## SENATE BILL NO. 2012

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 transportation; to provide appropriations to the state treasurer for transportation funding

3 distributions; to amend and reenact sections 39-02-03 and 39-04-09 of the North Dakota

4 <u>Century Code, relating to department of transportation motor vehicle branch offices and the</u>

5 <u>issuance of license plates;</u> to provide for transfers<u>and contingent transfers</u>; to provide

6 exemptions; to provide for budget section reports; to provide for a legislative management

7 study; and to declare an emergency.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
10 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
11 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
12 other income, to the department of transportation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of
13 the department of transportation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30,
14 2015, as follows:

21	2011-13 BIENNIUM. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
22	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$620,000,000, or so much of the sum as may		
23	be necessary, which the office of management and budget shall transfer to the highway fund-		
24	for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2013. The		
25	funding provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item. The office of		
26	management and budget shall transfer the funds provided under this section as soon as		
27	possible after the effective date of this Act and prior to June 30, 2013.		
28	SECTION 5. COUNTY AND TOWNSHIP BRIDGE RECONSTRUCTION PROGRAM -		
29	STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - EXEMPTION. The county and		
30	township bridge reconstruction program line item in section 1 of this Act contains the sum of		
31	\$27,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund which must be used by the		

1	department of transportation for a county and township road bridge rehabilitation and		
2	reconstruction program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending		
3	June 30, 2015, as follows:		
4	1.	The funding must be used to rehabilitate or reconstruct county and township road	
5		bridges needed for the safe conveyance of persons and commerce in this state. The	
6		director of the department of transportation shall distribute the funding based on data	
7		available from studies conducted by the upper great plains transportation institute.	
8	2.	Each county requesting funding for a county or township road bridge project or for	
9		multiple projects shall submit the request in accordance with criteria developed by the	
10		department of transportation. The department of transportation, in consultation with	
11		the county, may approve a project or approve a project with amendments.	
12		a. Funding must be distributed for projects based on data available from upper	
13		great plains transportation institute studies, actual road conditions, and the level	
14		of integration with state highway and other county road projects.	
15		b. Funding may not be distributed for the routine maintenance of bridges.	
16	3.	The funding may be used to provide up to ninety percent of the cost of an approved	
17		bridge project, including engineering and plan development costs.	
18	4.	Upon approval of a project, the department of transportation shall transfer to the	
19		county the approved funding for engineering and plan development costs. The funding	
20		provided for construction, engineering, and project development costs may be applied	
21		to costs incurred as of January 1, 2013.	
22	5.	Upon execution of a construction contract by the county, the department of	
23		transportation shall transfer to the county the funding to be used for the approved	
24		bridge project.	
25	6.	Each recipient county shall report to the department of transportation upon awarding	
26		each contract and upon completion of each project in a manner prescribed by the	
27		department.	
28	7.	Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding included in the county and township	
29		bridge reconstruction program line item in section 1 of this Act. Any funds not spent by	
30		June 30, 2015, may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and

