## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1332**

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 16.1-02-05, subsection 9 of section 16.1-02-12,

2 and sections 16.1-02-13, 16.1-05-04, 16.1-05-07, 16.1-07-06, and 39-06-03.1 of the North

3 Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility to vote; and to repeal sections 16.1-05-06 and

4 58-04-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility to vote.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 8 16.1-02-05. Entry of new voters into the central voter file - Query of the central voter 9 file for double voting - Challenges - Postelection verification.

- Within forty-five days following an election, the county auditor shall enter the name
   and required information of each individual who voted at the last election who is not
   already contained in the central voter file and update any required information
   requested and obtained at the last election for any individual contained in the central
   voter file.
- The secretary of state, with the assistance of the county auditors, within eighty-five
   days following an election, shall query the central voter file to determine if any
   individual voted more than once during the preceding election. The secretary of state
   shall immediately notify the county auditor and state's attorney in each affected county
   for further investigation.
- 3. Upon return of any nonforwardable mail from an election official, the county auditor
  shall ascertain the name and address of that individual. If the individual is no longer at
  the address recorded in the central voter file, the county auditor shall transfer the voter
  to the correct precinct in the central voter file or notify the county of the voter's new
  residence so the voter record can be transferred to the correct county. If a notice

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1		mailed at least sixty days after the return of the first nonforwardable mail is also		
2	returned by the postal service, the county auditor shall designate the individual as			
3		"inactive" in the central voter file.		
4	4 <del>.</del>	Within forty-five days after an election, the county auditor shall send a notice to each		
5		individual who was challenged on election day according to section 16.1-05-06. If a		
6		notice is returned as not deliverable, the county auditor shall attempt to determine the		
7		reason for the return. A county auditor who does not receive or obtain satisfactory		
8		proof of an individual's eligibility to vote shall notify immediately the state's attorney to-		
9		conduct an investigation of the individual's eligibility to vote in that election.		
10	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 9 of section 16.1-02-12 of the North Dakota		
11	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:			
12	9.	The individual's driver's license or nondriver photo identification card number and state-		
13		of any state-issued identification regardless of the state in which the identification was		
14		issued, if availableissued by the department of transportation.		
15	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
16	amended and reenacted as follows:			
17	16.1	-02-13. Information contained in pollbooks generated from the central voter file.		
18	The	county auditor shall generate a pollbook for each precinct in the county from the central		
19	voter file	by the day before an election. With the exception of a record designated "secured		
20	active" a	nd the voter's birth date and driver's license or nondriver photo identification card		
21	number	of any state-issued identification regardless of the state in which the identification was		
22	issued <u>b</u>	y the department of transportation, which are exempt records, the precinct pollbooks		
23	are open records under section 44-04-18. The secretary of state shall prescribe procedures for			
24	generati	ng pollbooks and for transporting the pollbooks to the election judges for use on		
25	election	day. Pollbooks generated from the central voter file must contain the following		
26	informat	ion for each individual contained therein:		
27	1.	The complete legal name of the individual.		
28	2.	The complete residential address of the individual.		
29	3.	The complete mailing address of the individual, if different from the individual's		
30		residential address.		
31	4.	The unique identifier generated and assigned to the individual.		

1	5.	The county, legislative district, city or township, school district, county commissioner
2		district, if applicable, precinct name, and precinct number in which the individual
3		resides. A ballot-style code identifying this information may be used in place of the
4		information required by this subsection.
5	6.	Any other information requested of and obtained from the individual deemed
6		necessary by the secretary of state for the proper administration of the pollbook.
7	SEC	TION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-05-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	amendeo	d and reenacted as follows:
9	16.1	-05-04. Duties of the members of the election board during polling hours.
10	1.	The election inspector shall supervise the conduct of the election to ensure all election
11		officials are properly performing their duties at the polling place. The election inspector
12		shall assign duties so as to equally and fairly include both parties represented on the
13		election board.
14	2.	The election inspector shall assign ministerial duties to poll clerks, who shall carry out
15		the ministerial duties assigned by the election inspector.
16	3.	The election inspector shall assign the poll clerks to perform the function of
17		maintaining the pollbook. The designated poll clerks shall maintain the pollbook. The
18		pollbook must contain the name and address of each individual voting at the precinct
19		and must be arranged in the form and manner prescribed by the secretary of state.
20	4.	The members of the election board shall challenge the right of anyone to vote whom
21		they know or have reason to believe is not a qualified elector by requiring the elector-
22		to complete and sign a voter's affidavit.
23	<del>5.</del>	Each member of the election board shall remain on the premises of the polling place
24		during the time the polls are open to prevent the occurrence of fraud, deceit, or other
25		irregularity in the conduct of the election.
26	<del>6.</del> 5.	All members of the election board shall distribute ballots and other election materials
27		to electors. An election judge from each party represented on the election board shall
28		give any assistance requested by electors in marking ballots or operating electronic
29		voting system devices.
30	<del>7.<u>6.</u></del>	Each member of the election board shall maintain order in the polling place.

