- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 27-20-10 and section
- 2 27-20-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to juveniles driving under the influence; to
- 3 amend and reenact subsection 7 of section 39-06.1-10, sections 39-06.1-11, 39-08-01,

4 39-08-01.2, 39-20-01, 39-20-03.1, 39-20-04, 39-20-04.1, and 39-20-05, subsection 6 of section

5 39-20-07, and section 39-20-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to chemical tests for

6 driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs; to provide for a legislative management study; to

7 provide a penalty; to provide an effective date; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 **SECTION 1.** A new subsection to section 27-20-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 10 created and enacted as follows:
- 11 If a child is subject to informal adjustment for a violation of section 39-08-01 or
- 12 equivalent ordinance, or if a child is found to have an alcohol concentration of at least
- 13 two one-hundredths of one percent by weight at the time of performance of a test
- 14 within two hours after driving or being in physical control of a motor vehicle, the
- 15 juvenile court may require the child to participate in the twenty-four seven sobriety
- 16 program under chapter 54-12 for up to nine months.
- 17 SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 27-20-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 18 created and enacted as follows:
- 19 If a child is adjudicated delinquent for a violation of section 39-08-01 or equivalent
- 20 ordinance, or if a child is found to have an alcohol concentration of at least two
- 21 <u>one-hundredths of one percent by weight at the time of performance of a test within</u>
- 22 <u>two hours after driving or being in physical control of a motor vehicle, the juvenile court</u>
- 23 may require the child to participate in the twenty-four seven sobriety program under
- 24 <u>chapter 54-12.</u>

1	SECTION	3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 39-06.1-10 of the North Dakota	
2	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
3	7. The	period of suspension imposed for a violation of section 39-08-01 or equivalent	
4	ordi	nance is:	
5	a.	Ninety-one days if the operator's record shows the person has not violated	
6		section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance within the fiveten years preceding the	
7		last violation.	
8	b.	One hundred eighty days if the operator's record shows the person has not	
9		violated section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance within fiveten years preceding	
10		the last violation and the violation was for an alcohol concentration of at least	
11		eighteen one-hundredths of one percent by weight.	
12	C.	Three hundred sixty-five days if the operator's record shows the person has once	
13		violated section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance within the fiveten years	
14		preceding the last violation.	
15	d.	Two years if the operator's record shows the person has at least once violated	
16		section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance within the fiveten years preceding the	
17		last violation and the violation was for an alcohol concentration of at least	
18		eighteen one-hundredths of one percent by weight.	
19	e.	Two years if the operator's record shows the person has at least twice violated	
20		section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance within the fiveten years preceding the	
21		last violation.	
22	f.	Three years if the operator's record shows the person has at least twice violated	
23		section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance within the fiveten years preceding the	
24		last violation and the violation is for an alcohol concentration of at least eighteen	
25		one-hundredths of one percent by weight.	
26	<u>g.</u>	An individual who has a temporary restricted driver's license with the restriction	
27		the individual participates in the twenty-four seven sobriety program under	
28		chapter 54-12 is not subject to the suspension periods under this subsection.	
29	SECTION	A 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
30	amended and	reenacted as follows:	

- **39-06.1-11.** Temporary restricted license Ignition interlock device.
- Except as provided under subsection 2, if the director has suspended a license under
 section 39-06.1-10 or has extended a suspension or revocation under section
 39-06-43, upon receiving written application from the offender affected, the director
 may for good cause issue a temporary restricted operator's license valid for the
 remainder of the suspension period after seven days of the suspension period have
 passed.
- 8 If the director has suspended a license under chapter 39-20, or after a violation of 2. 9 section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance, upon written application of the offender the 10 director may issue for good cause a temporary restricted license that takes effect after 11 thirty days of the suspension have been served after a first offense under section 12 39-08-01 or chapter 39-20, but if the offender is participating in the twenty-four seven 13 sobriety program under chapter 54-12, the director may issue a temporary restricted 14 license that takes effect after fifteen days of the suspension have been served. The 15 director may not issue a temporary restricted license to any offender whose operator's 16 license has been revoked under section 39-20-04 or suspended upon a second or 17 subsequent offense under section 39-08-01 or chapter 39-20, except that a temporary 18 restricted license may be issued in accordance with subsection 5 of this section if the 19 offender is participating in the twenty-four seven sobriety program under chapter 20 54-12, or for good cause if the offender has not committed an offense for a period of 21 two years before the date of the filing of a written application that must be 22 accompanied by a report from an appropriate licensed addiction treatment program or 23 if the offender is participating in the drug court program and has not committed an 24 offense for a period of three hundred sixty-five days before the date of the filing of a 25 written application that must be accompanied by a recommendation from the district 26 court. The director may conduct a hearing for the purposes of obtaining information, 27 reports, and evaluations from courts, law enforcement, and citizens to determine the 28 offender's conduct and driving behavior during the prerequisite period of time. The 29 director may also require that an ignition interlock device be installed in the offender's 30 vehicle.