1	ending June 30, 2017, and may be expended only for county and township road		
2	bridge rehabilitation and reconstruction projects.		
3	8. For purposes of this section, a "bridge" is a structure that extends over a river, stream,		
4	depression, or other obstacle and has an end area of fifty square feet [4.65 square		
5	meters] or greater.		
6	9. To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, the county or township road bridge		
7	project must be located within a county that levies a combined total of seven or more		
8	mills for county road and bridge, farm-to-market and federal aid road, and county road		
9	purposes.		
10	SECTION 6. HIGHWAY-RAIL GRADE CROSSING SAFETY PROJECTS FUND. The		
11	grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$640,000 from the highway-rail		
12	grade crossing safety projects fund which may be used by the department of transportation to		
13	continue highway-rail grade crossing safety projects approved by the department and for which		
14	funding was obligated prior to January 1, 2013. On June 30, 2015, the state treasurer shall		
15	transfer any unexpended and unobligated balance in the highway-rail grade crossing safety		
16	projects fund to the highway tax distribution fund.		
17	SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - CONTINGENT TRANSFERS - GENERAL FUND TO		
18	PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION FUND. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general		
19	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,100,000, or so much of the		
20	sum as may be necessary, which the office of management and budget shall transfer to the		
21	public transportation fund pursuant to this section during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013,		
22	and ending June 30, 2015. The office of management and budget shall transfer the sum of		
23	\$550,000 on July 1, 2013, if deposits in the public transportation fund from the highway tax		
24	distribution fund are \$5,000,000 or less during the period beginning July 1, 2012, and ending		
25	June 30, 2013. The office of management and budget shall transfer the sum of \$550,000 on		
26	July 1, 2014, if deposits in the public transportation fund from the highway tax distribution fund		
27	are \$5,000,000 or less during the period beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014.		
28	SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - TOWNSHIP TRANSPORTATION		
29	FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the		
30	state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as		
31	may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of providing township transportation		

1 funding distributions, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending

2 June 30, 2015.

- The state treasurer shall distribute the funds provided under this section to counties
   and townships in oil-producing counties through a distribution of \$15,000 to each
   organized township and a distribution of \$15,000 for each unorganized township to the
   county in which the unorganized township is located.
- 7 2. If any funds remain after the distributions provided under subsection 1, the state
   8 treasurer shall distribute the remaining funds to counties and townships in
   9 oil-producing counties pursuant to section 54-27-19.1. Organized townships are not
   10 required to provide matching funds to receive a distribution under this subsection.
- For purposes of this section, an "oil-producing county" means a county that received total
  allocations under section 57-51-15 of \$500,000 or more during state fiscal year 2012. All funds
  distributed under this section must be used for roadway maintenance purposes. The funding
  provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item.

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - 2011-13 BIENNIUM - TOWNSHIP

16 TRANSPORTATION FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS CORRECTION - EXEMPTION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise 17 18 appropriated, the sum of \$590,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state 19 treasurer for the purpose of providing transportation funding distributions to counties and 20 townships in accordance with this section, for the period beginning with the effective date of this 21 Act and ending June 30, 2013. The state treasurer shall distribute the funding provided under 22 this section to counties and townships that are eligible to receive a distribution under subsection 23 3 of section 27 of chapter 579 of the 2011 Session Laws and have not already received a 24 distribution under that subsection. Section 27 of chapter 579 of the 2011 Session Laws is not 25 subject to section 54-11-01 and the state treasurer may not require a political subdivision to 26 return an overpayment of funds received from distributions under the section.

# SECTION 10. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - TOWNSHIP

28 TRANSPORTATION FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS CORRECTION. There is appropriated out of 29 any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of 30 \$415,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of 31 providing transportation funding distribution to counties and townships in accordance with this

1 section, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2015. 2 The state treasurer shall use the funding provided under this section to ensure that all eligible 3 counties and townships receive a distribution in accordance with subsection 3 of section 2 of 4 Senate Bill No. 2176 as approved by the sixty-third legislative assembly. Any funds that remain 5 after the distributions to eligible counties and townships must be distributed by the state 6 treasurer pursuant to the method provided in subsection 3 of section 2 of Senate Bill No. 2176 7 as approved by the sixty-third legislative assembly. 8 **SECTION 11. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION - GENERAL** 9 LICENSE PLATE ISSUE - EXEMPTION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 10 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$6,200,000, or so

much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of transportation for the purpose of
defraying the expenses for a general license plate issue, for the biennium beginning July 1,
2013, and ending June 30, 2015. The appropriation provided under this section is not subject to
section 54-44.1-11 and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending

15 June 30, 2017.

### 16 SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND

17 REHABILITATION - GENERAL LICENSE PLATE ISSUE. There is appropriated from special
18 funds and other income received, the sum of \$4,280,000, or so much of the sum as may be
19 necessary, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for expenses incurred by
20 roughrider industries related to the general license plate issue, for the biennium beginning

21 July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

22 SECTION 13. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - GENERAL FUND TO HIGHWAY FUND.

There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$683,600,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, which the

25 office of management and budget shall transfer to the highway fund during the biennium

- 26 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. The office of management and budget shall
- 27 transfer the funds provided under this section to the state highway fund at the request of the
- 28 director of the department of transportation. The funding provided in this section is considered a
- 29 one-time funding item.

