- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06 and a new subdivision to
- 2 subsection 1 of section 50-09-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to drug testing for
- 3 the temporary assistance for needy families program.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Screening for controlled substances - Eligibility for temporary assistance for needy families program.

- 1. If a reasonable suspicion exists, the department shall require an eligible recipient for the temporary assistance for needy families program to submit to a drug test to determine if the eligible recipient is engaged in the illegal use of a controlled substance. The cost of the drug testing is the responsibility of the individual tested.
- 2. An individual who tests positive for controlled substances as a result of a drug test required under this section is ineligible to receive temporary assistance for needy families program benefits for one year after the date of the positive drug test unless the individual meets the requirements of subsection 4. An individual who tests positive in a second drug test is ineligible to receive temporary assistance for needy families program benefits for three years after the date of the second positive drug test.
- 3. The department shall:
 - a. Provide notice of drug testing to each individual at the time of application. The notice must advise the individual that drug testing will be conducted as a condition for receiving temporary assistance for needy families program benefits and that the individual must bear the cost of testing. If the individual tests negative for controlled substances, the department shall increase the amount of

1			the initial benefit by the amount paid by the individual for the drug testing.
2			Dependent children under the age of eighteen are exempt from the drug testing
3			requirement;
4		<u>b.</u>	Require that for two-parent families, both parents must comply with the drug
5			testing requirement.
6		<u>C.</u>	Require that any teen parent who is not required to live with a parent, legal
7			guardian, or other adult caretaker relative must comply with the drug testing
8			requirement.
9		<u>d.</u>	Advise each individual to be tested, before the test is conducted, that the
10			individual may advise the agent administering the test of any prescription or
11			over-the-counter medication the individual is taking.
12		<u>e.</u>	Inform an individual who tests positive for a controlled substance and is deemed
13			ineligible for temporary assistance for needy families program benefits that the
14			individual may reapply for those benefits one year after the date of the positive
15			drug test unless the individual meets the requirements of subsection 4.
16		<u>f.</u>	Provide any individual who tests positive with a list of licensed substance abuse
17			treatment providers available in the area in which the individual resides. The
18			department is not responsible for providing or paying for substance abuse
19			treatment as part of the screening conducted under this section.
20		<u>g.</u>	Comply with the confidentiality requirements for substance abuse treatment
21			records as governed by title 42, Code of Federal Regulations, part 2.
22		<u>h.</u>	Require an eligible recipient for the temporary assistance for needy families
23			program to sign a release of information form at the time of application. The
24			release must allow the county to receive treatment records and disclose that
25			information to the department and to the office of administrative hearings when
26			necessary.
27	<u>4.</u>	<u>An i</u>	individual who tests positive under this section and is denied temporary assistance
28		for 1	needy families program benefits as a result may reapply for those benefits after six
29		mor	nths if the individual can document the successful completion of a substance abuse
30		trea	tment program offered by a licensed substance abuse treatment provider. An

1 individual who fails the drug test required under subsection 1 may reapply for benefits 2 under this subsection only once. 3 <u>5.</u> If a parent is deemed ineligible for temporary assistance for needy families program 4 benefits as a result of failing a drug test conducted under this section: 5 The dependent child's eligibility for temporary assistance for needy families <u>a.</u> 6 program benefits is not affected. 7 An appropriate protective payee must be designated to receive benefits on behalf b. 8 of the child. The parent may choose to designate another individual to receive 9 benefits for the parent's minor child. The designated individual must be an 10 immediate family member or, if an immediate family member is not available or 11 the family member declines the option, another individual, approved by the 12 department, may be designated. The designated individual also must undergo 13 drug testing before being approved to receive benefits on behalf of the child. 14 The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. 15 SECTION 2. A new subdivision to subsection 1 of section 50-09-29 of the North Dakota 16 Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 17 Require applicants to comply with the drug testing requirements of section 1 of 18 this Act.
