- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state industrial
- 2 commission and the agencies under the management of the industrial commission; to provide
- 3 legislative intent; to provide for a legislative management study; to provide an appropriation; to
- 4 provide a contingent appropriation; to authorize transfers; to provide for budget section
- 5 approval; and to declare an emergency.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state industrial commission and agencies under its control for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state industrial commission and agencies under its control, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

1 the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium 2 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 3 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BOND PAYMENTS. The amount of \$25,389,733 4 included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in the grants - bond payments line item must be 5 paid from the following funding sources during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending 6 June 30, 2013: 7 North Dakota university system \$12,254,770 8 North Dakota university system - Energy conservation projects 929,789 9 Department of corrections and rehabilitation 1,337,752 10 Department of corrections and rehabilitation - Energy conservation projects 18,604 11 State department of health 672,898 12 Job service North Dakota 710,735 13 70,225 Adjutant general 14 Information technology department - ConnectND 5,406,666 15 Office of management and budget 665,143 16 765,704 Office of the attorney general 17 State historical society 1,392,069 18 Parks and recreation 73,613 19 Research and extension service 571,290 20 Veterans' home <u>520,475</u> 21 Total \$25,389,733 22 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - LAND PURCHASE. It is the intent of the 23 sixty-second legislative assembly that to the best of its ability the Bank of North Dakota ensure 24 that properties adjacent to Bank of North Dakota property northwest of west street are 25 developed for uses that are consistent with the mission and purpose of the Bank of North 26 Dakota. 27 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. During the 2011-12 interim, the 28 legislative management shall consider studying primacy in the administration of federal 29 environmental protection agency regulations. 30 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amount appropriated to the housing 31 finance agency in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act, there is appropriated any additional

1 income or unanticipated income from federal or other funds which may become available to the 2 agency for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 3 SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL. In addition to 4 the amount appropriated to the state industrial commission in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this 5 Act, there is appropriated, with the approval of the emergency commission, funds that may 6 become available to the commission from bonds authorized by law to be issued by the state 7 industrial commission for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 8 SECTION 8. CONTINGENT DEPARTMENT OF MINERAL RESOURCES FUNDING -9 PERMANENT OIL TAX TRUST FUND - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL. Of the 10 funds appropriated in the mineral resources contingency line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 11 of this Act, \$743,972 is from the permanent oil tax trust fund. If funds are required due to the 12 drilling rig count exceeding one hundred eighty for at least thirty consecutive days, the oil and 13 gas division may spend up to \$192,393 of these funds and hire one full-time equivalent position, 14 upon emergency commission approval, and further if funds are required due to the drilling rig 15 count exceeding one hundred ninety for at least thirty consecutive days, the oil and gas division 16 may spend up to an additional \$192,393 of these funds and hire one full-time equivalent 17 position, upon emergency commission approval. If funds are required due to the total number of 18 oil wells in the state exceeding nine thousand three hundred, the oil and gas division may spend 19 up to \$359,186 and hire two full-time equivalent positions, upon emergency commission 20 approval. 21 SECTION 9. TRANSFER. The sum of \$488,211, or so much of the sum as may be 22 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of 23 this Act, may be transferred from the entities within the control of the state industrial commission 24 to the industrial commission fund for administrative services rendered by the commission. 25 Transfers shall be made during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, 26 upon order of the commission. Transfers from the student loan trust must be made to the extent 27 permitted by sections 54-17-24 and 54-17-25. 28 **SECTION 10. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER.** The funds appropriated in subdivision 3 of 29 section 1 of this Act must be transferred by the Bank of North Dakota to the partnership in 30 assisting community expansion fund; the agriculture partnership in assisting community 31 expansion fund; the beginning farmer revolving loan fund; and the biofuels partnership in

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assisting community expansion fund. The Bank of North Dakota may not be construed to be a general fund agency because of the appropriation made by subsection 3 of section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 11. LIGNITE RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, AND MARKETING PROGRAM -**APPROPRIATION - LIGNITE MARKETING FEASIBILITY STUDY.** The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much of the amount as may be necessary, included in the grants and special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is appropriated from the lignite research fund for the purpose of contracting for an independent, nonmatching lignite marketing feasibility study or studies that determine those focused priority areas where near-term, market-driven projects, activities, or processes will generate matching private industry investment and have the most potential of preserving existing lignite production and industry jobs or that will lead to increased development of lignite and its products and create new lignite industry jobs and economic growth for the general welfare of this state. Moneys appropriated pursuant to this section may also be used for the purpose of contracting for nonmatching studies and activities in support of the lignite vision 21 program; for litigation that may be necessary to protect and promote the continued development of lignite resources; for nonmatching externality studies and activities in externality proceedings; or other marketing, environmental, or transmission activities that assist with marketing of lignite-based electricity and lignite-based byproducts. Moneys not needed for the purposes stated in this section are available to the commission for funding projects, processes, or activities under the lignite research, development, and marketing program.

SECTION 12. TRANSFER TO OIL AND GAS RESEARCH FUND FROM PERMANENT OIL TAX TRUST FUND - GRANTS - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL. During the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, the director of the office of management and budget shall transfer \$4,000,000 from the permanent oil tax trust fund to the oil and gas research fund for the oil and gas research program. The moneys may be transferred only if the industrial commission has awarded grants totaling \$4,000,000 from the oil and gas research fund during the 2011-13 biennium and upon approval by the industrial commission and budget section.

SECTION 13. CARBON DIOXIDE STORAGE FACILITY ADMINISTRATIVE FUND - USE OF FUNDING. The carbon dioxide storage facility administrative fund line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$532,000 from the general fund that the industrial commission

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- may deposit in its carbon dioxide storage facility administrative fund for the purpose of hiring
  one full-time equivalent position for up to three years until fee income is sufficient to provide
  funding for the administration of the provisions of chapter 38-22. The industrial commission shall
  use this funding to provide a timely response to the environmental protection agency's rules
  relating to carbon dioxide sequestration and develop a coordinated response from state
  agencies with the goal of the state of North Dakota having class VI primacy for carbon dioxide
  storage in North Dakota.

  SECTION 14. EMERGENCY. Section 1213 and the related funding included in
- 8 **SECTION 14. EMERGENCY.** Section <u>1213</u> and the related funding included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
