- 1 A BILL for an Act to create two new sections to chapter 37-17.3 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to statewide integrated radio communication; to provide for a legislative
- 3 management study; and to provide an appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 37-17.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>Legislative declaration Statewide integrated radio communication system service.</u>
- 8 The legislative assembly finds that effective radio communication is vital to public safety
- 9 and effective emergency response and law enforcement and declares that a statewide
- 10 integrated radio communication system will more effectively serve the goals of law enforcement
- and emergency response personnel and thereby better serve the people of North Dakota.
- 12 Existing radio systems operated by local jurisdictions serve those jurisdictions adequately, but
- do not provide the protection and benefits to the citizens of North Dakota that new digital
- 14 networks being utilized in neighboring states offer.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 37-17.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 17 Statewide interoperability board.

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- 18 <u>1. The statewide interoperability board consists of:</u>
 - a. The director of state radio or a designee;
- 20 <u>b.</u> <u>The director of the division of homeland security or a designee;</u>
- 21 <u>c. The superintendent of the highway patrol or a designee;</u>
- 22 <u>d. The adjutant general or a designee:</u>
- e. The director of the department of transportation or a designee;
- 24 <u>f. A representative of the North Dakota sheriff's and deputies association;</u>

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1 A representative of the North Dakota emergency managers association; g. 2 A representative of the North Dakota fire chiefs association; <u>h.</u> 3 <u>i.</u> A representative of the North Dakota emergency medical services association; 4 A representative of the North Dakota police chiefs association; Ĺ. 5 A representative of the North Dakota 911 association; and <u>k.</u> 6 <u>l.</u> The North Dakota chief information officer or a designee. 7 2. The board shall elect a chairman and vice chairman for terms of two years upon its 8 initial meeting. The adjutant general shall call and convene the initial meeting. 9 <u>3.</u> The board shall provide for key components and provide for support of key 10 components necessary to support the deployment of a statewide integrated radio 11 communication system and shall provide for financial and technical assistance to local 12 jurisdictions to transition to the system. 13 The board shall manage a statewide integrated radio system with due consideration 4. 14 for all stakeholders reliant upon a radio communication system. 15 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. During the 2013-15 biennium, to 16 assist with the development of a statewide interoperability plan, the legislative management 17 shall study issues relating to the development of the current radio communication plan, its costs 18 and components, and evolving technologies that will better serve the public. The study must 19 include the input of stakeholders statewide, including local city, local county, and state public 20 service and public safety entities, including those members represented on the board. 21 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 22 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000, or so much of the 23 sum as may be necessary, to the statewide interoperability board for the purpose of purchasing 24 necessary equipment at the state level to begin development of the statewide integrated radio 25 communication program and to purchase project 25 standards-based centralized core dispatch 26 equipment to integrate into a statewide dispatch network open to all city, county, and state 27 agencies within North Dakota, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 28 2015. The statewide interoperability board shall allocate funds through grant requests solicited, 29 reviewed, and approved by the statewide interoperability board in a manner that will most

effectively move the state toward an integrated radio communication system.