1	3.	The director may not issue a temporary restricted license for a period of license
2		revocation or suspension imposed under subsection 5 of section 39-06-17 or section
3		39-06-31. A temporary restricted license may be issued for suspensions ordered under
4		subsection 7 of section 39-06-32 if it could have been issued had the suspension
5		resulted from in-state conduct.
6	4.	A restricted license issued under this section is solely for the use of a motor vehicle
7		during the licensee's normal working hours, or as provided under subsection 5 of this
8		section, and may contain any other restrictions authorized by section 39-06-17.
9		Violation of a restriction imposed according to this section is deemed a violation of
10		section 39-06-17.
11	5.	If an offender has been charged with, or convicted of, a second or subsequent
12		violation of section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance, or if the offender's license is
13		subject to suspension under chapter 39-20 and the offender's driver's license is not
14		subject to an unrelated suspension or revocation, the director shall issue a temporary
15		restricted driver's permitlicense to the offender only for the purpose of
16		participationupon the restriction the offender participate in the twenty-four seven
17		sobriety programupon under chapter 54-12. The offender shall submit an application
18		to the director for a temporary restricted license along with submission of proof of
19		financial responsibility and proof of participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety
20		program by the offender, in order to receive a temporary restricted license. If a court or
21		the parole board finds that an offender has violated a condition of the twenty-four-
22		seven sobriety program, the court or parole board may order the temporary restricted
23		driver's permit be revoked and take possession of the temporary restricted driver's-
24		permit. The court or the parole board shall send a copy of the order to the director who-
25		shall record the revocation of the temporary restricted driver's permit. Revocation of a
26		temporary restricted driver's permit for violation of a condition of the twenty-four seven
27		sobriety program does not preclude the offender's eligibility for a temporary restricted
28		driver's license under any other provisions of this section.
29	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-08-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
30	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:

1	39-0	8-01. Persons under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any other drugs or				
2	substan	ces not to operate vehicle - Penalty.				
3	1.	A person may not drive or be in actual physical control of any vehicle upon a highway				
4		or upon public or private areas to which the public has a right of access for vehicular				
5		use in this state if any of the following apply:				
6		a. That person has an alcohol concentration of at least eight one-hundredths of one				
7		percent by weight at the time of the performance of a chemical test within two				
8		hours after the driving or being in actual physical control of a vehicle.				
9		b. That person is under the influence of intoxicating liquor.				
10		c. That person is under the influence of any drug or substance or combination of				
11		drugs or substances to a degree which renders that person incapable of safely				
12		driving.				
13		d. That person is under the combined influence of alcohol and any other drugs or				
14		substances to a degree which renders that person incapable of safely driving.				
15		The fact that any person charged with violating this section is or has been legally				
16		entitled to use alcohol or other drugs or substances is not a defense against any				
17		charge for violating this section, unless a drug which predominately caused				
18		impairment was used only as directed or cautioned by a practitioner who legally				
19		prescribed or dispensed the drug to that person.				
20	2.	Unless as otherwise provided in section 39-08-01.2, an individual violating this section				
21		or equivalent ordinance is guilty of a class B misdemeanor for the first or second-				
22		offense in a five-year period, of a class A misdemeanor for a thirdsecond offense in a				
23		five-year <u>ten-year</u> period, of a class A misdemeanor for the fourth offense in a				
24		seven-year period, and of a class-C felony for a fifth or subsequentthird offense in a				
25		seven-yearten-year period, and a class C felony for any fourth or subsequent offense,				
26		regardless how long it has been since the previous offense. The minimum penalty for				
27		violating this section is as provided in subsection 4. The court shall take judicial notice				
28		of the fact that an offense would be a subsequent offense if indicated by the records of				
29		the director or may make a subsequent offense finding based on other evidence. If an				
30		individual has spent time in custody for any offense, the time spent in custody may not				
31		be included as part of any period of time under this section.				

