- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for a legislative management study of the state's health care
- 2 system; to provide for a health care consortium; to provide for reports to the legislative
- 3 <u>management</u>; and to provide an appropriation.

### 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

### 5 SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - HEALTH CARE SYSTEM. During

6 the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the state's health care 7 system. The study may include consideration of health care facility workforce issues, the state's 8 demographics and issues related to the state's growing aging population, rural health care 9 needs, how to maintain health care quality and affordability while working to curb rising costs, 10 and the impact of the implementation of the federal Affordable Care Act. The legislative 11 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation 12 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.

## 13 SECTION 2. HEALTH CARE CONSORTIUM - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE

## 14 MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNOR.

15 1. The governor shall appoint a consortium that includes a broad scope of private sector 16 stakeholders, members of the senate and the house of representatives, and 17 representation from the statewide vision and strategy partnership for a healthier North 18 Dakota and the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences 19 advisory council. The consortium shall receive and review information provided by the 20 statewide vision and strategy partnership for a healthier North Dakota and the 21 university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences advisory council, 22 including the second annual report of the council. The consortium shall provide direct 23 input to the legislative management interim committee that conducts the study 24 provided for under section 1 of this Act. The consortium shall focus its efforts on

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1	addressing the immediate needs and challenges of the North Dakota health care			
2	delivery system, implementing the healthy North Dakota initiative, examining medicaid			
3		reform, and developing a plan for a private health care model that will comply with		
4		federal health care reform in a manner that will provide high quality, accessible, and		
5		affordable care for North Dakota citizens.		
6	2.	In developing the model health care system, the health care consortium shall:		
7		a.	Consider population shifts, facility needs, personnel needs, rural access,	
8			regulatory public health functions, and vulnerable populations.	
9		b.	Determine the scope of the weaknesses in the current health care system and	
10			the scope of the model health care system.	
11		C.	Take into account the ongoing impact that federal health care reform under the	
12			federal Affordable Care Act is having on state delivery of health care and on state	
13			delivery of medicaid.	
14		d.	Work to forge partnerships with federal payers and regulators in order to work	
15			toward addressing medical reimbursement system reform.	
16	3.	The	legislative management shall contract with a consultant to assist the health care	
17		con	sortium in developing a model health care system as required under subsection 2.	
18	4.	<u>The</u>	health care consortium shall report to the budget section of the legislative	
19		mar	nagement on the status of funding available and anticipated uses of the funding for	
20		the	consortium during the 2013-14 interim. Before June 1, 2014, the health care	
21	consortium shall report to the governor and to the legislative management on the			
22		stat	us of the development of the model health care system as well as any	
23		reco	ommendations.	
24	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general			
25	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$75,000\$100,000, or so much			
26	of the sum as may be necessary, and from special funds, derived from private gifts and grants,			
27	the sum of \$100,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the legislative			
28	management for the purpose of funding the activities of the health care consortium under			
29	section 2 of this Act, as part of the North Dakota 2020 and beyond initiative, for the biennium			
30	beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. The legislative management may spend			

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- 1 <u>funding from the general fund only to the extent special funds from private gifts and grants are</u>
- 2 received on a dollar-for-dollar basis.
