, eligibility for the physician loan repayment program, and grants for 8 nonbeneficiary students enrolled in tribally controlled community colleges; to provide legislative 9 intent; to provide for reports; to provide for legislative management studies; and to declare an 10 emergency.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

12 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 13 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 14 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 15 other income, to the North Dakota university system and to the various entities and institutions 16 under the supervision of the state board of higher education for the purpose of defraying the 17 expenses of the North Dakota university system office and to the various entities, for the 18 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows: 19 Subdivision 1. 20 NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OFFICE 21 Adjustments or 22 Base Level **Enhancements** <u>Appropriation</u> 23 Capital assets \$12,014,048 \$190,721 \$12,204,769

## 1 SECTION 3. TRANSFER - PERMANENT OIL TAX TRUST FUND - 2009-11 BIENNIUM. 2 The office of management and budget shall transfer any unexpended funds appropriated from 3 the permanent oil tax trust fund in chapter 31 of the 2009 Session Laws to the appropriate 4 higher education institution's special fund at the end of the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, 5 and ending June 30, 2011. For the purposes of this section, "end of the biennium" means thirty 6 days after the close of the biennial period but prior to the cancellation of unexpended 7 appropriations under section 54-44.1-11. 8 SECTION 4. BORROWING AUTHORITY - WILLISTON STATE COLLEGE -9 WORKFORCE TRAINING BUILDING PROJECT. Williston state college may borrow the sum of 10 \$1,725,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the Bank of North Dakota for the 11 workforce training building project for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and 12 ending June 30, 2013. 13 **SECTION 5. CAPITAL ASSETS.** The sum of \$12,204,769, or so much of the sum as may 14 be necessary, included in the capital assets line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act. 15 must be used by the state board of higher education to satisfy outstanding bond obligations. 16 SECTION 6. EQUITY AND STUDENT AFFORDABILITY FUNDING POOL TRANSFERS. 17 The equity and student affordability line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the 18 sum of \$15,240,565 which must be transferred by the state board of higher education to 19 institutions under its control based on existing formulas for equity and student affordability 20 distributions. 21 SECTION 7. NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM AND UNIVERSITY OF NORTH 22 **DAKOTA JOINT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY BUILDING PROJECT - BUDGET SECTION** 23 REPORT. The capital assets line item in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum 24 of \$20,500,000 for the North Dakota university system and university of North Dakota joint 25 information technology building project. The state board of higher education may spend 26 additional funds on the project of up to \$5,000,000 that are made available from the university 27 of North Dakota, North Dakota state university, and North Dakota university system 2011-13 28 biennium information technology services funding resulting from one-time savings or 29 efficiencies. The North Dakota university system shall provide a report to the budget section of 30 the legislative management regarding any funds expended pursuant to this section.

1	SECTION 8. NORTH DAKOTA STATE UNIVERSITY - MINARD HALL - BUDGET
2	SECTION REPORT. North Dakota state university may use unspent funding from the
3	\$5,000,000 appropriation received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
4	June 30, 2009, and unspent funding from the \$13,000,000 appropriation received during the
5	biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, for the Minard hall project, for the
6	biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. North Dakota state university shall
7	report to the budget section regarding the status of the Minard hall project and may request
8	increased spending authorization from the budget section for the project.
9	SECTION 9. SYSTEM INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES. The sum of
10	\$36,006,667, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the system information
11	technology services line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used for the
12	benefit of the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher education, as
13	determined by the board. Funding allocations are to be made based on the North Dakota
14	university system information technology plan and technology priorities. Funds allocated
15	pursuant to this section must be used to support the system information technology services,
16	including the higher education computer network, the interactive video network, the on-line
17	Dakota information network, connectND, and other related technology initiatives as determined
18	by the board.
19	SECTION 10. STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND. Subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act
20	includes the sum of \$1,004,744, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the student
21	loan trust fund of which \$465,307 is for the professional student exchange program and
22	\$539,437 connectND campus solution positions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and
23	ending June 30, 2013.
24	SECTION 11. FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS - APPROPRIATION. All funds,
25	in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from federal, private, and other sources
26	for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative assembly has not indicated the intent to
27	reject, received by the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher
28	education are appropriated to those institutions and entities, for the biennium beginning July 1,
29	2011, and ending June 30, 2013. All additional funds received under the North
30	Dakota-Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and