1 Upon conviction of a second or subsequent offense within fiveten years under this 3. 2 section or equivalent ordinance, the court mustshall order the motor vehicle number 3 plates of all of the motor vehicles owned and operated by the offender at the time of 4 the offense to be impounded for the duration of the period of suspension or revocation 5 of the offender's driving privilege by the licensing authority. The impounded number 6 plates must be sent to the director who must retain them for the period of suspension 7 or revocation, subject to their disposition by the court. The court may make an 8 exception to this subsection, on an individual basis, to avoid undue hardship to an 9 individual who is completely dependent on the motor vehicle for the necessities of life, 10 including a family member of the convicted individual and a coowner of the motor 11 vehicle, but not includingor if the offender is participating in the twenty-four seven 12 sobriety program.

4. A person convicted of violating this section, or an equivalent ordinance, must be
sentenced in accordance with this subsection. For purposes of this subsection, unless
the context otherwise requires, "drug court program" means a district court-supervised
treatment program approved by the supreme court which combines judicial
supervision with alcohol and drug testing and chemical addiction treatment in a
licensed treatment program. The supreme court may adopt rules, including rules of
procedure, for drug courts and the drug court program.

- 20a.For a first offense, if the alcohol concentration is at least eight-hundredths of one21percent by weight but less than fifteen-hundredthstwenty-one-hundredths of one22percent by weight, the sentence must include a fine of at least five hundred23dollars and an order for an addiction evaluation by an appropriate licensed24addiction treatment program. If the alcohol concentration is at least
- 25 <u>fifteen-hundredthstwenty-one-hundredths of one percent by weight, or if the</u>
 26 <u>individual refused to submit to a chemical test, or a test required under section</u>
 27 <u>39-06.2-10.2, 39-20-01, or 39-20-14, the sentence must include bothat least ten</u>
- 28 days' imprisonment, of which forty-eight hours must be served consecutively; a
- 29 fine of at least twoseven hundred fifty dollars and; an order for addiction
- 30 evaluation by an appropriate licensed addiction treatment program: at least six

1		months' probation; and participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety program
2		under chapter 54-12 as a mandatory condition of probation.
3	b.	For a second offense within fiveten years, the sentence must include at least
4		five <u>sixty</u> days' imprisonment or placement in a minimum security facility , of which
5		forty-eight hours must be served consecutively, or thirty days' community service;
6		a fine of at least one thousand five hundred dollars; and an order for addiction
7		evaluation by an appropriate licensed addiction treatment program; and at least
8		twelve months' probation; and participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety
9		program under chapter 54-12 as a mandatory condition of probation.
10	С.	For a third offense within fiveten years, the sentence must include at least
11		sixtyone hundred eighty days' imprisonment or placement in a minimum security-
12		facility, of which forty-eight hours must be served consecutively; a fine of oneat
13		least two thousand dollars; and an order for addiction evaluation by an
14		appropriate licensed addiction treatment program: and at least twelve months'
15		probation; and participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety program under
16		chapter 54-12 as a mandatory condition of probation.
17	d.	For a fourth or subsequent offense within seven years, the sentence must include
18		at least one hundred eighty year and one days 'year and one day's imprisonment
19		or placement in a minimum security facility, of which forty-eight hours must be
20		served consecutively; a fine of oneat least three thousand dollars; and an order
21		for addiction evaluation by an appropriate licensed treatment program; at least
22		two years' probation; and participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety program
23		under chapter 54-12 as a mandatory condition of probation.
24	e.	The execution or imposition of sentence under this section may not be
25		suspended or deferred under subsection 3 or 4 of section 12.1-32-02 for an
26		offense subject to this section.
27	<u>f.</u>	If the offense is subject to subdivision a or bof this subsection, a municipal court
28		or district court may suspend a sentence under subsection 3 of section
29		12.1-32-02 if the alcohol concentration is at least eight-hundredths of one percent
30		by weight but less than fifteen-hundredthstwenty-one-hundredths of one percent
31		by weight. If the alcohol concentration is at least

