- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact six new sections to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the provision of matching grants for the advancement of
- 3 postsecondary academics; to provide an appropriation; to provide for a legislative management
- 4 report; and to provide an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Advancement of academics - Matching grants - University of North Dakota and North

9 Dakota state university.

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- 1. a. During the period beginning July 1, 2013, and ending December 31, 2014, the
 state board of higher education shall award one dollar in matching grants for
 every two dollars raised by the institutional foundations of the university of North
 Dakota and North Dakota state university for projects dedicated exclusively to the
 advancement of academics.
- b. To be eligible for a matching grant, an institution must demonstrate that:
- 16 (1) <u>Its foundation has raised at least fifty thousand dollars in cash or monetary</u>
 17 <u>pledges for a qualifying project; and</u>
 - (2) The project has been approved by the grant review committee established in section 4 of this Act.
- 20 <u>c.</u> The board may award up to ten million dollars in matching grants to each
 21 <u>institution.</u>
- 2. a. If any available dollars have not been awarded by the board before January 1,
 23 2015, in accordance with subsection 1, either the university of North Dakota or
 24 North Dakota state university may apply for an additional matching grant.

1 SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 2 and enacted as follows: 3 **Grant review committee - Compensation.** 4 Each member of the grant review committee is entitled to receive compensation in the 5 amount of one hundred thirty-five dollars per day plus reimbursement for expenses as provided 6 by law for state officers if the member is attending meetings or performing duties directed by the 7 committee. The compensation provided for in this section may not be paid to any member of the 8 committee who receives a salary or other compensation as an employee or official of this state 9 if the individual is serving on the committee by virtue of the individual's state office or state 10 employment. 11 **SECTION 6.** A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 12 and enacted as follows: 13 Definition. 14 For purposes of this Act, projects dedicated to the advancement of enhanced academics 15 include investments in research, scholarship, technology, endowed chairs, and investments in 16 <u>educational infrastructure</u>, not to include new capital construction projects. 17 SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 18 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$30,000,000, or so much of 19 the sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of 20 providing matching grants for projects dedicated exclusively to the advancement of 21 postsecondary academics, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 22 SECTION 8. REPORT. Before October 1, 2014, the state board of higher education shall 23 provide a report to the legislative management regarding the number of matching grants that 24 were sought, the number that were awarded, and the manner in which the grants were used. 25 SECTION 9. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through June 30, 2015, and after that 26 date is ineffective.
