- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service
- 2 commission; to amend and reenact section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to the salary of public service commissioners; to provide for a legislative management
- 4 study; and to authorize a transfer.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

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1 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO 2 SIXTY-THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding 3 items approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly for the 2009-11 biennium and the 2011-13 4 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act: 5 One-Time Funding Description 2011-13 2009-11 6 Federal stimulus funds \$0 \$658,217 7 Total special funds \$0 \$658,217 8 The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 9 2013-15 biennium. The public service commission shall report to the appropriations committees 10 of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium 11 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 12 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 49-01-05. Salary of commissioners. 15 The annual salary of a commissioner is eighty-fiveninety-two thousand eight hundred 16 thirtytwenty-six dollars through June 30, 20102012, and ninetyninety-five thousand onesix 17 hundred twenty-twoeleven dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any commissioner 18 for any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and paid over by 19 the commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the general fund of the 20 state. 21 SECTION 4. TRANSFER AND REPAYMENT - BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING LOAN 22 **FUND.** The sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the 23 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, shall be transferred by the Bank of North 24 Dakota from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund to the public service commission to pay 25 for costs associated with a rail rate complaint case. Transfers shall be made during the 26 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, upon order of the commission. If 27 any amounts are spent pursuant to this section, the public service commission shall reimburse 28 the beginning farmer revolving loan fund using amounts available from damages or proceeds 29 received, net of legal fees, from a successful outcome of a rail rate complaint case. 30 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - PIPELINE SAFETY STUDY. During

the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying gas pipelines in the

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- 1 state focusing on safety concerns of gas utility distribution and transmission. The study must
- 2 include all pipeline activity and address the jurisdiction of pipelines in the state in consultation
- 3 with the public service commission, industrial commission, and North Dakota one call. The
- 4 legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any
- 5 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly.