1	fifteen-hundredthstwenty-one-hundredths of one percent by weight, or if the
2	individual refused to submit to a chemical test, or a test required under section
3	39-06.2-10.2, 39-20-01, or 39-20-14, a municipal court or district court may
4	suspend a sentence, except for four days one day's imprisonment on a day the
5	defendant is not scheduled for employment, under subsection 3 of section
6	12.1-32-02 on the condition that the defendant first undergo and complete an
7	evaluation for alcohol and substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation. If the
8	offense is subject to subdivision c or d<u>b</u> of this subsection , the district court may
9	suspend a sentence, except for ten days' imprisonment, under subsection 3 or 4-
10	of section 12.1-32-02 on the condition that the defendant first undergo and
11	complete an evaluation for alcohol and substance abuse treatment and
12	rehabilitation. If the offense is subject to subdivision c of this subsection, the
13	district court may suspend a sentence, except for sixty days' imprisonment, under
14	subsection 3 of section 12.1-32-02 on the condition that the defendant first
15	undergo and complete an evaluation for alcohol and substance abuse treatment
16	and rehabilitation. If the offense is subject to subdivision d of this subsection, the
17	district court may suspend a sentence, except for one year's imprisonment, under
18	subsection 3 of section 12.1-32-02 on the condition that the defendant first
19	undergo and complete an evaluation for alcohol and substance abuse treatment
20	and rehabilitation. If the defendant is found to be in need of alcohol and
21	substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation, the district court may order the
22	defendant placed under the supervision and management of the department of
23	corrections and rehabilitation and is subject to the conditions of probation under
24	section 12.1-32-07. The district court shall require the defendant to complete
25	alcohol and substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation under the direction of
26	the drug court program as a condition of probation in accordance with rules
27	adopted by the supreme court. If the district court finds that a defendant has
28	failed to undergo an evaluation or complete treatment or has violated any
29	condition of probation, the district court shall revoke the defendant's probation
30	and shall sentence the defendant in accordance with this subsection.

1	f.g.	If the court sentences an individual to the legal and physical custody of the
2		department of corrections and rehabilitation, the department may place the
3		defendant in an alcohol treatment program designated by the department. Upon
4		the individual's successful completion of the alcohol treatment program, the
5		department shall release the individual from imprisonment to serve the remainder
6		of the sentence of imprisonment on probation, which may include placement in
7		another facility or treatment program. If an individual is placed in another facility
8		or treatment program after release from imprisonment, the remainder of the
9		individual's sentence of imprisonment must be considered time spent in custody.
10		A court may not order the department to be responsible for the costs of treatment
11		in a private treatment facility.
12	<u>h.</u>	For purposes of this section, conviction of an offense under a law or ordinance of
13		another state which is equivalent to this section must be considered a prior
14		offense if such offense was committed within the time limitations specified in this
15		subsectionsection.
16	<u>i.</u>	An individual who operates a motor vehicle on a highway or on public or private
17		areas to which the public has a right of access for vehicular use in this state who
18		refuses to submit to a chemical test, or a test required under sections
19		39-06.2-10.2, 39-20-01, or 39-20-14, is guilty of an offense under this section.
20	g.j.	If the penalty mandated by this section includes imprisonment or placement upon
21		conviction of a violation of this section or equivalent ordinance, and if an
22		addiction evaluation has indicated that the defendant needs treatment, the court
23		may order the defendant to undergo treatment at an appropriate licensed
24		addiction treatment program and the time spent by the defendant in the treatment
25		must be credited as a portion of a sentence of imprisonment or placement under
26		this section.
27	5. As u	used in subdivision b of subsection 4, the term "imprisonment" includesmay include
28	hou	se arrest. As a condition of house arrest, a defendant may not consume alcoholic
29	bev	erages. The house arrest must include a program of electronic home detention in-
30	whic	chand the defendant is tested at least twice daily for the consumption of
31	alco	sholshall participate in the twenty-four seven sobriety program as a condition of

