- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information
- 2 technology department; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-59; and to provide for
- 3 various transfers.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

25 2015-17 biennium. The information technology department shall report to the appropriations

committees of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 3. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of management and budget shall make transfers of funds between line items in section 1 of this Act for the information technology department as may be requested by the chief information

relating to the project.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - STATEWIDE LONGITUDINAL 4 DATA SYSTEM EXPENDITURES - APPROVAL. The department of public instruction may 5 spend only the federal funds for costs associated with the statewide longitudinal data system 6 upon approval of the expenditures by the information technology department, for the biennium 7 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 8 SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 9 and enacted as follows: 10 <u>Information technology project planning.</u> 11 Each executive branch state agency, excluding entities under the control of the state board 12 of higher education, considering the development of an information technology project with an 13 estimated cost of one hundred thousand dollars or more shall involve the information

technology department in the planning and study of the project. A state agency must receive a

recommendation from the information technology department prior to proceeding with any study
