1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 16.1-01-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
2 relating to election offenses; and to provide a penalty.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-01-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **16.1-01-12. Election offenses - Penalty.**

7 It is unlawful for a person to:

8 1. Fraudulently alter another person's ballot or substitute one ballot for another or to
9 otherwise defraud a voter of that voter's vote.

10 2. Obstruct a qualified elector on the way to a polling place.

11 3. Vote or offer to vote more than once in any election.

12 4. Knowingly vote in the wrong election precinct or district.

13 5. Disobey the lawful command of an election officer as defined in chapter 16.1-05.

14 6. Knowingly exclude a qualified elector from voting or knowingly allow an unqualified
15 person to vote.

16 7. Knowingly vote when not qualified to do so.

17 8. Sign an initiative, referendum, recall, or any other election petition when not qualified
18 to do so.

19 ~~9. Sign a name other than that person's own name to an initiative, referendum, recall, or~~
20 ~~any other election petition.~~

21 ~~10.~~ Circulate an initiative, referendum, recall, or any other election petition not in its
22 entirety or circulate such a petition when unqualified to do so.

23 ~~11.~~ Pay or offer to pay any person, or receive payment or agree to receive payment, on a
24 basis related to the number of signatures obtained for circulating an initiative,

1 referendum, or recall petition. This subsection does not prohibit the payment of salary
2 and expenses for circulation of the petition on a basis not related to the number of
3 signatures obtained, as long as the circulators file their intent to remunerate prior to
4 submitting the petitions and, in the case of initiative and referendum petitions, fully
5 disclose all contributions received pursuant to chapter 16.1-08.1 to the secretary of
6 state upon submission of the petitions. The disclosure of contributions received under
7 this section does not affect the requirement to file a preelection report by persons
8 soliciting or accepting contributions for the purpose of aiding or opposing the
9 circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure
10 placed upon a statewide ballot by action of the legislative assembly under chapter
11 16.1-08.1.

12 ~~42.11.~~ Willfully fail to perform any duty of an election officer after having accepted the
13 responsibility of being an election officer by taking the oath as prescribed in this title.

14 ~~43.12.~~ Willfully violate any rule adopted by the secretary of state pursuant to this title.

15 ~~44.13.~~ Willfully make any false canvass of votes, or make, sign, publish, or deliver any false
16 return of an election, knowing the same to be false, or willfully deface, destroy, or
17 conceal any statement or certificate entrusted to the person's care.

18 ~~45.14.~~ Destroy ballots, ballot boxes, election lists, or other election supplies except as
19 provided by law.

20 15. Sign a name other than that person's own name to an initiative, referendum, recall, or
21 any other election petition.

22 A violation of subsections 1 through ~~44~~13 is a class A misdemeanor. Any signature obtained
23 in violation of subsection ~~44~~10 is void and may not be counted. A violation of subsection ~~45~~14
24 occurring after an election but before the final canvass, or during an election, is a class C felony,
25 and in other cases is a class A misdemeanor. A violation of subsection 15 is a class C felony.

26 Every act which by this chapter is made criminal when committed with reference to the
27 election of a candidate is equally criminal when committed with reference to the determination
28 of a question submitted to qualified electors to be decided by votes cast at an election.