1		house arrest. The defendant shall defraypay all costs associated with the electronic				
2		home detention and participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety program. This-				
3		subsection does not apply to individuals committed to or under the supervision and				
4		management of the department of corrections and rehabilitation.				
5	<u>6.</u>	As used in this title, participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety program under				
6		chapter 12-54 means compliance with sections 54-12-27 through 54-12-31, and				
7		requires sobriety breath testing twice per day seven days per week or electronic				
8		alcohol monitoring, urine testing, or drug patch testing. The offender is responsible for				
9		all twenty-four seven sobriety program fees and the court may not waive the fees.				
10	SEC	TION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-08-01.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
11	amende	d and reenacted as follows:				
12	39-0	8-01.2. Special punishment for causing injury or death while operating a vehicle				
13	while ur	nder the influence of alcohol.				
14	1.	If an individual is convicted of an offense under chapter 12.1-16 and the conviction is				
15		based in part on the evidence of the individual's operation of a motor vehicle while				
16		under the influence of alcohol or drugs, the sentence imposed must include at least				
17		one year'stwo years' imprisonment if the individual was an adult at the time of the				
18		offense.				
19	2.	If an individual is convicted of a first offense violating section 39-08-01, or section				
20		39-08-03 based in part on the evidence of the individual's operation of a motor vehicle				
21		while under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and the violation caused serious bodily				
22		injury, as defined in section 12.1-01-04, to another individual, that individual is guilty of				
23		a class A misdemeanor and the sentence must include at least ninety days'				
24		imprisonment if the individual was an adult at the time of the offense.				
25	3.	If an individual is convicted of a second or subsequent offense in ten years of violating				
26		section 39-08-01, or section 39-08-03 based in part on the evidence of the individual's				
27		operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and the				
28		violation caused serious bodily injury, as defined in section 12.1-01-04, to another				
29		individual, that individual is guilty of a class C felony and the sentence must include at				
30		least one year and one day's imprisonment if the individual was an adult at the time of				
31		the offense.				

1 The imposition of sentence may not be deferred under subsection 4 of section 4. 2 12.1-32-02 for an offense subject to this section. 3 5. The sentence under this section may not be suspended unless the court finds that 4 manifest injustice would result from imposition of the sentence, except for ninety days 5 for a first offense, and one year for a second or subsequent offense in ten years. The 6 court shall impose not less than one year of supervised probation and shall require 7 participation in the twenty-four seven sobriety program for at least twelve months as a 8 mandatory condition of probation. Before a sentence under this section applies, a 9 defendant must be notified of the minimum mandatory sentence. If the finding of guilt 10 is by jury verdict, the verdict form must indicate that the jury found the elements that 11 create the minimum sentence. 12 6. An individual who is convicted under this section shall serve the sentence imposed by 13 the court without benefit of parole. 14 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-20-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 15 amended and reenacted as follows: 16 39-20-01. Implied consent to determine alcohol concentration and presence of drugs. 17 Any individual who operates a motor vehicle on a highway or on public or private 1. 18 areas to which the public has a right of access for vehicular use in this state is deemed 19 to have given consent, and shall consent, subject to the provisions of this chapter, to a 20 chemical test, or tests, of the blood, breath, or urine for the purpose of determining the 21 alcohol concentration or presence of other drugs, or combination thereof, in the 22 individual's blood, breath, or urine. As used in this chapter, the word "drug" means any 23 drug or substance or combination of drugs or substances which renders an individual 24 incapable of safely driving, and the words "chemical test" or "chemical analysis" mean 25 any test to determine the alcohol concentration or presence of other drugs, or 26 combination thereof, in the individual's blood, breath, or urine, approved by the 27 director of the state crime laboratory or the director's designee under this chapter. 28 The test or tests must be administered at the direction of a law enforcement officer 2. 29 only after placing the individual, except individuals mentioned in section 39-20-03. 30 under arrest and informing that individual that the individual is or will be charged with 31 the offense of driving or being in actual physical control of a vehicle upon the public