- 1 ending June 30, 2013, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for 2 reimbursement to institutions under the control of the board. 3 **SECTION 12. TRANSFER AUTHORITY.** If, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, 4 and ending June 30, 2013, the state board of higher education determines that funds allocated 5 to operations in section 1 of this Act are needed for capital assets or extraordinary repairs, the 6 board may transfer funds from operations to capital assets. The board shall report any transfer 7 of funds under this section to the office of management and budget. 8 SECTION 13. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION ADJUSTMENTS. Notwithstanding 9 any other provisions of law, the state board of higher education may adjust full-time equivalent 10 positions as needed, subject to the availability of funds, for institutions and entities under its 11 control. The university system shall report any adjustments to the office of management and 12 budget before the submission of the 2013-15 biennium budget request. 13 SECTION 14. EDUCATION INCENTIVE PROGRAMS. The funding appropriated for 14 education incentive programs in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act may be allocated to 15 education incentive programs as determined by the state board of higher education, including 16 the reduction or elimination of specific programs, and the state board of higher education may 17 determine the appropriate number of years of program eligibility for each education incentive 18 program. 19 SECTION 15. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - PURPOSES - APPROPRIATION. 20 The state board of higher education, in accordance with chapter 15-55, may arrange for the 21 funding of projects authorized in this section, declared to be in the public interest, through the 22 issuance of self-liquidating, tax-exempt evidences of indebtedness under chapter 15-55, 23 beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2013. Evidences of 24
- indebtedness issued pursuant to this section are not a general obligation of the state of North
  Dakota. Any unexpended balance resulting from the proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness
  must be placed in a sinking fund to be used for the retirement of indebtedness. The evidences
  of indebtedness may be issued and the proceeds are appropriated, for the biennium beginning
  July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, for the purpose of financing the following capital
  projects:

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1 SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 43-17.2-03 of the North Dakota 2 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 3 A physician who receives loan repayment under this chapter: 4 Must be a graduate of an accredited four-year allopathic or osteopathic medical 5 school located in the United States, its possessions, territories, or Canada and 6 approved by the state board of medical examiners or by an accrediting body 7 approved by the board; 8 Must not have practiced full-time medicine in this state for more than one yearb. 9 before the date of the application; 10 Must have a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine in this state; <del>C.</del> 11 <del>d.</del>c. Shall submit an application to participate in the loan repayment program; and 12 <del>e.</del>d. Must have entered into an agreement with a selected community to provide 13 full-time medical services for a minimum of two years at the selected community 14 if the applicant receives a loan repayment program contract. 15 SECTION 20. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM 16 BUDGET REQUEST. It is the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that the state board 17 of higher education develop a budget request for the North Dakota university system for the 18 2013-15 biennium that does not include a funding component for student affordability to limit 19 student tuition increases or a funding component for equity distributions to institutions based on 20 a peer institution comparison. The budget request may be based on a funding method that 21 incorporates a tiered system of funding distributions based on institution type or other funding 22 method that addresses the needs of the North Dakota university system. 23 SECTION 21. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - ENROLLMENT REPORTING. It is the intent of the 24 sixty-second legislative assembly that North Dakota university system enrollment reports 25 detailing fall semester enrollment information only include data for full-time students that are 26 physically present on campus. 27 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - PROGRAM TUITION RATES -28 WORKFORCE NEEDS. During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall consider 29 studying programs offered by North Dakota university system institutions that address the 30 workforce needs of the state, including a review of the use of graduated tuition rates to increase

enrollment in programs that address workforce needs. The legislative management shall report

1 its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the 2 recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly. 3 SECTION 23. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - UNIVERSITY OF NORTH 4 DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH SCIENCES. During the 2011-12 interim, the 5 legislative management chairman shall consider appointing a separate committee to study the 6 ability of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences to meet the 7 health care needs of the state. The study, if conducted, must include a review of the health care 8 needs of the state, options to address the health care needs of the state, and the feasibility and 9 desirability of expanding the school of medicine and health sciences to meet the health care 10 needs of the state. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, 11 together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-third 12 legislative assembly. 13 SECTION 24. EMERGENCY. The capital assets and education incentive line items 14 contained in section 1 of this Act and sections 4 and 15 of this Act are declared to be an 15 emergency measure.