1	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-05-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
2	amended and reenacted as follows:		
3	16.1-05-07. Poll clerks to check identification and verify eligibility - Poll clerks to		
4	request, correct, and update incorrect information contained in the pollbook.		
5	1.	Befo	pre delivering a ballot to an individual according to section 16.1-13-22, the poll
6		cler	ks shall requestrequire the individual to show identification, which includes the
7		indiv	vidual's residential address and date of birth. The identification may include:
8		a.	AnA driver's license or nondriver photo identification card issued by the
9			department of transportation or other official form of identification issued by the
10			state;
11		b.	An official form of identification issued by a tribal government;
12		C.	A form of identification prescribed by the secretary of state, if the individual does
13			not possess an official form of identification provided for under subdivision a or b;
14			or
15		d.	A combination of any of the forms of identification under subdivisions a through c.
16	2.	<del>lf ar</del>	n individual offering to vote does not have or refuses to show an appropriate form
17		<del>of id</del>	lentification, the individual may be allowed to vote without being challenged
18		acco	ording to section 16.1-05-06 if the individual provides to the election board the
19		indiv	vidual's date of birth and if a member of the election board or a clerk knows the
20		indiv	vidual and can personally vouch that the individual is a qualified elector of the
21		prec	<del>cinct.</del>
22	<del>3.</del>	<del>lf ar</del>	n individual offering to vote does not meet either of the options set forth in-
23		sub	section 1 or 2, the election board shall challenge the individual's right to vote and
24		the	individual may not vote unless the individual executes a voter's affidavit, as-
25		<del>pro∖</del>	vided in section 16.1-05-06.
26	<del>4.</del>	a.	When verifying an individual's eligibility or when entering the name of an
27			individual into the pollbook, poll clerks shall request, correct, and update any
28			incorrect or incomplete information about an individual required to be included in
29			the pollbook generated from the central voter file.

1		b.	If the individual's name is contained in the pollbook generated from the central
2			voter file, the poll clerks shall verify the individual's residential address and
3			mailing address, if different from the individual's residential address.
4		C.	If the individual's name is not contained in the pollbook generated from the
5			central voter file but the individual is determined eligible to vote, the poll clerks
6			shall record the individual's name in the pollbook. The poll clerks shall request
7			and obtain any additional information for the individual required to be included in
8			the pollbook.
9	<del>5.<u>3.</u></del>	Poll	clerks shall direct an individual who is attempting to vote in the incorrect precinct
10		to th	ne proper precinct and voting location.

13	16.1	-07-0	06. Application form.
14	1.	Арр	lication for an absent voter's ballot must be made on a form, prescribed by the
15		sec	retary of state, to be furnished by the proper officer of the county, city, or school
16		dist	rict in which the applicant is an elector, on any form, approved by the secretary of
17		stat	e, or any blank containing the following information:
18		a.	The applicant's name.
19		b.	The applicant's current or most recent North Dakota residential address.
20		C.	The applicant's mailing address.
21		d.	The applicant's current contact telephone number.
22		e.	The election for which the ballot is being requested.
23		f.	The date of the request.
24		g.	An affirmation that the applicant has resided, or will reside, in the precinct for at
25			least thirty days next preceding the election.
26		h.	The applicant's signature.
27		i.	A space for the voter to indicate the voter's status as a citizen living outside the
28			United States, a uniformed service member living away from the voter's North
29			Dakota residence, or a family member of the uniformed service member living
30			away from the voter's North Dakota residence.
31		j.	The applicant's birth date and year.