- highways while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, drugs, or a combination
 thereof. For the purposes of this chapter, the taking into custody of a child under
 section 27-20-13 or an individual under twenty-one years of age satisfies the
 requirement of an arrest.
- 5 The law enforcement officer also shall also inform the individual charged that North <u>3.</u> 6 Dakota law requires the individual to take the test to determine whether the individual 7 is under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or a combination of alcohol and drugs, that 8 refusal to take the test directed by the law enforcement officer is a crime, and that 9 refusal of the individual to submit to the test determined appropriate willdirected by the 10 law enforcement officer may result in a revocation for up to four years of the 11 individual's driving privileges. The law enforcement officer shall determine which of the 12 tests is to be used.
- 13 When an individual under the age of eighteen years is taken into custody for violating <u>4.</u> 14 section 39-08-01 or an equivalent ordinance, the law enforcement officer shall attempt 15 to contact the individual's parent or legal guardian to explain the cause for the custody. 16 Neither the law enforcement officer's efforts to contact, nor any consultation with, a 17 parent or legal guardian may be permitted to interfere with the administration of 18 chemical testing requirements under this chapter. The law enforcement officer shall 19 mail a notice to the parent or legal guardian of the minor within ten days after the test 20 results are received or within ten days after the minor is taken into custody if the minor 21 refuses to submit to testing. The notice must contain a statement of the test performed 22 and the results of that test; or if the minor refuses to submit to the testing, a statement 23 notifying of that fact. The attempt to contact or the contacting or notification of a parent 24 or legal guardian is not a precondition to the admissibility of chemical test results or 25 the finding of a consent to, or refusal of, chemical testing by the individual in custody. 26 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 39-20-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 27 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 28

39-20-03.1. Action following test result for a resident operator.

If a person submits to a test under section 39-20-01, 39-20-02, or 39-20-03 and the test shows that person to have an alcohol concentration of at least eight one-hundredths of one percent by weight or, with respect to a person under twenty-one years of age, an alcohol

concentration of at least two one-hundredths of one percent by weight at the time of the
 performance of a chemical test within two hours after the driving or being in actual physical
 control of a vehicle, the following procedures apply:

- 4 1. The law enforcement officer shall immediately issue to that person a temporary 5 operator's permit if the person then has valid operating privileges, extending driving 6 privileges for the next twenty-five days, or until earlier terminated by the decision of a 7 hearing officer under section 39-20-05, or unless terminated by participation in the 8 twenty-four seven sobriety program as provided under subsection 5 of this section. 9 The law enforcement officer shall sign and note the date on the temporary operator's 10 permit. The temporary operator's permit serves as the director's official notification to 11 the person of the director's intent to revoke, suspend, or deny driving privileges in this 12 state.
- 13 2. If a test administered under section 39-20-01 or 39-20-03 was by urine sample or by 14 drawing blood as provided in section 39-20-02 and the individual tested is not a 15 resident of an area in which the law enforcement officer has jurisdiction, the law 16 enforcement officer shall, on receiving the analysis of the urine or blood from the 17 director of the state crime laboratory or the director's designee and if the analysis 18 shows that individual had an alcohol concentration of at least eight one-hundredths of 19 one percent by weight or, with respect to an individual under twenty-one years of age, 20 an alcohol concentration of at least two one-hundredths of one percent by weight, 21 either proceed in accordance with subsection 1 during that individual's reappearance 22 within the officer's jurisdiction, proceed in accordance with subsection 3, or notify a law 23 enforcement agency having jurisdiction where the individual lives. On that notification, 24 that law enforcement agency shall, within twenty-four hours, forward a copy of the 25 temporary operator's permit to the law enforcement agency making the arrest or to the 26 director. The law enforcement agency shall issue to that individual a temporary 27 operator's permit as provided in this section, and shall sign and date the permit as 28 provided in subsection 1.
- 3. If the test results indicate an alcohol concentration at or above the legal limit, the law
 enforcement agency making the arrest may mail a temporary operator's permit to the
 individual who submitted to the blood or urine test, whether or not the individual is a