# SECTION 14. ENHANCED STATE HIGHWAY INVESTMENTS - CARRYOVER

31 **AUTHORITY.** Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding of \$1,161,600,000\$541,600,000 in

1 the capital assets line item relating to enhanced state highway investments in section 1 of this 2 Act. Any funds not spent by June 30, 2015, must be continued into the biennium beginning 3 July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, and may be expended only for enhanced state 4 highway investments. 5 SECTION 15. EXEMPTION - STATE DISASTER RELIEF FUND - ROAD GRADE 6 **RAISING GRANTS.** The amount appropriated to the department of transportation from the 7 state disaster relief fund for road grade raising grants, as contained in section 14 of chapter 579 8 of the 2011 Session Laws, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any 9 unexpended funds from this appropriation are available to the department to provide road grade 10 raising grants during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 11 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 39-02-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 amended and reenacted as follows: 13 39-02-03. Powers and duties of director and department. 14 The director, subject to the approval of the governor, may adopt and enforce such 15 administrative rules and designate such agencies and establish such branch offices as may be 16 necessary to carry out the laws applicable to the director's office and department. The director 17 shall provide suitable forms for applications, registration cards, license number plates, and all 18 other forms requisite for the operation of the director's office and department, and shall prepay 19 all transportation charges thereon. In addition, the The director shall may provide for a uniform-20 maximum fee schedule for the various services provided by the branch offices, not to exceed 21 ten dollars for each service provided. Any branch office may establish a different fee schedule if 22 the schedule does not contain a fee that exceeds a maximum fee established by the director 23 and is approved by the director. All branch office managers must be bonded. The department

may lease or provide office space or other overhead costs as necessary to independent motor
vehicle branch managers. All rents collected under this section must be deposited in the state
highway fund. The department and the officers thereof shall enforce the provisions of all laws
pertaining to the director and the department.

SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 39-04-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 39-04-09. Director may design and issue number plates. 2 The director may design and issue plates of distinctly different color for each classification 3 of motor vehicle, and there must at all times be a marked contrast between the background 4 color of the plates and that of the numerals and letters thereonon the plate. License plates must 5 be acquired from the North Dakota state penitentiary if the penitentiary has the facilities to 6 manufacture license plates. The director shall make a general issue during the biennium 7 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, and continuing into the biennium beginning 8 July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. 9 **SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MOTOR VEHICLE BRANCH** 10 **OFFICES.** During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the 11 use of branch offices by the department of transportation. The study must include a review of 12 the structure of agreements with operators of branch offices, the number of motor vehicles 13 registered at each office, the current locations of offices, the quality of data provided by the 14 offices, the staffing needs of the offices, and the fees received by offices for services provided. 15 The study must also include a review of the future use of branch offices, including office 16 locations, alternative uses for facilities, and other changes that may promote efficiencies. The 17 legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any 18 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly. 19 SECTION 19. EMERGENCY. Sections 5 and 64, 5, 8, 9, and 10 of this Act and funding of 20 \$1,161,600,000 in the capital assets line item relating to enhanced state highway investments-21 and \$142,000,000 in the county and township road reconstruction program line item in section 1 22 of this Act, funding of \$27,000,000 in the county and township bridge reconstruction program 23 line item in section 1 of this Act, and funding of \$10,000,000 in the grants line item in section 1 24 of this Act to match a federal TIGER III grant for railroad improvements are declared to be an 25 emergency measure.