1		k.	The applicant's motor vehicle operator's license or nondriver identification	
2			number <del>, if available</del> .	
3		lf th	e applicant is unable to sign the applicant's name, the applicant shall mark (X) or	
4		use the applicant's signature stamp on the application in the presence of		
5		disi	nterested individual. The disinterested individual shall print the name of the	
6		indi	vidual marking the X or using the signature stamp below the X or signature stamp	
7		and	shall sign the disinterested individual's own name following the printed name	
8		toge	ether with the notation "witness to the mark".	
9	2.	The	application for a qualified elector serving on active duty as a uniformed service	
10		mer	mber or a family member who is a qualified elector and stationed at a location other	
11		thar	n that individual's voting residential address must include the following additional	
12		info	rmation if the voter desires to vote by facsimile or electronic mail:	
13		a.	Facsimile telephone number; or	
14		b.	Electronic mail address.	
15	3.	The	application for a qualified elector living outside the United States must include a	
16		face	simile telephone number or electronic mail address if the voter desires to vote by	
17		face	simile or electronic mail.	
18	<u>4.</u>	<u>Exc</u>	ept for the applicant's date of birth and motor vehicle driver's license or nondriver	
19		pho	to identification card number, the application is an open record under section

21	SEC	TIO	N 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
22	amende	d and	d reenacted as follows:	
23	39-0	6-03	.1. Nondriver photo identification card issued by director - Release of	
24	informa	tion	- Penalty - Public awareness.	
25	1.	The	director shall issue a nondriver color photo identification card to any North Dakota	
26		resi	dent who fulfills the requirements of this section. An application for an identification	
27		card	d must be made on a form furnished by the director. Within thirty days from receipt	
28		of a	complete application that includes the applicant's social security number, unless	
29		the	applicant is a nonimmigrant who is not eligible for a social security number, the	
30		dire	ctor shall determine whether to issue and, if appropriate, issue a nondriver photo	
31		ider	ntification card to an applicant. If the person is under the age of eighteen or at least	

1	the age of eighteen and under the age of twenty-one, the photo must be against the
2	same color background required on a motor vehicle operator's license for an operator
3	of that age. Subject to subsection 1 of section 39-06-19, identification cards expire
4	eight years from the date of issue and may be renewed. The application must contain
5	such other information as the director may require to improve identity security. The
6	director may require an applicant for an identification card to provide a social security
7	card and proof of residence address.

- 8 2. To confirm the identity, date of birth, and legal presence of the applicant, the director or
  9 examining officer shall require satisfactory evidence be provided by the applicant.
  10 Satisfactory evidence includes a certified copy of the applicant's birth certificate or
  11 other evidence reasonably calculated to permit the determination of the date of birth,
  12 identification, and legal presence of the applicant by the director or examining officer.
- The fee is eight dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this section must be paid monthly
   into the highway fund in the state treasury. Except as provided in subsection 9, the
   director may not charge a fee to provide a nondriver photo identification card to an
   eligible applicant.
- Any information obtained by the director from an applicant for the issuance, renewal,
   or replacement of an identification card issuable pursuant to this chapter may only be
   released in accordance with the provisions of section 39-16-03.
- It is a class B misdemeanor for any person, except the director or the director's
   authorized agent, to print or otherwise produce or reproduce cards or their
   components, which may be utilized as identification cards issued pursuant to this
   section.
- 24 6. The director may advertise the availability and the use of the card.
- 25 7. Identification cards issued pursuant to this section are sufficient identification for all26 identification purposes.
- 8. The director shall cancel any card upon determining that the holder is not entitled to
  the issuance of the card under the laws of this state, or the holder has failed to give
  the required or correct information to the director, or has committed fraud in making
  the application, or the fee was in the form of an insufficient or no-account check. Upon

1		cancellation, the holder shall surrender the card to the director. When a cancellation is	
2		in effect, any law enforcement officer may take custody of the card.	
3	9.	A duplicate card may be obtained by making an application and paying an eight dollar	
4		fee. For a cardholder who has reached the age of eighteen or twenty-one, a	
5		replacement card may be obtained by making an application and paying an eight	
6		dollar fee.	
7	10.	The director may not withhold the issuance of a nondriver color photo identification	
8		card without reasonable cause.	
9	<u>11.</u>	An individual who possesses a driver's license may not obtain a nondriver photo	
10		identification card.	
11	SECTION 8. REPEAL. Sections 16.1-05-06 and 58-04-09 of the North Dakota Century		
12	Code are repealed.