resident of the area in which the law enforcement officer has jurisdiction. The third day
after the mailing of the temporary operator's permit is considered the date of issuance.
Actual notice of the opportunity for a hearing under this section is deemed to have
occurred seventy-two hours after the notice is mailed by regular mail to the address
submitted by the individual to the law enforcement officer. The temporary operator's
permit serves as the director's official notification to the individual of the director's
intent to revoke, suspend, or deny driving privileges in this state.

8 The law enforcement officer, within five days of the issuance of the temporary 4. 9 operator's permit, shall forward to the director a certified written report in the form 10 required by the director. If the individual was issued a temporary operator's permit 11 because of the results of a test, the report must show that the officer had reasonable 12 grounds to believe the individual had been driving or was in actual physical control of a 13 motor vehicle while in violation of section 39-08-01, or equivalent ordinance, that the 14 individual was lawfully arrested, that the individual was tested for alcohol concentration 15 under this chapter, and that the results of the test show that the individual had an 16 alcohol concentration of at least eight one-hundredths of one percent by weight or, 17 with respect to an individual under twenty-one years of age, an alcohol concentration 18 of at least two one-hundredths of one percent by weight. In addition to the operator's 19 license and report, the law enforcement officer shall forward to the director a certified 20 copy of the operational checklist and test records of a breath test and a copy of the 21 certified copy of the analytical report for a blood or urine test for all tests administered 22 at the direction of the officer.

5. An individual charged with a violation of section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance may
 elect to participate in the twenty-four seven sobriety program under chapter 54-12 in

The director, upon the receipt of that person's operator's license and a 15 certified written report of the law enforcement officer in the form required by the 16 director, forwarded by the officer within five days after issuing the temporary operator's 17 permit, showing that the officer had reasonable grounds to believe the person had 18 been driving or was in actual physical control of a motor vehicle while in violation of 19 section 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance or, for purposes of section 39-20-14, had 20 reason to believe that the person committed a moving traffic violation or was involved 21 in a traffic accident as a driver, and in conjunction with the violation or accident the 22 officer has, through the officer's observations, formulated an opinion that the person's 23 body contains alcohol, that the person was lawfully arrested if applicable, and that the 24 person had refused to submit to the test or tests under section 39-20-01 or 39-20-14, 25 shall revoke that person's license or permit to drive and any nonresident operating 26 privilege for the appropriate period under this section, or if the person is a resident 27 without a license or a permit to operate a motor vehicle in this state, the director shall 28 deny to the person the issuance of a license or permit for the appropriate period under 29 this section after the date of the alleged violation, subject to the opportunity for a 30 prerevocation hearing and postrevocation review as provided in this chapter. In the 31 revocation of the person's operator's license the director shall give credit for time in

The screening test or tests must be performed by an enforcement officer certified as a 5 chemical test operator by the director of the state crime laboratory or the director's 6 designee and according to methods and with devices approved by the director of the 7 state crime laboratory or the director's designee. The results of such screening test 8 must be used only for determining whether or not a further test shall be given under 9 the provisions of section 39-20-01. - 29 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY DRIVING UNDER THE

30 **INFLUENCE.** During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying

31 the feasibility and desirability of North Dakota Century Code provisions that relate to

- 1 administrative hearings and administrative sanctions for driving while under the influence of
- 2 alcohol or drugs. With the assistance of the department of corrections and rehabilitation and the
- 3 department of human services, the study must include the need for supervision, methods of
- 4 treatment, and penalties for repeat driving while under the influence of alcohol or drug
- 5 offenders. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together
- 6 with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative
- 7 assembly.
- 8 **SECTION 15. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective May 1, 2013.
- 9 **SECTION 16. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
